## Re: Financial Return - year ending 31 March, 2008 - Schedule 1 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed reporting unit under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 31 March, 2008.

The legislative scheme set out in Chapter 8, Part 3 of the RAO Schedule is directed at ensuring that a registered organisation or a branch of such an organisation discharges obligations of accountability to its members in relation to its financial affairs through proper and regular disclosure of financial information. The various steps of the financial reporting requirements must be carried out within the time-scales prescribed by the legislation so as to ensure the relevance of the financial information provided to the members. A copy of the time-scale provisions is attached for your information.

Now that the financial year has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. We recommend you and your accountant/auditor refer to the following documents on the Commission's website where a new site has been created dealing with:

- RAO Fact sheets These Fact Sheets explain the requirements of the RAO Schedule many of them deal with financial reporting matters.
- Financial Reporting Sample Documents Sample Committee of Management's Statement, Designated Officer's Certificate and checklists for illustrative purposes.
- Registrar's Reporting Guidelines The GPFR must comply with these Guidelines. Please note that the Guidelines set out requirements that are *in addition* to those required by the Australian Accounting Standards.
- RAO Schedule and RAO Regulations

Lodgment of Financial Statements and Accounts – New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch - Schedule 1 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule) – for year ended 31 March 2008 (FR2008/208)

The RAO Schedule requires the New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia to lodge audited financial accounts and statements with the Registry within 6 months and 14 days of the end of its financial year.

The Registry has no record of lodgment of the Branch's financial documents for the financial year ended on 31 March 2008. The Branch was granted a one month extension on 1 October 2008, and accordingly the documents should have been lodged by mid-to late November 2008

I draw your attention to the civil penalty provisions of the RAO Schedule (see section 305(2)(ze)) which allow the Federal Court to impose a pecuniary penalty upon a person or organisation where the requirements of section 268 have not been met. You should also be aware of the provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 9 of the RAO Schedule which set out general duties of officers and employees of organisations and their branches in relation to financial management. In order to avoid exposure to a civil (pecuniary) penalty, you should lodge the documents without further delay.

If you are not in a position to lodge the outstanding documents immediately, I respectfully request that you advise in writing by 30 January 2009 when you anticipate lodging a copy of the full report in the Industrial Registry.

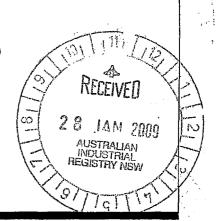

Branch Committee of Management report in accordance with section 254 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 for the year ended 31 March 2008.

## **Principal Activities**

The principal activity of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing & Allied Services Union of Australia, Communications Division, New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch was that of a registered Trade Union.

The principal activities of the Union during the past year fell into the following categories:

- Promoting the interests of Telecommunications and Postal workers.
- Implementing the decisions of the Divisional Branch Committee of Management, Divisional Executive, Divisional Conference and National Council.
- Implementing the union's organising & industrial agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice to members, assistance to members on planning and resourcing campaigns, bargaining, training and development of shop stewards and officials.
- Support and representation of individual member grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters.
- Lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to Telstra workers.
- Management of the Unions financial and membership systems.

There have been no significant changes to the way the Union has carried out these activities during the last financial year.

## **Operating Result**

The operating deficit of the Branch for the financial year was \$621,420, after incurring an impairment loss of \$434,969 in respect of the Branch's Strata Property.

## Significant Changes

No significant changes in the Union's state of affairs occurred during the financial year. No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Union, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Union in future financial years.

## **Rights of Members**

Subject to the Rule 11 of the Union's rules and Section 174 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, members of the Union have the right to resign from membership by providing written notice addressed to and delivered to the Secretary of the Union. In accordance with section174(1) of the Workplace Relations Act a member of an organisation may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a person designated for the purpose in the rules of the organisation or a branch of the organisation.

## Superannuation Office Holders

Branch Secretary, Ian McCarthy is a trustee of the Telstra Superannuation Scheme.

#### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS), other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations and the Workplace Relations Act, 1996.

Compliance with Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ensures that the financial report comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) except for:

- Segment reporting because AASB 114 "Segment Reporting" does not apply to notfor-profit organisations.
- Impairment of assets under AASB 136 "Impairment of assets"

### **BASIS OF PREPARATION**

The financial report is for the entity Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal Plumbing & Allied Services Union of Australia, Communications Division, New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch as an individual entity. The Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information Postal Plumbing & Allied Services Union of Australia is an organisation registered under the Workplace Relations Act, 1996. The New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch is a Branch of the registered organisation. In accordance with the Act the Union is a body corporate and has perpetual succession. By virtue of this method of incorporation, the Union and the Branch are not subject to the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical costs. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The financial report has been prepared on a going concern basis, which contemplates continuity of normal operating activities and the realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities in the normal course of the branch's operations.

The continuing operations of the branch and the ability to pay its debts in the normal course is dependant upon the branch successfully realising the sale of its strata property, being units 2, 3 and 4 at 741 George Street, Sydney, and upon the success of future operations. On 8 September 2008 the branch exchanged contracts for the sale of its strata property for \$1,600,000 (plus GST). At that time a deposit of \$160,000 was received. The balance of \$1,440,000 (plus GST) is due for payment on settlement date, being 7 November 2008.

If the branch is unable to continue as a going concern, it may be required to realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities other than in the normal course of business and at amounts different from those stated in the financial report.

#### 1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the branch in the preparation of the financial statements. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

#### (a) Revenue

Members' Dues are accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

Directors Fees that any union official receives as a result of their position at the union are accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

#### (b) Income Tax

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the branch is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50 - 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and any impairment in value.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the branch commencing from the time the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Office Furniture and Equipment

5% - 33%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

Gains and losses on disposals are calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the asset's carrying amount and are included in the income statement in the year that the item is derecognised.

The branch does not depreciate the strata title units as it contributes to a sinking fund for use by the strata plan in keeping the structure of the property intact.

#### Impairment (d)

The carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised in the income statement for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of the asset's fair value and value in use. For the purpose of assessing value in use, this represents depreciated current replacement cost, as the Union is a not-for profit organisation.

#### (e) **Employee Benefits**

Provision is made for the Branch's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs.

Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. In the case of Long Service Leave this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting future cash flows.

Contributions are made by the Branch to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

#### (f) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables on the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

#### Accounting Standards Issued But Not Yet Effective (g)

There have been no accounting standards issued which will impact the financial report in future periods and which are not yet effective.

#### (h) Non-current assets held for sale

Non-current assets are classified as held for sale if their carrying amount will be recovered principally through a sale transaction rather than through continuing use. They are measured at the lower of their carrying amount and fair value less costs to sell.

### **ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS** 2.

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

#### Critical accounting estimates and assumptions (a)

The branch makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates by definition seldom equal the related actual results. There are no estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets and liabilities.

#### Critical judgments in applying the Branch's accounting principles (b)

There are no critical judgements that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the assets and liabilities.

## 10. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

## (a) General objectives, policies and processes

The branch is exposed to risks that arise from its use of financial instruments. This note describes the branch's objectives, policies and processes for managing those risks and the methods used to measure them.

There have been no substantive changes in the branch's exposure to financial instrument risk, its objectives, policies and processes for managing those risks or the methods used to measure them from previous periods unless otherwise stated in this note.

The branch's financial instruments consist mainly of deposits with banks, trade receivables and payables. The main risks the branch is exposed to through its financial instruments are interest rate risk (see section (e) below), liquidity risk and credit risk.

The branch committee of management has overall responsibility for the determination of the branch's risk management objectives and policies and whilst retaining ultimate responsibility for them, the branch committee of management make investment decisions after considering appropriate advice.

## (b) Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk that the other party to a financial instrument will fail to discharge their obligation resulting in the branch incurring a financial loss. This usually occurs when debtors fail to settle their obligations owing to the branch.

There is no concentration of credit risk with respect to current and non-current receivables.

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or other security, at balance date to recognised financial assets is the carrying amount of those assets, net of any provision for doubtful debts, as disclosed below:

## (c) Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the branch may encounter difficulties raising funds to meet commitments associated with financial instruments.

The branch is exposed to this risk; as at 31 March 2008 it had \$64,092 (\$114,789 - 2007) of cash and cash equivalents to meet these obligations as they fail due. Financial liabilities at 31 March 2008 totalled \$421,452 (\$317,478 - 2007). As disclosed at Note 6(a) to the accounts on 8 September 2008 the branch exchanged contracts for the sale of its strata property for \$1,600,000 (plus GST). At that time a deposit of \$160,000 was received. The balance of \$1,440,000 (plus GST) is due for payment on settlement date, being 7 November 2008.

## (d) Market Risk

Market risk arises from the use of interest bearing, tradable financial instruments. It is the risk that the fair value or future cashflows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in interest rates (interest rate risk) or other market factors (other price risk).

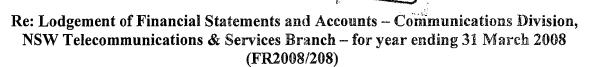
