Re: Schedule 1 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule) Financial Reports for year ended 30 June 2008 – FR2008/381

I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports for the South Australian Branch of the Civil Contractors Federation for the year ended 30 June 2008. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 24 September 2008.

The documents have not been filed.

#### 1. What you are required to do for the financial report for year ended 30 June 2008.

The current designated officer's certificate dated 4 August 2008 was executed prior to the events to which it is certifying and contains information inconsistent to that contained in the cover letter of 22 September 2008. The second dot point of the certificate states that the full report was provided to members on 4 August 2008 but the auditor's report which forms part of the full report was signed on 5 August. The cover letter states the audited financial accounts and reports were provided to members on 7 August 2007 (which I take to mean 2008). I note the minutes of the Branch Annual General Meeting were lodged as evidence that the meeting took place, but unfortunately the minutes were unsigned. To resolve the abovementioned issues I request a new designated officer's certificate be lodged with the Registry. The second dot point of the certificate should reflect the date the full report (which contains the auditor's report) was provided to the members (7 August 2008) and the new certificate should be signed contemporaneously. For future reference please ensure the execution date of the designated officer's certificate is at a date after the date of the general meeting of members where the full report is presented.

### 2. Comments for Future Financial Reports.

Please note that as the Branch Chief Executive Officer you do not qualify as a designated "officer" as defined in sections 6 and 9 of the RAO Schedule and therefore cannot be a signatory to the operating report. I am aware of rule 51 of the Civil Contractors Federation rules which state that the Branch Chief Executive Officer "shall be a Secretary of each Branch" and "(t)hey shall conduct all correspondence on behalf of the Branch and accept as directed by the Branch President the same shall be conducted in their name.... prepare and furnish all notices and returns required to be given by or on behalf of the Branch of the Federation under any law." However, for the purposes of the financial reports prepared under the RAO Schedule you are not an "officer" as defined by the RAO Schedule.

Please ensure in future that all reports or statements that form part of the full report is signed by an elected officer with voting rights, such as the Branch President, Branch Vice President or Branch Treasurer.

I have also noted the accounts do not provide any information in relation to any recovery of wages activity. Items 16 – 23, 25(f) and 27(b) of the Reporting Guidelines govern the financial reporting of recovery of wages activity.

Where the reporting unit has not undertaken any recovery of wages activity for the financial year a statement in the auditor's report or in the committee of management statement to say that there was no recovery of wages activity for the financial year would be sufficient.

I anticipate receipt of the new designated officer's certificate by 17 October 2008. Please advise me if this will be a problem.

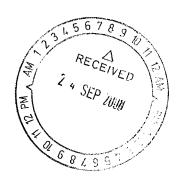

# CIVIL CONTRACTORS FEDERATION SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BRANCH Independent Audit Report to the Branch Members

I have audited the accounts and statements of Civil Contractors Federation SA Branch for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2008, as set out in this report. The Board of Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accounts and Statements and the information contained therein.

I have conducted an independent audit of the accounts and statements in order to express an opinion on them to the Branch organization members. My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the accounts and statements are free of material mis-statement.

My procedures included examinations on a test basis of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the accounts and statements and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects, the accounts and statements are presented fairly in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements the Workplace Relations Act, so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Branch organisation's financial position, the results of its operations and its cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

#### **Audit Opinion**

- a) In my opinion:
  - (i) there were kept by the Branch organization in relation to the year, satisfactory accounts records, including:
    - A. records of the sources and nature of the income of the Branch organization (including income from members); and
    - B. records of the nature and purposes of the expenditure of the Branch organisation: and
  - (ii) the accounts and statements prepared under the Workplace Relations Act in relation to the year were properly drawn and presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the RAO Schedule contained in the Workplace Relations Act of:
    - A. the financial affairs of the Branch organization as at the end of the year; and
    - B. the income and expenditure and any surplus or deficit of the Branch organization for the year; and
    - c. its cash flows for the year; and

- b) all the information and explanations that, under subsection (2) of section 257 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and the RAO Schedule, officers or employees of the Branch organization were required to provide were provided.
- c) In conducting my audit I have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

#### **Emphasis of Matter**

Without qualification to the opinion expressed above, attention is drawn to the following matters affecting the financial report at 30<sup>th</sup> June 2008.

#### 1) **Inherent Uncertainty Regarding Going Concern**

Attention is drawn to the matters referred to in notes 3, 4 and 5 to the accounts and statements. The South Australian Branch is part of the Civil Contractors Federation and accordingly, the South Australian Branch assets and liabilities form part of the assets and liabilities of the Civil Contractors Federation.

In the event that the Civil Contractors Federation was unable to pay its debts, it is believed that all of the assets of the Branch could be applied for that purpose.

I have no means to properly assess whether the Civil Contractors Federation is in a position to pay its debts as and when they fall due and I do not believe that the South Australian Branch is in a position to provide any further assistance to me in this regard.

I do not believe it is possible for a conclusion to be reach by me or the Branch Board of Management on the ability of the Civil Contractors Federation to pay its debts as and when they fall due without an audit being conducted on the Civil Contractors Federation and all of its other Branches, and the results of such audit being provided to me before the completion of my audit of the South Australian Branch.

The Workplace Relations Act requires that the accounts and statements of the Branch be separately prepared and audited as an autonomous entity.

# CIVIL CONTRACTORS FEDERATION SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BRANCH NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2008

#### 1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

#### Basis of Preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, and the requirements of the RAO schedule contained in the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in a financial report containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions to which they apply. Compliance with Australian Accounting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes also comply with International Financial Reporting Standards.

Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of this financial report are presented below. They have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs, modified where applicable by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets.

The financial report covers Civil Contractors Federation South Australian Branch as an organisation registered under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and includes its operating activities and those of its training arm Civil Train as disclosed in the financial statement.

#### 2. Income Tax

The activities of the Federation are carried on for the purpose of promotion and development of an industrial resource of Australia and not for the purpose of profit or gain to its individual members. Accordingly, the Federation is exempt from income tax.

#### 3. Branch Relationship with the Civil Contractors Federation

The Branch, while autonomous in relation to most of its day to day operations, is not considered to be a separate entity at law from the Civil Contractors Federation.

The ownership of Branch assets and responsibility for Branch liabilities are believed to ultimately rest with the Civil Contractors Federation. It is therefore possible that Branch assets may be appropriated by the Civil Contractors Federation to meet its obligations, which could include providing financial support to other Branches.

#### 4. Going Concern

While the Branch, if viewed as an autonomous legal entity, is believed to be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due, no assessment has been made as to the likelihood of the Branch being called upon to financially support the Civil Contractors Federation either nationally or in respect of its other Branches.

Assets and liabilities of the Branch have been brought to account on the basis that the Branch activities will continue. The values attributed in the accounts to assets and the stated amounts of liabilities may not be realised or settled at their recorded values in the event that the Branch ceased to continue its business and there may also be changes in the dates of maturity of liabilities. Such potential differences in values have not been quantified.

#### 5. Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

The Branch is believed to be liable for unpaid debts of the Civil Contractors Federation to the extent of the Branch assets and at the date of this report, no known liability exists for any contingent liability. The organisation is not aware of any known contingent asset at 30th June 2008.

#### 6. Employee Entitlements

Provision has been made in the accounts to allow for annual and long service leave entitlements due to employees at 30/06/08, together with on costs required by accounting standards.

Long service leave is calculated from day one of employment, Balances of employee entitlements are contained in the Balance Sheet as under:-

#### 7. Lease of Office

The Branch leases a building from Earthmoving Contractors Association SA Inc. at an annual rental of \$63,000 for the year ending 30/06/08. (See Note 20)

#### 8. Related Party Disclosures

Some of the CCF SA members are also members of the Earthmoving Contractors Association of SA Inc (ECA). They comprise a significant majority of all of the members of ECA. In addition, most of the members of the Board of Management of the organisation hold equivalent managerial positions with ECA. They comprise a significant majority of all of those equivalent ECA managerial positions.

Other than Ted Paluszek, no other member of the Board of the SA Branch or related party to them has received or become entitled to receive any payment or other benefit of pecuniary value from the organisation, ECA or Civil Train. Material transactions between the organisation, and ECA are as follows:-

- (ii) The Civil Contractors Federation (CCF) purchased Beaconsfield Press shares and an attaching partnership interest from ECA SA for \$25,000. CCF allocated the benefit of the investment and the attaching liability for the cost of purchase equally between the organisation (CCF SA) and the Northern Territory Branch (CCF NT). CCF SA is to administer the transaction and it accounts for:-
  - . A \$12,500 share (50%) of the investment; and
  - . the full liability to ECA SA for the cost of 100% of the investment; and
  - . the amount owed by CCF NT for its 50% interest in the investment, which has been paid in full.

The price paid for the shares is believed to be at fair commercial value.

#### 9. Workplace Relations Act - RAO Schedule Section 272

- (1) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.

The Management Committee resolved on the 11th August 2004 to create an operating cash reserve based on three months expenditure and such reserve to be fully established in a term deposit. The amount required is based on the 2008/2009 budgeted expenditure of \$637,655 (consolidated) (25% of \$2,550,619 - consolidated).

At 30/06/08 \$637,655 (consolidated) has been set aside in a term deposit as disclosed in the Balance Sheet.
