AEC POST ELECTION REPORTS

Following is a brief outline of key requirements relating to AEC post election reports. For detail please refer to:

- Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 [Sections 197 and 198] and the Regulations [regs 141 and 142]
- RAO fact sheet no. 5

What the AEC is required to do:

- The AEC must provide a written post election report on the conduct of the election to the Industrial Registrar and to the organisation or branch for whom the election was conducted within 30 days of the completion of the election [for detail refer s 197 and reg 141]
- The AEC must publish a notice on its website advising that a copy of the report can be obtained on the request of a member who was eligible to vote in the election [reg 141]

What organisations/branches are required to do after receiving the post election report:

An organisation or branch that has a website must, as soon as practicable, publish on
its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation/branch,
or from the AEC, on the request of a member who was eligible to vote in the election
[reg 141(4) and (5)]. The following wording would meet this requirement:

Post election report available

The Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) has provided NSW Branch with its post election report.

Members are advised that a copy of this report is available on request from the Branch or the AEC. To request a copy from the Branch please contact Christie Munro by phone on 02 9009 4013 or email cmunro@civilcontractors.com.

In the case of an adverse report this is the action you must take:

- If the post election report identifies a rule that was difficult to interpret or apply, the organisation/branch must:
 - o respond to the AEC within 30 days [s198(1) and (2)]
 - o make available the "relevant extract" of the post election report and a copy of the Branch's response to the AEC to members. [Section 198 and reg. 142 detail the ways in which this information is to be publicised (e.g., via newsletter, website)].
 - o lodge with Fair Work Australia (within 30 days after the day on which you respond to the AEC) a copy of the relevant extract and its response together with a declaration that the organisation/branch will provide a copy of the relevant extract and response to any member on request [s 198(6)]
- Branches to forward copies of post election report and any related correspondence to National Office.

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
