Re: Financial Reports for year ended 30 June 2006 - Civil Contractors Federation - Western Australian Branch - FR2006/255

I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports of the Civil Contractors Federation – Western Australian Branch for the year ended 30 June 2006 and the fresh lodgement of the Designated Officer's Certificate, Operating Report and Committee of Management Statement all dated 24 October 2006. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 31 October and 22 November 2006 respectively.

The documents have been filed.

Although the documents have been filed, I would like to comment on some issues arising out of the reports. I make these comments to assist you when you next prepare the financial reports. You do not need to take any further action in respect of the financial reports already lodged.

#### 1. Notes to Financial Statements

Subsection 272(5) of Schedule 1 of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* (the RAO Schedule) requires the general purpose financial report to include a notice drawing attention to subsections 272(1), 272(2) and 272(3) and to set out those subsections. I note the subsections reproduced in your Branch's general purpose financial report was a reproduction of the superseded subsections.

Under the Reporting Guidelines made pursuant to s.255 of the RAO Schedule, the financial statements should provide information for the preceding corresponding financial year which corresponds to the disclosures specified for the current financial year. I note that the Statement of Cash Flows did not provide information of the preceding corresponding financial year.

### 2. Auditor's Report

The Auditor's Report should provide *details of the individual Auditor's qualifications* to confirm he or she is an approved auditor under s.256 of RAO Schedule and Regulation 4 of the RAO Regulations. Regulation 4 defines an approved auditor as a *person* who is a member of CPA Australia, The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia or the National Institute of Accountants *and* holds a current Public Practice Certificate.

### 3. Date of execution of documents lodged with Registry

The freshly lodged Designated Officer's Certificate, Operating Report and Committee of Management Statement were all dated 24 October 2006. This may have been dated in error. The documents were dated two weeks before the date of my request for the freshly executed documents, 8 November 2006. Please ensure all future documents lodged in the Registry that require a signature, particularly from an office holder, have the correct date of execution.

#### 4. Recovery of Wages Activity

I note the accounts do not provide any information in relation to any recovery of wages activity. Where the reporting unit has not undertaken any recovery of wages activity for the financial year a statement by the auditor to the effect that there was no recovery of wages activity for the financial year would be sufficient.

#### 5. Electronic Lodgement

I encourage you to take advantage of the electronic lodgement service provided by the Registry for future lodgements. ## Manner of resignation

I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports of the Civil Contractors Federation – Western Australian Branch for the year ended 30 June 2006. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 31 October 2006.

The documents have not yet been filed.

There are a number of issues that require attention before the documents can be filed.

#### 1. Certificate of Designated Officer

Section 268 of Schedule 1 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (the RAO Schedule) requires a certificate by a prescribed designated officer stating that the documents lodged are copies of the documents provided to members and presented to a meeting in accordance with s.266.

I note this Certificate was signed by you in your capacity as Branch Chief Executive Officer.

Regulation 162 of the Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) Regulations 2003 (the RAO Regulations) provides:

"For paragraph 268(c) of the RAO Schedule, a prescribed officer is:

- (a) the secretary; or
- (b) an officer of the organisation other than the secretary who is authorized by the organisation or by the rules of the organisation to sign the certificate mentioned in that paragraph."

Sections 6 and 9 of the RAO Schedule provide the definitions of "officer" and "office".

I note that sub-rule 51(a) of the organisation's rules provides that "there shall be a Secretary of each Branch who shall be known as the Branch Chief Executive Officer (CEO) who shall be the principal salaried officer of the Branch and shall hold office on such terms and conditions as agreed by the Branch Board". I also note that sub-rule 51(b) requires the Branch CEO to conduct all correspondence on behalf of the Branch and except as directed by the Branch President shall be conducted in the name of the Branch CEO. Although the rules infer the Branch CEO is the "Secretary" of the Branch, that position is neither an elected position, nor is the holder of the position a voting member on any collective body of the Branch and is not required to hold property

of the Branch. Therefore it does not fall within the definition of "office" or "office" as previously mentioned and consequently does not satisfy the requirements of section 268.

Would you please arrange lodgement of a fresh designated officer's certificate contemporaneously signed by a person whose position/duties fall within the above definitions e.g. Branch President, Branch Vice President or Branch Treasurer.

#### 2. Operating Report

The Branch Chief Executive Officer is unable to sign the Committee of Management Statement. Item 26 of the Reporting Guidelines require the statement be signed by a designated officer within the meaning of section 243

Section 243 of the RAO Schedule provides:

#### "A designated officer is an officer of:

- (a) in the case of a reporting unit that is the whole of an organisation the organisation; or
- (b) in any other case a branch, or one of the branches, that constitutes the reporting unit;

who, under the rules of the reporting unit, is responsible (whether alone or with others) for undertaking the functions necessary to enable the reporting unit to comply with this Part."

Section 243 should be read in conjunction with ss.6 and 9 of the RAO Schedule that provide the definitions of "office" and "office".

For the same reasons as above the Branch Chief Executive Officer is unable to sign the Operating Report as he is not a 'designated officer'. Would you please forward a fresh Operating Report contemporaneously signed by the Branch President, Branch Vice President or Branch Treasurer.

#### 3. Committee of Management Statement

Item 26(c) of the Reporting Guidelines provides that the committee of management statement be signed by a designated officer within the meaning of s.243 of the RAO Schedule.

Please forward a fresh Committee of Management Statement contemporaneously signed by the Branch President, Branch Vice President or Branch Treasurer.

### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. This report has been prepared as appropriate to meet the needs of the members, the Federation's constitution and the relevant legislative requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended and the Workplace Relations Regulations 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

#### **Historical Cost**

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

#### **Accruals Basis**

The Federation has determined that in accordance with subscetion 272 (2) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended it will prepare the accounts on an accrual basis.

#### Income Tax

The Federation is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, accordingly the Federation does not account for income tax.

#### Investments

Investments are bought to account at cost or at valuation. The carrying amount of investments is reviewed annually to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of the investments. Dividends and interest are bought to account in the Income and Expenditure statement when received.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are included at cost or where stated at independent valuation. All fixed assets not subject to independent valuation, including buildings but excluding freehold land, are depreciated using rates and methods estimated to write off the cost over the estimated useful life of the asset concerned and commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

#### Leases

Leases of fixed assets, whether for finance leases or operating leases, are charged as expenses in the period which they are incurred.

#### **Employee Entitlements**

Provision is made for the Federation's liability for annual leave and long service leave arising from services rendered by employees to the reporting date. The provision for long service leave includes the Federation's legal obligation and expected future payments where no legal entitlements has arisen and the employee has completed at least seven years of service.

Liabilities have not been discounted to their present values.

Contributions made to an employee superannuation fund are charged as an expense when incurred. Other than as required by the Superannuation Guarantee Legislation, there is no legal obligation to provide benefits to employees on retirement.
