Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 27 April and 12 May 2021 the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical, Energy and Services Division - Tasmanian Divisional Branch (**the organisation**) lodged with the Registered Organisations Commission prescribed information for an election to fill the following office, due to insufficient nominations received in the previous scheduled election **E2019/70**:

Divisional State Councillor – Northern Section (1)

- [2] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed office is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (**RO Act**), I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.
- [3] I also note that the prescribed information lodged in this matter relates to an office for which insufficient nominations were received for an election declared on 24 July 2019. Even if there is not a specific rule in either the rules of the organisation or of the relevant Division stipulating a specific timeframe for the conduct of an election arising out of earlier insufficient nominations (in this case for Divisional State Councillors), it is apparent from the objects of the RO Act, particularly the principles of democratic control, that organisations and their branches need to make reasonable attempts to fill all offices, including those where vacancies arise through insufficient nominations being received.
- [4] In this regard, the organisation's attention is drawn to the decision in *Geneff v Peterson* and Ors [1986] FCA 432, in particular the comments of Gray J at 129 that:¹

If insufficient nominations are received, then further elections must be held and further nominations called for. This process must continue, for as long as vacancies exist on the Executive Committee. In the meantime, however, a branch is not to be paralysed by the inability of its decision-making body to function.

[5] I therefore take this opportunity to remind the organisation that where insufficient nominations are received at future scheduled elections – or indeed if insufficient nominations are received in the election to be arranged for this particular office – it should lodge prescribed information in a more timely manner in an attempt to fill such office(s).
