#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are:

#### 1.1 **BASIS OF PREPARATION**

The financial statements of the Union have been drawn up in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and other requirements of law. They have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year. The accounting records have been kept on an accrual basis.

#### 1.2 **INCOME TAX**

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Union is exempt from income tax under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

# 1.3 EMPLOYEE ENTITLEMENTS

#### Provision for Annual Leave

The provision for employee entitlements to Annual Leave represents the amount which the Union has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees' services provided up to the balance date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on current wage and salary rates plus leave loading.

#### 2. **PROVISION FOR LONG SERVICE LEAVE**

2.1 The liability for Long-Service Leave of Branch officials has been taken up in the books of account. Because this debt is still partly the responsibility of National Office, a corresponding asset exists under Current Assets (\$409,357).

2.2 In accordance with the decision of the National Executive, each Branch now brings to account the annual indebtedness to Long service Leave of its officials. This procedure was first undertaken in the 2001 – 2002 financial year.
