# Re: The Australian Workers' Union - West Australia Branch Financial Reporting Obligations under *Workplace Relations Act 1996*

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 30 June, 2003.

The legislative scheme set out in Part IX, Division 11 of the Act is directed at ensuring that a registered organisation or a branch of such an organisation discharges obligations of accountability to its members in relation to its financial affairs through proper and regular disclosure of financial information. The various steps of the financial reporting requirements must be carried out within the time-scales prescribed by the legislation so as to ensure the relevance of the financial information provided to the members.

Now that the financial year has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation.

Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the obligations arising under Part IX, Division 11 in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

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## Independent Audit Report to the members of The Australian Workers' Union (West Australian Branch)

#### Scope

We have audited the financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of the Australian Workers' Union (West Australian Branch) for the year ended 30 June 2003 as set out on pages 6 to 17. The Committee of Management is responsible for the financial report and has determined that the accounting policies used and described in Notes 1 to the financial statements which form part of the financial report are appropriate to meet the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We have conducted an independent audit of this financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of Australian Workers' Union (West Australian Branch). No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, and described in Note 1, are appropriate to the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and the rules of the organisation. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than for which it was prepared.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the organisation's financial position, and performance as represented by the results of its operations and cash flows. These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

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### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Workplace Relations Act and the rules of the organisation. The Committee of Management has determined that, as the members can demand access to the organisation's financial information, the organisation is not a reporting entity.

The statements have been prepared in accordance with the following Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements:

AAS 5:	Materiality
AAS 8:	Events Occurring After Balance Date
AAS 28:	Statement of Cash Flows

No other Australian Accounting Standards or other mandatory professional reporting requirements have been applied.

The statements are prepared on an accrual basis. They are based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The branch has a number of Section Committees including Alcoa, Newman, Port Hedland and Finucane Island which operate their own bank accounts and conduct their own annual audits. The transactions associated with these committees are not included in the financial statements of the branch.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

### (a) Members' Dues

Members' dues and subscriptions are accounted for on a cash receipts basis. Those memberships paid in advance as at year-end are recorded as deferred income and included as a current liability.

#### (b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Depreciation of non-current assets is calculated on a reducing balance so as to write off the assets (excluding land and investment properties) over their estimated useful life.

### (c) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary, as Trade Unions are exempt from income tax under Section 50-15 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

#### (d) Employee Entitlements

Provisions for employee benefits in the form of Long Service Leave and Accrued Annual Leave have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of the terms of employment, except for provision for Long Service Leave for officials and industrial officers as these employees are covered by a separate fund administered by the organisation's head office.

### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont'd)

### (e) Comparative Figures

Where required, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

### NOTE 2: NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER WORKPLACE RELATIONS ACT

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274 which reads as follows:

- (1) A member of the organisation, or the Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- (2) An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or a Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.
