Re: Lodgement of Financial Statements and Accounts – The Australian Workers' Union, Tasmanian Branch – for year ending 30 June 2012 (FR2012/370)

I refer to the abovementioned financial statements and accounts which were received by Fair Work Australia on 4 December 2012.

The documents have been filed. I must draw your attention however to the following matters of detail where future reports will more fully comply with various provisions, as properly interpreted and in line with recent advice I have received.

(1) Sub-section 254(2)(a) requires an Operating Report to contain a review of the principal activities, the results of those activities and any significant changes to the nature of these activities. Your Operating Report gave a very broad description of the principal activity "operation of a trade union" and stated that there had been no significant changes to the nature of the activities, but did not include all information that might be properly said to fit the category of "results of those activities".

The operation of a trade union would encompass a range of activities that might be referred to or listed more explicitly.

In addition, the net profit declared under the heading "Results of Principal Activities" might be said to be a result of the activity described as "renting of properties owned by the union", but properly speaking it is not a result of the activities that could be thought to make up the "operation of a trade union."

The financial accounts and other statements provide the members with detailed financial information relating to the Branch's financial affairs. The purpose behind this review on the Operating Report is to give the ordinary member-reader a concise description or profile of the Branch's overall affairs, not primarily its financial affairs.

The Branch should therefore consider how it might, however concisely, describe its trade union activities more fully and the results of such activities in future Operating Reports.

(2) Section 253 requires a reporting unit to prepare a "general purpose financial report" in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards. Australian Accounting Standard (AASB) 101 generally requires an explicit statement of compliance with the Standards.¹

The statement at Note 1(b) on Page 7 of the report that "The accounting methods used are in accordance with the accounting standards laid down by the Australian accounting bodies and/or by law except where noted to the contrary" could be expressed to reflect more explicitly the terms used in the Act, and it is always recommended that doing so avoids any ambiguity or doubt that a provision has been complied with.

I recommend that the statement be amended or supplemented in future to make clear that the report is a "general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards".

(3) The fact that there were salaries and wages paid to holders of office indicates that there were related party transactions within the meaning of the Australian Accounting Standards (AASB) 124 which should have been disclosed as such in the Notes to the Accounts.

The Notes in future reports should include, where applicable, such disclosures under a clear heading "Related Party Disclosures".

Independent Auditors' Report To The Members Of The Australian Workers' Union - Tasmania Branch For The Year Ended 30th June 2012

SCOPE

I have audited the attached financial statements of the Australian Workers' Union - Tasmania Branch consisting of Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Changes in Equity, Statement of Cash Flows and accompanying notes set out on pages 1 to 12 for the year ended 30th June 2012. The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information contained therein. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial statements in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Australian Workers' Union – Tasmania Branch.

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- a) Except for Land and buildings which are at valuation, the accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs, and do not take into account changing money values.
- b) The accounting methods used are in accordance with the accounting standards laid down by the Australian accounting bodies and/or by law except were noted to the contrary.
- c) Depreciation has been provided for all fixed assets except for Land and Buildings so as to write them off over the expected useful life of the asset.
 Motor Vehicles are depreciated on a Prime Cost basis based upon a useful life of 8 Years. Office Equipment is mainly depreciated using the Prime Cost basis. The useful lives used range from 3 years for Lap Top Computers through to 13.33 years for tables, chairs, book cases etc.
 - Telephones are mainly depreciated on a Prime Cost basis as well, with most mobile phones being based upon a useful life of 6.66 years and the Office Phone System based upon a useful life of 10 years.
- d) All expenses and receipts are accounted for on an accruals basis, except for Membership Contributions, which are recorded on a cash basis.
- e) No provision for income tax has been made as the Union is exempt from income tax under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1936).

The financial year of the Tasmanian Branch of The Australian Workers' Union (the "reporting unit") has recently ended. The full financial report must be lodged with Fair Work Australia within the prescribed time period of 6 months and 14 days of the end of the financial year.

This site also contains the General Manager's Reporting Guidelines which set out mandatory financial disclosures.

I draw your particular attention to section 237 of the FW(RO) Act which provides that where the reporting unit makes individual loans, grants or donations exceeding \$1,000, a separate statement containing prescribed particulars must be lodged within 90 days of the end of the financial year, i.e. by 30 September.
