CEPU Operating Reports for periods ending 31 March 2010-31 March 2016 – Reporting of Membership Numbers

I refer to the above and enclose by way of lodging:

 Declaration correcting the membership figures reported in the operating report for the reporting periods ending 31 March 2010-31 March 2016.

As you are aware, in response to the Fair Work Commission (FWC) questioning the validity of the reporting of CEPU membership figures, <sup>1</sup> the CEPU instigated an independent audit of the membership figures reported in our annual returns and annual committee of management operating reports for the years ended 31 December 2013-2015 and 31 March 2013-2015 respectively. On 11 November 2016, the CEPU provided the FWC with the report of the independent audit, which included a table showing the variance between the reported membership figures and the audited number of total members for those reporting periods. Based on the results on the first audit, on 23 March 2017 the CEPU lodged amended operating reports for the years ended 31 March 2013-31 March 2015.

On 16 March 2017 the FWC wrote to the CEPU expressing dissatisfaction with the timeframe of the first audit only covering three years of reporting periods from 2013 to 2015. On 13 April 2017 the CEPU responded to the concerns expressed by the FWC and advised we would be conducting a second audit adopting the terms of reference suggested by the FWC in that correspondence of 16 March (Annexure E), excluding redoing the audit for 31 December 2013 to 31 December 2015. We further advised the FWC that each Division would be engaging their own auditor to conduct the second round of audits.

As a consequence of the second round of independent audits, on 11 December 2017, the CEPU National Council, at its annual meeting, authorised the submission of a declaration to the Registered Organisations Commission (ROC), which now has responsibility for this matter, to correct the figures reported in the operating reports for total members as at 31 March 2010-31 March 2016.

On 11 November 2016, the CEPU provided the FWC with the report of the independent audit, which included a table showing the variance between the reported membership figures and the audited number of total members to the FWC.

As a consequence of the independent audit, on 20 March 2017, the CEPU National Council, in a decision by correspondence, authorised the submission of a declaration to the FWC to correct the figures reported in the operating reports for total members as at 31 March 2013, 31 March 2014 and 31 March 2015.

In addition, the National Council authorised a correction to the figure reported in the 2016 operating report with respect to the 2015 reporting period.

The reason for the discrepancy in the reported 2016 figures was advised to the FWC in correspondence dated 16 November 2016, which was a response to the inquiry of the FWC dated that day.

I apologise for the delay in lodging a correcting report with the Commission.

#### **DECLARATION - CORRECTING REPORT TO CEPU OPERATING REPORT**

lodged pursuant to s.268

I, Allen Hicks, of Suite 408, Level 4, 30-40 Harcourt Parade, Rosebery, in the state of New South Wales, declare:

- 1. I am the National Secretary of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia, an organisation registered under the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the Act).
- 2. Pursuant to s.268 of the Act, for the periods ended 31 March 2013; 31 March 2014; 31 March 2015 and 31 March 2016, the full financial reports, including the operating reports, of the CEPU National Council were lodged with the Fair Work Commission (FWC) in FR2013/110, FR2014/53, FR2015/55 and FR2016/66 respectively.
- 3. An independent audit report into the membership figures reported in the committee of management operating reports for the reporting periods 31 March 2013; 31 March 2014 and 31 March 2015, conducted by Stannards Accounting (the Stannards audit) in 2016, was lodged with the FWC on 11 November 2016. The Stannards audit found the following variances with the figures reported in the operating reports:

- 4. On 13 March 2017, in response to the findings of the Stannards audit, a decision by correspondence with a return date of the 20 March 2017, was submitted to the National Council to authorise the National Secretary to amend the committee of management operating reports for the years ended 31 March 2013, 31 March 2014 and 31 March 2015 to reflect the membership figures resulting from the Stannards audit.
- 5. The report of the Stannards audit of the membership figures included an audited membership figure of 109,169 for the operating report as at 31 March 2015. However, the operating report for the period ended 31 March 2016, which was lodged with the FWC on 29 September 2016, stated that the membership figure for the reporting period ending 31 March 2015 was 107,344. Unfortunately, that figure of 107,344 was incorrect. The figure should have been 109,169. To correct this, the National Council in the decision by correspondence referred to above, approved a correction to the operating report for the period ended 31 March 2016 as follows:

#### "Number of Members

The number of persons that were, at the end of the financial year to which the report relates, recorded in the register of members for s.230 of the Act and who are taken to be members of the Union under s.244 of the Act is: 108,524 (2015: 107,344–109,169). The 2015 financial statements recorded membership at 113,387 and after a subsequent review and independent audit this number was changed to 107,344 109,169.

#### Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia Financial Report for the year ended 31 March 2013 [FR2013/110]

I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports of Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australian (the reporting unit). The documents were lodged with Fair Work Commission (FWC) on 18 October 2013. I also acknowledge supplementary information that you provide on 24 April 2014 relating to the reported total equity figure and information in relation to membership subscription and trade receivables.

The financial report has now been filed.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged. The FWC will confirm these concerns have been addressed prior to filing next year's report.

#### Timescale requirements

As you are aware, a reporting unit is required under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (RO Act) to undertake certain steps in accordance with specified timelines. Information about these timeline requirements can be found on FWC website. In particular, I draw your attention to Financial reporting process and timelines which explain the timeline requirements, and Diagrammatic summary of financial reporting timelines which sets out the timeline requirements in diagrammatical form.

I note that the following timescale requirements were not met. Future failure to meet these timelines may result in an inquiry into the organisation and the General Manager of the FWC may apply under s.310(1) of the RO Act to the Federal Court of Australia for a pecuniary penalty order to be imposed on your organisation and, potentially, an officer whose conduct led to the noncompliance.

#### Preparation of the General Purpose Financial Report (GPFR)

Section 253 and 254 of the RO Act require that a GPFR and an operating report be prepared as soon as practicable after the end of the financial year. Section 266 requires that the financial report be presented to a general meeting of members or a committee of management meeting within six months after the end of the financial year. In the absence of an extension of time for holding a general meeting [see section 265(5)] the latest possible date of lodgement with the FWC is six months and 14 days after the end of the financial year.

The committee of management statement indicates that a resolution relating to the GPFR and operating report for the financial years ending the 31 March 2013 was not made until 18 October 2013, 6 months and 18 days after the reporting unit end of the financial year and 3 days after the latest possible date of lodgement with the FWC. These circumstances demonstrates a breach of s.253(1) and s.254(1) of the RO Act

## Reports must be provided to Members within 5 months of end of financial year where report is presented before committee of management meeting

The designated officer's certificate of the reporting unit states that the financial report was provided to members on 31 October 2013, and presented to a committee of management meeting on 6 November 2013. Under section 265(5)(b) of the RO Act, where the report is presented to a Committee of Management meeting, the report must be provided to members within 5 months of the end of the financial year.

If these dates are correct, the reporting unit should have applied for an extension of time for the provision of the financial report to members in accordance with section 265(5) of the RO Act.

Please note that in future financial years a written request for an extension of time signed by a relevant officer, including any reason for the delay, must be made prior to required date of lodgement.

## Reports must be presented to a General Meeting of members within 6 months after the end of the Financial Year

As stated previously, the financial report for the reporting unit for the financial years ending 31 March 2013 was presented to a Committee of Management meeting on 6 November 2013. Under section 266(3) of the RO Act, the report must be presented to a Committee of Management meeting within 6 months after the end of the financial year.

As mentioned above, the reporting unit should have applied for an extension of time and in future financial years will need to make a written request for an extension of time signed by a relevant officer, including any reason for the delay before the required date of lodgement.

#### **Operating Report**

#### Review of Principal Activities

Subsection 254(2)(a) of the RO Act requires an operating report to contain a review of the principal activities of the reporting unit, the results of those activities and any significant changes in the nature of the those activities. I note that the operating report provides a review of the principal activities, but does not state whether there were any significant changes in the nature of these activities.

These requirements are in addition to subsection 254(2)(b) of the RO Act which requires an Operating Report to give details of any significant changes in the reporting unit's financial affairs during the year.

#### **General Purpose Financial Report**

#### Member subscription

As confirmed by your correspondence dated 24 April 2014, the revenue item 'member subscription' relates to two amounts, levy on branches and the ACTU affiliation fee. The term 'member subscription' is not an appropriate description of the revenue received and should be changed to reflect the actual situation. These amounts should be separately disclosed in the statement of comprehensive income or the notes.

Reporting Guideline 10(b) requires that where contributions from another reporting unit are received, the amount and the name of each reporting unit are to be disclosed in either the statement of comprehensive income or the notes.

#### Disclosure of audit fees

Australian Accounting Standard AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures paragraph 10 requires the financial statements to separately disclose amounts paid to the auditor for audit fees and for non-audit services. I note that this information has been provided in the additional financial data that is the Profit and Loss Account on page 17 however has this information was

not covered under the statutory audit FWC is unable to accept this information and it cannot be used in the assessment of the financial report.

Please note that in future years all relevant and required financial disclosures must be included in the General Purpose Financial Report which has been subject to the full statutory audit and included in the Auditors opinion.

#### Liabilities

Reporting Guideline 13 requires either the balance sheet or the notes to the balance sheet to disclose any receivables from and/or liabilities owed to other reporting unit(s), including the name of the other reporting unit(s). This information has not been provided in relation to trade receivables and trade and other payables. In future years please ensure that the name of the relevant branch(s) and amount in relation to any such receivables and liabilities are disclosed.

#### Cash Flow Statement

Reporting Guideline 15 states that 'where another reporting unit of the organisation is the source of cash inflow or the application of a cash outflow, such cash flow should be separately disclosed in the notes to the financial statements and show the name of the other reporting unit concerned'.

This is in addition to the requirement to disclose capitation fees received from branches (Reporting Guideline 10(b)). In future years please ensure that cash flows to and from any branches, are disclosed in the notes to the cash flow statement.

#### Changes to the reporting guidelines

A third edition to the General Manager's s.253 reporting guidelines was gazetted on 26 June 2013. These guidelines will apply to all financial reports that end on or after 30 June 2013. FWC has also developed a model set of financial statements for the 2012-2013 financial year. There is no requirement to use this model set of financial statements but it may be a useful resource to ensure compliance with the RO Act, the s.253 reporting guidelines and the Australian Accounting Standards.

The national office has also been involved in lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to CEPU members.

#### 2. The National Council's Financial Affairs

There have been no significant changes in the national office financial affairs. A small service fee is paid for each financial member.

#### 3. Right of Members to Resign

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#### Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 31 March 2013

The financial statements cover Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services of Australia - National Council as an individual entity. Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services of Australia - National Council is a registered trade union domiciled in Australia.

#### 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations and the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

#### (b) Comparative figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Where the Union has retrospectively applied an accounting policy, made a retrospective restatement or reclassifies items in its financial statements, an additional statement of financial position as at the beginning of the earliest comparative period will be disclosed.

#### (c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less which are convertible to a known amount of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

#### (d) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Union during the reporting period which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

#### (e) Income tax

The Union is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (f) Revenue and other income

The Union recognises revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services of Australia - National Council's activities as discussed below.

#### 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies continued

#### (f) Revenue and other income continued

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. Any consideration deferred is treated as the provision of finance and is discounted at a rate of interest that is generally accepted in the market for similar arrangements. The difference between the amount initially recognised and the amount ultimately received is interest revenue.

#### Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

#### Subscriptions

Revenue from the provision of membership subscriptions is recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (g) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.
