Re: Lodgement of Financial Statements and Accounts – NSW Postal and Telecommunications Branch – for year ending 31 March 2012 (FR2012/213)

Thank you for your letter dated 16 October 2012 which was received by Fair Work Australia the same day. Your letter mentioned two matters which I raised in my letter dated 8 October, namely, the statement of donations and the requirements for concise reporting, and I welcome the opportunity to clarify the legislative requirements.

(1) Donations statement

I note the copy of your letter dated 10 July 2012 which was attached. Unfortunately, there was no copy of this in Fair Work Australia's records, or any record of its lodgment which is why I mentioned the issue of s237 statements in my correspondence.

I have considered the statement you attached, noting the typographical error in the reference to "22 November 2012". I have also looked closely at the provisions of section 237. The relevant extract concerning donations provides as follows:

237 Organisations to notify particulars of loans, grants and donations

(1) An organisation must, within 90 days after the end of each financial year (or such longer period as the General Manager allows), lodge with FWA a statement showing the relevant particulars in relation to each loan, grant or donation of an amount exceeding \$1,000 made by the organisation during the financial year.

Note: This subsection is a civil penalty provision (see section 305).	
(6) The relevant particulars, in relation to a grant or donation made by an organisation, are	⊋ :

(a) the <u>amount</u> of the grant or donation; and

(b) the <u>purpose</u> for which the grant or donation was made; and

(c) except where the grant or donation was made to relieve a member of the organisation, or a dependant of a member of the organisation, from severe financial hardship—the <u>name and address</u> of the person to whom the grant or donation was made.

Considered strictly, the statement you have provided is compliant in respect of providing (a) the *amount* of the donation; (b) the *purpose* for which the donation was made; and (c) the *name* of the "person" (i.e. the recipient), but was partly non-compliant in not providing the *address* of the

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recipient. In addition, the Branch was not compliant insofar as it did not lodge the statement within 90 days of the end of the financial year, i.e. by 30 June 2012.

I have considered previous reporting lodgments by the Branch. The only statement lodged under section 237 which I was able to identify readily for comparison was one lodged last year in respect of that financial year (FR2011/2515), and I attach a copy of it for your ready reference. It too omitted providing the address of the recipients although this was not pointed out in FWA's letter of acknowledgment and it was similarly lodged outside the prescribed 90 days.

The question of the prescribed time is expressed as "within 90 days..... (or such longer period as the General Manager allows)". This phrasing has the effect of granting a discretionary power to the General Manager, to consider and grant an extension of time. However, this kind of power is normally exercised in a discrete determination upon application. Accordingly, in order to avoid unreasonable presumptions of the General Manager's discretion, reporting units should in future make every effort to lodge s237 statements by the 90 day period, or lodge an application for an extension of time if circumstances lead to them lodging statements after that period.

Action - Corrected s237 Statement to be lodged

As statements under section 237 are statutory documents, to be kept on an official, if restricted, FWA file, then given the omission of the address of the donation recipient, and the typographical error, I would ask that you lodge a corrected statement which includes the address and refers to the correct date of "22 November 2011". For your convenient use, I enclose a blank proforma, similar to the one used for the preceding year.

(2) Resolution for Concise Report

You have raised several points in relation to this. Firstly, I accept that you have not previously been requested by FWA or its predecessor to reference a resolution approving the concise report in either the Committee of Management Statement or a covering letter. I also note that the Branch always provides a concise report.

Where a reporting unit has a long standing practice of providing a concise report, (or a summary under earlier legislation), the approval by the Committee to provide one might easily be taken for granted. Indeed the Act itself does not say in so many words that a declaration as to a resolution must be included anywhere in the reports.

However, a careful consideration of the Act supports an inference that a reference to a resolution to provide a concise report ought to be included. Sub-section 265(2) provides, as follows:

(2) A concise report may only be provided if, under the rules of the reporting unit, the committee of management of the reporting unit resolves that a concise report is to be provided.

In order for FWA to be able to be satisfied that the provision of a concise report has been authorized by a resolution of the Committee, it must be referenced somewhere in the documents lodged, otherwise a question naturally and properly arises. It is not therefore strictly correct for me to simply assume this is the case or not to have brought this to the Branch's attention in the past.

By way of comparison, I note that in 2003 (FR2003/33) and 2004 (FR2004/217) the summaries provided by the Branch for those years included a statement that "the following summary is provided for members in accordance with section 279(2)" (i.e. of the former pre-RAO Workplace Relations Act).

Now, section 279(2) contained a similar provision to section 265(2) of the current Act. Thus, the statement that the summary was "provided in accordance with section 279(2)" could be read, and would generally have been taken to read in the past, as equivalent to saying that, amongst other things, the committee of management had resolved under its rules to provide a summary.

In your letter you confirmed that "On 23 May 2012, our Branch Committee of Management passed the following resolution:Circulation of Concise Report etc". This confirmation enables FWA to be satisfied that the Branch has complied with section 265(2). If this kind of confirmation is included somewhere in the financial documents lodged in future, no question will arise at the time of lodgment.

Where to reference the resolution

Since the inclusion of confirmation of the resolution is only implied, there is no prescribed place for the confirmation to be included. In my letter of 8 October I suggested the Committee of Management Statement or the covering letter, but I did not intend to be prescriptive. It will depend on when the resolution to provide a concise report is made. Some reporting units prepare their Committee of Management Statement with the additional statement included because they intend to pass the resolution about the concise report at the first meeting along with the resolution in respect of the general purpose financial report and the various other declarations. Others include a brief confirming statement in the covering letter. It would be acceptable to include a reference in the concise report itself. If the resolution to provide a concise report is recorded in the minutes of a separate meeting, an extract of the minutes from that meeting would serve the purpose. As far as I am aware, FWA leaves the form in which the reporting unit provides confirmation that a resolution to provide a concise report was passed, to the reporting unit.

Conclusion

I wish to emphasize the future focus of this letter. I acknowledge that reporting units often depend on advice by FWA to assist them to fully comply with the statutory requirements and such advice will sometimes change to reflect different policy priorities. FWA is, for example, currently undertaking a review of the Reporting Guidelines first published in 2003-2004 with the intention of addressing any anomalies or ambiguities or to bring them into line with latest practice. It is incumbent on FWA officers, however, to provide reporting units with information and explanation for any apparent changes in practice or procedure.

I have consulted internally with colleagues with responsibility for different registered organizations. In support of, and reflecting, recent amendments to the Act which include requirements for training for officers with financial duties in the future, all reporting units will have their attention drawn to relevant provisions or requirements to ensure the transparency and full compliance of documentation lodged.

I hope this clarifies what FWA requires in respect of these two particular matters. In neither case should the requirement represent an onerous modification to the preparation of the financial documents. I refer to your correspondence of 8 October 2012.

In your correspondence you have drawn our attention to matters that require to being satisfied in terms of reporting "Donations and Grants" under section 237 along with whether the Branch Committee of Management provided an authority for determining circulation of a concise report to members in accordance with section 265(2) of the Act.

Donations and Grants under section 237 of the Act

On 10 July 2012, I forwarded the attached correspondence to the General Manager of Fair Work Australia.

This correspondence provides for the prescribed particulars of the donation that exceeded \$1,000 for the 2011/12 reporting period in accordance with section 237 of the Act.

Please note that I have noticed that there is a typographical error in this correspondence where within the only dot point, the date of "22 November 2012" should read "22 November "2011".

Could you please confirm or otherwise whether this particular matter of concern as expressed by you in your correspondence remains or is now satisfied.

Circulation of a concise report to members under section 265(2) of the Act

On 23 May 2012 our Branch Committee of Management passed the following resolution:

CIRCULATION OF CONCISE REPORT AND AVAILABILITY OF GPFR FOR YEAR ENDING 31 MARCH 2012

"BCOM RESOLVES FOR THE BRANCH SECRETARY TO CIRCULATE THE CONCISE REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 MARCH 2012, FOR THE INFORMATION OF MEMBERS AND MAKE AVAILABLE THE GENERAL PURPOSE FINANCIAL REPORT ON THE BRANCH WEBSITE AND A COPY OF THE SAME TO ANY MEMBER WHO MAKES A FORMAL REQUEST IN WRITING."

It is our understanding that the BCOM may consider circulation of a concise report to members under a separate determination by the BCOM and only if the rules of the union provide for such an authority.

During my time as the authourised officer managing the Branch financial reporting requirements, I have never been required by FWA or by its predecessor regulator or have been required by Branch Auditors of the requirement to have the BCOM resolution approving the concise report being referenced in the BCOM Statement of the GPFR or having it referenced in a covering letter when lodging the relevant GPFR and concise report with FWA.

The only requirement I am aware of, is where there must be a reference in the concise report for members being able to have access to a copy of the GPFR free of charge, upon a request in writing by the member.

This reference is highlighted in the opening paragraphs of page one of the concise report.

We are unsure how a reference in the BCOM Statement of a GPFR can be made of a concise report being provided to members, if the BCOM has not considered or determined for this to occur until after it receives the GPFR and passes the BCOM statement contained in the GPFR.

Nevertheless, if you disagree, we shall ensure this matter is managed in the manner as required by you in future reports. If this is the case then could you please provide in writing the precise measure to be undertaken for future reporting requirements.

Re: Lodgement of Financial Statements and Accounts – NSW Postal and Telecommunications Branch – for year ending 31 March 2012 (FR2012/213)

I acknowledge receipt of the above financial return which was received by Fair Work Australia on 20 September 2012.

The documents have been filed. However I take this opportunity to draw your attention to the following.

The figure for "Donations and Grants" in the Statement of Comprehensive Income was \$7,000. If this figure included any single donation exceeding \$1,000, then a separate statement pursuant to section 237 of the Act, showing the prescribed particulars must be lodged as soon as possible if it has not already been lodged. I enclose a form that may be completed for the purpose.

A concise report was provided to the members on and from 19 July 2012. Sub-section 265(2) of the Act provides that "a concise report may only be provided if, under the rules of the reporting unit, the committee of management of the reporting unit resolves that a concise report is to be provided."

There was no reference to any such resolution in the report. The logical time at which such a resolution would normally be passed would be at the first Committee of Management meeting, and an appropriate place to include a declaration that such a resolution was passed would be on the Committee of Management Statement, or alternatively, in the covering letter accompanying the documents. I would ask that the Branch include this in future reports if it provides a concise report.

OPERATING REPORT

Branch Committee of Management report in accordance with section 254 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 for the year ended 31 March 2012.

Principal Activities

The principal activity of the Communications, Electrical, Plumbing Union of Australia, Postal and Telecommunications Branch NSW was that of a registered Trade Union.

There have been no significant changes to the way the Union has carried out these activities during the last financial year.

Operating Result

The operating surplus for the Branch for the year ending 31 March 2012 is \$539,834 (2011: \$493,081)

Significant Changes

There have been no significant changes to the operating costs of the Branch in the last financial year.

Rights of Members

Members have the right to resign their membership of the union by giving written notice of resignation to the Branch Secretary. This written notification is accepted subject to the rules of CEPU and in accordance with section 174(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. In accordance with section 174(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 a member of an organisation may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a person designated for the purpose in the rules of the organisation or a branch of the organisation. There was no change to this rule during the year.

Superannuation Office Holders

The ACTU has appointed Jim Metcher (Elected officer) as the members' representative on the board of the Australia Post Superannuation Scheme.

Membership Numbers

- (1) Under section 230 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 the number of persons recorded in the register of members and who under section 244 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 are taken to be members of the Branch of the Union as at 31 March 2012 was 8,380.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is for the entity Communications, Electrical, Plumbing Union of Australia Postal and Telecommunications Branch NSW, as an individual entity. The Communications, Electrical, Plumbing Union of Australia is an organisation registered under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. The Postal and Telecommunications Branch NSW is a Branch of the registered organisation. In accordance with the Act the Union is a body corporate and has perpetual succession. By virtue of this method of incorporation, the Union and the Branch are not subject to the Corporations Act 2001.

(a) Basis of Preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The Branch Committee of Management has determined that Communications, Electrical, Plumbing Union of Australia Postal and Telecommunications Branch NSW is permitted to apply the Tier 2 reporting requirements (Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements) as set out in AASB 1053 Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards because it is a not-for-profit private sector entity that does not have public accountability. As such, the Branch Committee of Management has early adopted AASB 2010-2 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards Arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements from 1 July 2010. AASB 2010-2 only mandatorily applies to annual reporting periods commencing on or after 1 July 2013. The early adoption of AASB 2010-2 has had no impact on amounts recognised in the financial report and related notes because it merely requires less disclosures for these general purpose financial report, which has been prepared using Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements, than if these financial statements were prepared using Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected financial assets and liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of other significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

(b) Revenue

Contributions and Entrance Fees are accounted for on a cash receipts basis. Otherwise, the concept of accruals accounting has been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. Interest is accounted for on an accruals basis.

(c) Income Tax

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the Union is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50 - 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012 (cont'd)

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

(d) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and any impairment in value.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of plant and equipment is depreciated on a diminishing value method over their useful lives to the union commencing from the time the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Office Furniture and Equipment

10% - 33%

Motor Vehicles

22.5%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance date.

Gains and losses on disposals are calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the asset's carrying amount and are included in the statement of comprehensive income in the year that the item is derecognised.

Land and Buildings

Land and Buildings are carried at fair value.

(e) Impairment

The carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of the asset's fair value and value in use. For the purpose of assessing value in use, this represents depreciated current replacement cost, as the Union is a not-for-profit organisation.

(f) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Branch's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs.

Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. In the case of Long Service Leave this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting future cash flows.

Contributions are made by the Branch to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012 (cont'd)

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

(g) Investments

All investments and other financial assets are initially stated at cost, being the fair value of consideration given plus acquisition costs. Purchases and sales of investments are recognised on trade date, which is the date on which the entity commits to purchase, or sell the asset. Accounting policies for each category of investments and other financial assets subsequent to initial recognition are set out below.

Available-for-sale financial assets

Investments, which are classified as available for sale, are measured at cost. This results in an amount not materially different to measuring them at fair value.

(h) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables on the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

(i) Accounting Standards Issued But Not Yet Effective

There have been no accounting standards issued which will impact the financial report in future periods and which are not yet effective.

2. ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

(a) Critical accounting estimates and assumptions

The Branch makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates by definition seldom equal the related actual results. There are no estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities.

(b) Critical judgments in applying the Branch's accounting principles

There are no critical judgements that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities.

3. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR THE GENERAL MANAGER OF FAIR WORK AUSTRALIA

In accordance with the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulation 2009 the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 272 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 which read as follows:

- (1) A member of an organisation, or the General Manager of Fair Work Australia, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

NOTE 1: BASIS OF PREPARATION OF THE CONCISE FINANCIAL REPORT

- (c) s266 which requires you to present the completed documents to an eligible meeting(s) (either of the members or of the committee of management).

You should be aware that failures to comply with relevant provisions may expose reporting units to the risk of civil penalties.
