The Australian Workers' Union, Victorian Branch - Financial Report for year ended 30 June 2013 - (FR2013/278)

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report of The Australian Workers' Union, Victorian Branch (the reporting unit). The documents were lodged with the Fair Work Commission on 29 October 2013. The financial report has now been filed.

The financial report was filed based on a primary review. This involved confirming that the financial reporting timelines required under s.253, s.265, s.266 and s.268 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (RO Act) have been satisfied, all documents required under s.268 of the RO Act were lodged and that various disclosure requirements under the Australian Accounting Standards, RO Act and reporting guidelines have been complied with. A primary review does not examine all disclosure requirements.

Please note that the financial report for the year ending 30 June 2014 may be subject to an advanced compliance review.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the 2013 report lodged but the Fair Work Commission will confirm these matters have been addressed prior to filing next year's report.

Application of Tier 1 reporting requirements

Paragraph 8 of the Reporting Guidelines¹ states 'it is a requirement that all reporting units apply the Tier 1 reporting requirements as per the Australian Accounting Standard AASB 1053 Application for Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards'. The notes to the financial statements state that 'The financial report is a general purpose financial statement which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards-Reduced Disclosure Requirements.' In future please ensure that the reporting unit adheres to paragraph 8 of the Reporting Guidelines.

Disclosure of employee provisions/benefits to office holders and other employees

The financial statements have disclosed employee expenses separately for officers and employees, by wages, superannuation, annual leave, long-service leave, separation and redundancies and other employee expenses but have not disclosed separate employee *provisions* for officers and employees. The Reporting Guidelines require either the statement of financial position or the notes to disclose any liability for employee benefits in respect of office

holders and other employees (paragraph 21(c) and 21 (d)). In future years please ensure that provisions for office holders and other employees are disclosed separately.

AUDITORS' REPORT, FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND NOTES THERETO FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2013

THE AUSTRALIAN WORKERS' UNION (VICTORIAN BRANCH) OPERATING REPORT JULY 2012 – JUNE 2013

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND CHANGES

The principal activities of the organisation continued to be those of a registered trade union working for the benefit of its members through negotiating enterprise bargaining agreements, varying Awards, representing members before industrial tribunals, training of delegates and members in Occupational Health and Safety, workplace organising, recruitment and public promotion of the interests of members. There were no significant changes to the activities of the organisation.

RESULTS

The surplus for the financial year amounted to \$141,573. (2012 \$ 611,249)

FINANCIAL AFFAIRS

There were no significant changes in the Union's financial affairs during the financial year

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

A review of operations of the Branch during the Financial Year showed the impact of the weaker economy with the drop in membership income by 7.5% and its flow on affect to the rest of the results.

Although costs were limited to an increase of only 0.8% it resulted in a fall in the Net Surplus of more than \$450,000.

EVENTS AFTER THE REPORTING PERIOD

The structural problems with the building at 685 Spencer Street has made the Executive acutely aware of the need to control costs in the future should large maintenance costs be necessary.

Scope

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE, 2013

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are:

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards — Reduced Disclosure Requirements, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Fair Work (Registered Organizations) Act2009. The Branch Executive has determined that The Australian Workers' Union (Victoria Branch) is permitted to apply the Tier 2 reporting requirements(Australian Accounting Standards — Reduced Disclosure Requirements) as set out in AASB 1053 Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards because it is a not-for-profit private sector entity that does not have public accountability. They have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied and, except where there is a change in accounting policy, are consistent with those of the previous year. The accounting records have been kept on an accrual basis.

1.2 INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary as the Union is exempt from income tax under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

1.3 EMPLOYEE ENTITLEMENTS

Provision for Annual Leave

The provision for employee entitlements to Annual Leave represents the amount which the Union has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees' services provided up to the balance date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on current wage and salary rates plus leave loading.

2. PROVISION FOR LONG SERVICE LEAVE

- 2.1 The liability for Long-Service Leave of Branch officials has been taken up in the books of account. Because this debt is still partly the responsibility of National Office, a corresponding asset exists under Current Assets (\$81,252).
- 2.2 In accordance with the decision of the National Executive, each Branch now brings to account the annual indebtedness to Long service Leave of its officials.
