Re: CEPU - Communications Division - Western Australian Postal and Telecommunications Branch- Financial Reporting Obligations under *Workplace Relations Act 1996*

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 31 March, 2004.

While the accounting, auditing and reporting obligations have changed with the introduction of the *Registration and Accountability of Organisations* Schedule (the RAO Schedule) which generally came into operation on 12 May 2003, Part IX, Division 11 of the Act continues to apply in relation to a financial year of an organisation that ends on 31 March, 2004. The corresponding obligations set out in the RAO Schedule apply to each financial year of an organisation that starts on or after 1 July 2003.

Now that the financial year for 31 March, 2004 has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation.

Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the accounting, auditing and reporting obligations in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET TO BE PRESENTED TO THE BRANCH COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT AT THE MEETING TO BE HELD ON MONDAY 2 AUGUST 2004

The 2003/2004 Branch financial year has come and gone.

Unfortunately, there are very few positives out of the year in an industrial sense.

At the time of writing this report the CEPU is still in dispute with Australia Post regarding the proposed new EBA. This has been a very significant round of talks with attacks on Posties traditional jobs with the proposals for dedicated outdoor delivery, attacks on Retail jobs with attempts to franchise numerous retail outlets, increased use of contractors and casuals putting full time permanent jobs at risk. On top of this, the CEPU is mindful of the need for a reasonable wage outcome over the coming years coupled with job security.

Having said all that, I am still confident, with the support of the membership so strong, that we will end up with an Agreement soon.

Talks regarding a new Telstra EBA are due to start soon. However, the main concerns at Telstra are still job security and the increased amount of pressure being placed upon workers as a result of inadequate staffing, training and support.

Following the attack on jobs by Telstra in the last 12 months, in the form of forced redundancies, members have been living constantly with the stress of not knowing if they come next for the axe. It's time Telstra put the feelings of their employees before the share price.

Also, as a result of the major players in the industry utilizing more and more contractors, the Union now has to deal a lot more with private industry employees. Recently we became involved in industrial action with members working in the Pay T.V. industry, striking for a better deal. We can expect this to become more common whilst the attitude of employers remains the same.

Our biggest chance of changing some of the problems we face is to elect a Labor Government at the upcoming federal election.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Telecommunications & Services Branch, in particular Gary Carson and Jean McQuilkin, for all their support over the last 12 months.

Also, I would like to thank our Branch President and Branch Committee of Management for all their support and especially from a personal point of view, thanks to Assistant Branch Secretary Bryan Watkins for his support.

Last but by no means least, a very big thanks to Pam and Colleen for their tremendous contributions during the year.

Scope

The financial report and board members' responsibility

The financial report comprises the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flows, accompanying notes to the financial statements, and the statement by The Trustee declaration for the Communications Electrical Plumbing Union ("CEPU") Communications Division Postal and Telecommunications Branch (the "**Union**") for the year ended 31 March 2004.

The Union's Committee of Management is responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Union's financial position, and of its performance as represented by the results of its operations and cash flows.

Note 1: Statement of significant accounting policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report covers Communications Electrical Plumbing Union Communications Division Postal and Telecommunications as an individual entity. The organisation is a member of a federally registered union domiciled in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money valuations. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the organisation in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

a) Members dues and subscriptions

Members dues and subscriptions are acccounted for on an accruals basis.

b) Revenue

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rate applicable to the financial assets.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax ("GST").

c) Income tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

d) Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, the organisation considers cash to include cash on hand, at banks or financial institutions and on deposit, net of any outstanding overdrafts.

e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the organisation to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amount.

Note 1: Statement of significant accounting policies (continued)

Depreciation

The depreciation amount of all fixed assets is calculated using the straight line basis over the estimated usefule lives of the assets to the organisation commencing from the time the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of asset	Depreciation_rate
Plant and equipment	15 - 30%

f) Employee entitlements

A provision is made for the organisation's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries and annual leave which will be settled after one year have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by the organisation to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expense when incurred.

g) Interest rate risk

The organisation's exposure to interest rate risk, which is the risk that financial instruments value will fluctuate as a result of changes in market interest rates, is considered negligible.

h) Credit risk

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or other security, at balance date to recognise financial assets is the carrying amount, net of any provisions for doubtful debts, as disclosed in the statement of financial position and notes to the financial statements. The organisation does not have any material credit risk exposure to any single debtor or group of debtors under the financial instruments entered into by the organisation.

i) Net fair values

The net fair values of assets and liabilities approximate their carrying values. No financial assets and financial liabilities are readily traded on organised markets in standardised form. The aggregate net fair value and carrying amounts of financial assets and financial liabilities are disclosed in the statement of financial position and in the notes to the financial statements.

j) Comparative figures

Where required, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current year.

Note 1: Statement of significant accounting policies (continued)

Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

- "274(1) [Application for information] A member of the organisation, or a Registrar may apply to the organisation for specified prescibed information in relation to the organisation.
- "274(2) [Provision of information] An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
- "274(3) [Function of Registrar] A registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member, information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

Audit Report - CEPU, Communications Division, Western Australian, Postal and Telecommunications Branch - 31 March 2004

I refer to our phone conversation of 29 September 2004.

This Branch recently lodged a copy of its financial statements and the audit report of your firm in the Industrial Registry.

I would appreciate your comments on the audit opinion which does not appear to address all the matters on which an opinion must be stated under section 276(4) of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*.

The opinion states:

In our opinion, the financial report of the CEPU Communications Division Postal and Telecommunications Division is in accordance with:

(a) the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and the Regulations under the Trade Unions Act, including:

(i) giving a true and fair view of the Union's financial position as at 31 March 2004 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and (ii) complying with Accounting Standards in Australia; and

(b) other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia.

In our opinion no person has contravened or failed to comply with section 273 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

Section 276(4)(a)(i) of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* requires an auditor to express an opinion on each of the matters set out in that provision. I note that your opinion does not appear to address those matters.

Your opinion appears to partially address the requirements of s276(4)(a)(ii)(A) by referring to the "financial position" of the union but omits to address the matters referred to in s276(4)(a)(ii)(B).

The opinion does not appear to address the matters referred to in s276(4)(b).

As you would appreciate, the expression of the auditor's opinion under s276(4)(a) and the statement under s276(4)(b) underpin the financial reporting process and provide members of the organisation with essential information about its financial management and the provision of information by its officers and employees.

I have inserted the text of s276 below.

I understand from our conversation that you believe you see no impediment to providing an opinion on these matters. WORKPLACE RELATIONS ACT 1996 - SECT 276 Powers and duties of auditors

(1) An auditor of an organisation shall inspect and audit the accounting records kept by the organisation in relation to each financial year and shall, within the prescribed period after the end of the year, make a report in relation to the year to the organisation.

(2) An auditor, or a person authorised by an auditor for the purposes of this subsection, is:

(a) entitled at all reasonable times to full and free access to all records and other documents of the organisation relating directly or indirectly to the receipt or payment of moneys, or to the acquisition, receipt, custody or disposal of assets, by the organisation; and

(b) entitled to seek from any officer or employee of the organisation such information and explanations as the auditor or authorised person wants for the purposes of the audit.

(3) Where an auditor authorises a person for the purposes of subsection (2), the auditor shall serve on the organisation a notification that sets out the name and address of the person.

(4) An auditor shall, in a report under this section in relation to a financial year, state:

(a) whether in the auditor's opinion:

(i) there were kept by the organisation in relation to the year satisfactory accounting records, including:

(A) records of the sources and nature of the income of the organisation (including income from members); and

(B) records of the nature and purposes of the expenditure of the organisation; and

(ii) the accounts and statements prepared under section 273 in relation to the year were properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of:

(A) the financial affairs of the organisation as at the end of the year; and

(B) the income and expenditure, and any surplus or deficit, of the organisation for the year; and

(b) whether all the information and explanations that, under subsection (2), officers or employees of the organisation were required to provide were provided;

and, in addition, the auditor shall state in the report particulars of any deficiency, failure or shortcoming in relation to a matter referred to in paragraph (a) or (b).

(5) If:

(a) an auditor, in the course of performing duties as auditor of an organisation, becomes aware that there has

(b) the auditor is of the opinion that the matter cannot be adequately dealt with by comment in a report;

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the auditor shall immediately report the matter, in writing, to a Registrar.

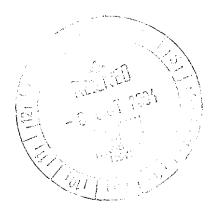

Scope

The financial report and board members' responsibility

The financial report comprises the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flows, accompanying notes to the financial statements, and the statement by The Trustee declaration for the Communications Electrical Plumbing Union ("CEPU") Communications Division Postal and Telecommunications Branch (the "**Union**") for the year ended 31 March 2004.
