This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 31 March, 2004.

While the accounting, auditing and reporting obligations have changed with the introduction of the *Registration and Accountability of Organisations* Schedule (the RAO Schedule) which generally came into operation on 12 May 2003, Part IX, Division 11 of the Act continues to apply in relation to a financial year of an organisation that ends on 31 March, 2004. The corresponding obligations set out in the RAO Schedule apply to each financial year of an organisation that starts on or after 1 July 2003.

Now that the financial year for 31 March, 2004 has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation.

Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the accounting, auditing and reporting obligations in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

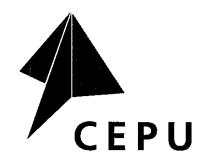

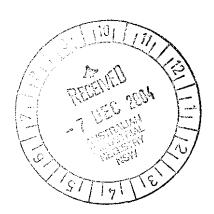

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2004

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 50 – 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the cost basis.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee of management to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives to the Union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Properties held for investment purposes are not subject to a depreciation charge. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2004

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES cont

d. Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Union's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on-costs. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the Union to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

e. Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months and net of bank overdrafts.

f. Revenue

Revenue from membership is recognised on a accrual basis.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

g. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

h. Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

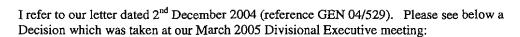

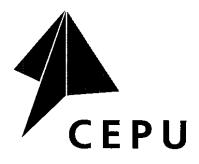

DECISION 195A DECIPHA PTY LIMITED

"That the Divisional Executive authorises the divisional Secretary to instigate the initiation of a Bargaining Period pursuant to Section 170MI(1), (2) and (3) and 170 MJ of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 in relation to Decipha Pty Limited and employees engaged by the company performing work in the postal industry."

DECISION 195B POST LOGISTICS

"That the Divisional Executive authorises the divisional Secretary to instigate the initiation of a Bargaining Period pursuant to Section 170MI(1), (2) and (3) and 170 MJ of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 in relation to Australia Post — Post Logistics Division and employees engaged by the company performing third party warehousing/fulfilment operations within the scope of the Post Logistics Third Party Warehousing/Fulfilment Business Enterprise Agreement 2001-2004."

DECISION 196 PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT SCHEMES

"That the Divisional Executive support an evaluation of the legal and OH&S implications of current employee performance measurement schemes being undertaken by Telstra and other employers which are not provided for in the current Awards/EBAs.

This evaluation to take into account the evidence provided in recent "CC Points" AIRC proceedings and the experiences of other unions.

The outcomes of this evaluation to be utilised in a campaign by the CEPU designed to ensure that the legal rights of members and their health and safety is not affected by the unreasonable surveillance, harassment, discrimination and unfair procedures associated with these schemes.

Further the CEPU takes action to ensure that any employee development scheme is primarily designed to ensure that employees are provided with adequate training, facilities and tools to undertake their daily work.

Until such time as this whole matter is satisfactorily resolved, Divisional Executive advises members that they should exercise extreme caution in the completion and signing of any such performance review, and that members should appropriately contest and/or qualify any such signature, as appropriate. Members should seek CEPU advice if they are uncertain of their personal situation in respect to such Performance Measurement Schemes."

DECISION 198A AWAS IN TELSTRA

"That the Telecommunications Group notes Telstra's renewed campaign to push out Australian Workplace Agreements to staff and resolves to respond in the following manner:

- Provide detailed information to members to counter Telstra's propaganda surrounding AWAs.
- Develop and distribute a resource kit for members seeking to get off AWAs.
- Collect case studies from members who have experienced difficulties on AWAs and publicise these issues to the general membership.
- Encourage members to report any instances where Telstra is placing members under duress to sign AWAs or is disseminating misleading information.
- Investigate membership claims that Telstra is discriminating against Award staff in the allocation of work to deliberately advantage AWA staff.
- Provide information to Branches on Bargaining Agents.
- Develop and co-ordinate a national communication programme aimed at educating members on the pitfalls of AWAs.
- Seek expert advice on salary sacrifice arrangements in Awards/EBA and develop accurate advice for members.
- Seek to insert a broad salary sacrifice clause in the next Telstra EBA."
