Re: Lodgement of Financial Statements and Accounts – The Australian Workers' Union, Victorian Branch – for year ending 30 June 2011 (FR2011/2694)

Thank you for lodging the abovementioned financial statements and accounts which were received by Fair Work Australia on 10 November 2011.

I will file the documents but must draw your attention to the following.

The Auditor has referred to recovery of wages activity and this has been set out at Note 5 on page 13. However, the Committee of Management Statement did not contain the declarations in relation to the recovery of wage activity required by paragraph 25 of the General Manager's Guidelines.

Moreover, the details presented at Note 5 fall short of what the Guidelines require in the way of a Recovery of Wages Activity report. Paragraphs 20, 21 and 22 require "*balances including nil amounts*" for several categories of related revenue, outgoings and assets respectively, and paragraph 23 requires various other items of related information.

I enclose relevant extracts from the Guidelines for your convenient reference and ask that if recovery of wage activity is undertaken in future years that the above omissions be addressed in order to comply with the Guidelines.

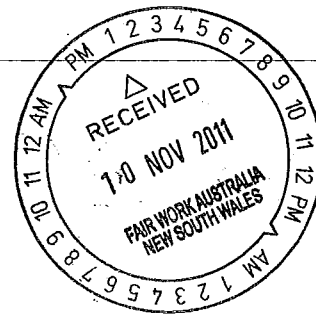

Scope

We have audited the Financial Statements of the Australian Workers Union (Victorian Branch) for the year ended 30 June 2011 consisting of the Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Cash Flows and accompanying notes. The Branch Executive is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements and the information they contain. 

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE, 2011

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are:

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements of the Union have been drawn up in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, the RAO Schedule of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and other requirements of law. They have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year. The accounting records have been kept on an accrual basis.

1.2 INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Union is exempt from income tax under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

1.3 EMPLOYEE ENTITLEMENTS

Provision for Annual Leave

The provision for employee entitlements to Annual Leave represents the amount which the Union has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees' services provided up to the balance date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on current wage and salary rates plus leave loading.

2. PROVISION FOR LONG SERVICE LEAVE

2.1 The liability for Long-Service Leave of Branch officials has been taken up in the books of account. Because this debt is still partly the responsibility of National Office, a corresponding asset exists under Current Assets (\$174,229).

2.2 In accordance with the decision of the National Executive, each Branch now brings to account the annual indebtedness to Long service Leave of its officials.

- b) An organisation shall, on application made under Subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to a member or the Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed;
- c) A Registrar may only make an application under Subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member."
