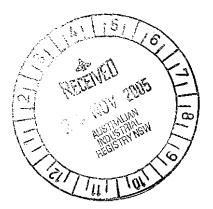

 - (i) meeting so the committee of management were held in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and
 - (ii) the financial affairs for the reporting unit have been managed in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and
 - (iii) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept and maintained in accordance with the RAO Schedule and RAO Regulations; and
 - (iv) Where the organisation consists of 2 or more reporting units, the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept, as fas as practicable, in a consistent manner to each of the other reporting units of the organisation; and
 - (v) The information sought in any request of a member of the reporting unit or a Registrar duly made under section 272 of the RAO Schedule has been furnished to the member or Registrar; and
 - (vi) There has been compliance with any order for inspection of financial records made by the Commission under section 273 of the RAO Schedule

Rights of Resignation

As per Section 174 of the Workplace Relation Act 1996

- (1) A member of an organisation may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a person designated for the purpose in the rules of the organisation or a branch of the organisation.
- (2) A notice of resignation from membership of an organisation takes effect:
 - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the organisation:
 - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the organisation; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) in any other case:
 - (i) at the end of 2 weeks, or such shorter period as is specified in the rules of the organisation, after the notice is received by the organisation; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any dues payable but not paid by a former member of an organisation, in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the organisation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the organisation, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the organisation.
- (4) A notice delivered to the person mentioned in subsection (1) is taken to have been received by the organisation when it was delivered.
- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the organisation is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with subsection (1).
- (6) A resignation from membership of an organisation is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the organisation that the resignation has been accepted.

The above financial report and statements were received in the Registry on 30 January 2006. The documents have not yet been filed. I draw your attention to the following matter which I ask you to address.

Presentation to Meeting after provision to members

In your Secretary's Certificate you state that the report was "provided" to the members on 21 December 2005 and was "presented" to an Annual General Meeting on 21 December 2005 "in accordance with s266".

Section 266 requires presentation to a second meeting - of one type or another depending on the reporting unit's rules. But section 265 prescribes a 21 day interval between the provision of copies to members and presentation to a second meeting if it is a general members' meeting.

The Annual General Meeting of the 21st December could not be the meeting contemplated by section 266 of the RAO Schedule for the purpose of "presenting the documents" unless the documents had been supplied to members 21 days before.

I note that in your application for an extension of time you indicated you wished to put the report to a general meeting. In granting the extension, Deputy Industrial Registrar Jenkins reminded you that members would have to be provided with the report 21 days before their presentation to a general meeting.

In addition, some doubt could arise whether the provision of the report to members on 21 December was adequate. The legislation requires a copy of the report to be provided to all members, not just those attending a meeting.

Action to be taken

Could you please advise whether members were provided with copies of the financial report in any other way and at any other time besides the general meeting held on 21 December 2005? If they have not been, it will be necessary for the Branch to take steps to do so.

The Branch can then present the documents to a meeting of the Committee of Management in order to satisfy the requirements of s266, since AWU rule 48(2) satisfies the requirements of s266(3). If these steps are necessary I would ask you to confirm when they have occurred

We will endeavour to have the document amended as soon as I can.

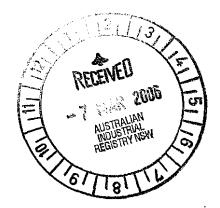
