Reasons for election

Elections for the positions marked “A” are required under Civil Air Rule 34(e), which states “*Elections for Delegates representing the following divisions shall be conducted each even numbered year...*”

Elected by:

For the position of Melbourne Centre, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Melbourne Centre.

For the position of Regional District, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Regional District.

For the position of Sydney Towers and TCU, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Sydney Towers and TCU.

For the position of Brisbane Towers and TCU, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Brisbane Towers and TCU.

For the position of Perth Towers and TCU, the electorate for the direct voting system is the Perth Towers and TCU.

Nominations open:

Nominations open in accordance with a timetable provided by the Returning Officer, delegated by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC).

As per Civil Air Rule 35(d)(1)(a), “*The returning officer shall ...not later than the first day of May in any year, call for nominations for the Divisional Delegate positions becoming vacant, pursuant to rule 34 of these rules, on the thirtieth (30th) day of June in that year; by insertion of notices in journals and/or circulars to members' employment facilities, as the returning officer deems appropriate*”

Nominations close:

As per Civil Air Rule 33(e), “*All nominations for elections, of the position of Divisional Delegate ... shall be received by the returning officer no later than the fourteenth (14th) day of May in the year in which the position becomes vacant.*”

Cut off date for roll:

As per Civil Air Rule 35(g), “*The roll of voters for any ballot is to be closed on the seventh day before the day on which nominations for the election open*”.
