



1. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES OF THE BRANCH COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:

NOTE 1.1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards including Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncement of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Fair Work (R.O.) Act 2009.

Excepting contributions, the financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis. It is based on historical costs and by the revaluation of selected non-current assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Branch in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

- (a) Income Tax
 - The Branch is exempt from Income Tax under S50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- (b) Plant and Equipment

Motor Vehicles & plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The carrying account is reviewed annually to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets.

- (c) Contributions
 - Contributions are accounted for on a cash basis, except for contributions paid in advance.
- (d) Employee Benefits

Provision for Employee Benefits in the form of Long Service Leave, Accrued Annual Leave etc, have been made at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

NOTE 1.2

In accordance with the requirements of the Fair Work (R.O.) Act 2009 the attention of members is drawn to the provision which reads as follows:

- (1) a member of a reporting unit, or Fair Work Australia, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) the application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) a reporting unit must comply with an application made under the Act.

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying Report being the Balance Sheet, Statement of Changes in Equity, Income Statement, Cash Flow Statement, and Notes to the Report of the Communications, Electrical & Plumbing Union, Communications Division, SA – NT Branch, for the year ended 31 March, 2010.

Branch Committee Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Branch Committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the Fair Work (R.O.) Act 2009. This responsibility includes establishing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies, and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's responsibility

The financial year of the South Australia & Northern Territory Communications Divisional Branch has recently ended. This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the obligation to prepare the reporting unit's financial documents and to lodge audited financial accounts and statements with Fair Work Australia within the prescribed time frame unless a 1 month extension or an application for a certificate of exemption under the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* ('the RO Act') is applied for and granted.

The documents you must lodge include:

(i) A general purpose financial report [see section 253(2)]; (ii) A Committee of Management statement (see the General Manager's Reporting Guidelines); (iii) An operating report [see section 254(2)]; (iv) An auditor's report [see sections 257(5) to 257(11)]; and (v) A certificate of the secretary or other designated officer signed after all the prescribed events have taken place [see section 268(c)].

I draw your particular attention to

- (a) s237 which requires you to prepare and lodge <u>a separate statement</u> providing the prescribed particulars of any loan, grant or donation made during the year which exceeds \$1,000;
- (b) s265(5) which requires you to publish or otherwise <u>provide your members with completed/signed</u> <u>copies</u> of the audited accounts, report and statements before final presentation and lodgment; and
- (c) s266 which requires you to <u>present the completed documents to an eligible meeting(s)</u> (either of the members or of the committee of management). Note that this meeting is distinct from any initial committee meeting convened to prepare, sign or otherwise approve pre-audited documents.
