I acknowledge receipt of the financial report for the year ended 31 March 2016 for the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Communications Division - New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch (the reporting unit). The financial report was lodged with the Fair Work Commission (FWC) on 26 July 2016. I also acknowledge receipt on 10 August 2016 of the Auditor's Report and the supplementary information you provided on 11 August 2016 in relation to the provision of the full report to members.

The financial report has now been filed.

The financial report was filed based on a primary review. This involved confirming that the financial reporting timelines required under s.253, s.265, s.266 and s.268 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (RO Act) have been satisfied, all documents required under s.268 of the RO Act were lodged and that various disclosure requirements under the Australian Accounting Standards, RO Act and reporting guidelines have been complied with. A primary review does not examine all disclosure requirements.

Please note that the financial report for the year ending 31 March 2017 may be subject to an advanced compliance review.

I make the following comment to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged. The FWC will confirm that the concern has been addressed prior to filing next year's report.

Copies of full report to be provided to members

Under subsection 265(1)(a) of the RO Act a reporting unit must provide free of charge to its members a full report. A full report consists of:

- (i) a copy of the report of the auditor in relation to the inspection and audit of the financial records of the reporting unit in relation to a financial year; and
- (ii) a copy of the general purpose financial report to which the report relates; and
- (iii) a copy of the operating report to which the report relates.

Melbourne VIC 3001 Email: orgs@fwc.gov.au Subsection 253(2) states that the general purpose financial report must consist of:

- (a) financial statement containing
 - (i) a profit and loss statement, or other operating statement; and
 - (ii) a balance sheet; and
 - (iii) a statement of cash flows; and
 - (iv) any other statements required by the Australian Accounting Standards; and
- (b) notes to the financial statements containing:
 - (i) notes required by the Australian Accounting Standards; and
 - (ii) information required by the reporting guidelines (see section 255); and
- (c) any other reports or statements required by the reporting guidelines (see section 255) (including a Committee of Management Statement).

Under subsection 265(5)(b) of the RO Act, where the full report is presented to a Committee of Management meeting, the full report must be provided to members within 5 months of the end of the financial year. The Designated Officer's Certificate lodged with the FWC on 26 July 2016 states that the full report was provided to members on 1 July 2016, and presented to a Committee of Management meeting on 21 July 2016.

Although the date the report was provided to members is within 5 months of the end of the financial year, the Committee of Management Statement, Operating Report and Auditor's Report were not signed until the 21 July 2016 which is after the date the report was provided to members. As identified above, these statements/reports are required documents of a full report. It would therefore appear that members have not been provided with a copy of the full report.

On 11 August 2016, you confirmed that members were provided with the full report on 10 August 2016. In future years the Designated Officer's Certificate must reflect the date that the full report was provided to members.

Please note that subsections 265(1) and 265(5) are both civil penalty provisions.

Reporting Requirements

On the FWC website a number of factsheets in relation to the financial reporting process and associated timelines are available. The most recent copy of the Reporting Guidelines and a model set of financial statements can also be found. The FWC recommends reporting units use this model as it will assist in ensuring compliance with the RO Act, the s.253 Reporting Guidelines and the Australian Accounting Standards. Access to this information may be obtained via this link.



OPERATING REPORT

Branch Committee of Management report in accordance with section 254 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 for the year ended 31 March 2016.

Principal Activities

The principal activity of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing & Allied Services Union of Australia, Communications Division, New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch was that of a registered Trade Union.

The principal activities of the Union during the past year fell into the following categories:

- · Promoting the interests of Telecommunications and Postal workers.
- Implementing the decisions of the Divisional Branch Committee of Management, Divisional Executive, Divisional Conference and National Council.
- Implementing the union's organising & industrial agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice to members, assistance to members on planning and resourcing campaigns, bargaining, training and development of shop stewards and officials.
- Support and representation of individual member grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters.
- Lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to Telstra workers.
- Management of the Unions financial and membership systems.

There have been no significant changes to the way the Union has carried out these activities during the last financial year.

Operating Result

The operating loss of the Branch for the financial year was \$62,242 (2015: \$97,012).

Significant Changes

No significant changes in the Union's state of affairs occurred during the financial year.

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Union, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Union in future financial years.

Rights of Members

Subject to the Rule 11 of the Union's rules and Section 174(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, members of the Union have the right to resign from membership by providing written notice addressed to and delivered to the Secretary of the Union. In accordance with section174(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 a member of an organisation may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a person designated for the purpose in the rules of the organisation or a branch of the organisation. There was no change to this rule during the year.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is for the New South Wales Branch of the Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing & Allied Services Union of Australia as an individual entity. The Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information Postal Plumbing & Allied Services Union of Australia is an organisation registered under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. The New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch is a Branch of the registered organisation. In accordance with the Act the Union is a body corporate and has perpetual succession. By virtue of this method of incorporation, the Union and the Branch are not subject to the Corporations Act 2001. The Branch is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing financial statements under Australian Accounting Standards.

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The reporting guidelines made under section 255 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act) require all reporting units to apply the Tier 1 reporting requirements as per Australian Accounting Standard AASB 1053 Application for Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the branch in the preparation of the financial statements. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Revenue

Members' Dues are accounted for on an accrual basis, and recorded in the year to which it relates, and to the extent that the amounts due are considered receivable.

Interest income is accounted for on an accruals basis.

(b) Income Tax

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the branch is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50 - 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(c) Furniture and Equipment

Furniture and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and any impairment in value.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to the branch commencing from the time the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Furniture and Equipment

5% - 33%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance date.

Gains and losses on disposals are calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the asset's carrying amount and are included in the income statement in the year that the item is derecognised.

(d) Impairment

The carrying amounts of furniture and equipment are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised in the income statement for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of the asset's fair value and value in use. For the purpose of assessing value in use, this represents depreciated current replacement cost, as the Union is a not-for-profit organisation.

(e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Branch's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs.

Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. In the case of Long Service Leave this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting future cash flows.

Contributions are made by the Branch to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits.

Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

(g) Investments

All investments and other financial assets are initially stated at cost, being the fair value of consideration given plus acquisition costs. Purchases and sales of investments are recognised on trade date, which is the date on which the entity commits to purchase, or sell the asset. Accounting policies for each category of investments and other financial assets subsequent to initial recognition are set out below.

Available-for-sale financial assets -

Investments which are classified as available for sale are measured at fair value. Unrealised gains or losses on these investments are recognised directly to equity in the Available-for-Sale Investments Reserve until the investment is sold or until the investment is determined to be impaired, at which time the cumulative gain or loss previously reported for that asset is included in the statement of comprehensive income.

(h) Leasehold on premises

Leases where the lessor retains substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the net asset are classified as operating leases. Payments made under operating leases (net of incentives received from the lessor) are charged to profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the period of the lease.

(i) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables on the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

(j) Accounting Standards Issued But Not Yet Effective

There have been no accounting standards issued which will impact the financial report in future periods and which are not yet effective.

(k) Accounting Standards

There are no new accounting standards which were adopted during the financial year.

(l) Going concern

The Branch is not reliant on the financial support of any other reporting units to ensure they can continue on a going concern basis.

(m) Administration

The Branch has not been administered by another entity.

(n) Going concern support

The Union has not agreed to provide financial support to any other reporting units to ensure they can continue on a going concern basis.

(o) Amalgamations and Restructures

There have been no amalgamations or restructures in the financial year and previous financial year. No assets or liabilities have been acquired as a result of any amalgamations or restructures.

2. ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

(a) Critical accounting estimates and assumptions

The branch makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates by definition seldom equal the related actual results. There are no estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities.

(b) Critical judgments in applying the Branch's accounting principles

There are no critical judgements that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities.

Re: Lodgement of Financial Report - [FR2016/60]
Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act)

The financial year of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia-Communications Division - New South Wales Telecommunications and Services Branch (the reporting unit) ended on 31 March 2016.

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the obligation to prepare and lodge the financial report for the reporting unit by the due date under s.268 of the RO Act, that being within 14 days after the meeting referred to in s.266 of the RO Act. The latest possible date for lodgement available to your reporting unit is 15 October 2016 subject to compliance with the requirements of ss. 266 and 268.

The RO Act sets out a particular chronological order in which financial documents and statements must be prepared, audited, provided to members and presented to a meeting. For your assistance, the attached *Timeline/Planner* summarises these requirements.

Fact sheets and guidance notes in relation to financial reporting under the RO Act are provided on the Fair Work Commission website. This includes a model set of financial statements which have been developed by the FWC. It is not obligatory to use this model but it is a useful resource to ensure compliance with the RO Act, the Reporting Guidelines and the Australian Accounting Standards. The model statement, Reporting Guidelines and other resources can be accessed through our website under Financial Reporting in the Compliance and Governance section.

Also you are reminded of the obligation to prepare and lodge a statement showing the relevant particulars in relation to each loan, grant or donation of an amount exceeding \$1,000 for the reporting unit during its financial year. Section 237 requires this statement to be lodged with the FWC within 90 days of the end of the reporting unit's financial year, that is on or before 29 June 2016. A sample statement of loans, grants or donations is available at <u>sample documents</u>.

It is requested that the financial report and any Statement of Loans, Grant or Donations be lodged electronically by emailing orgs@fwc.gov.au.

It should be noted that s.268 is a civil penalty provision. Failure to lodge a financial report may result in legal proceedings being issued with the possibility of a pecuniary penalty (up to \$54,000 for a body corporate and \$10,800 for an individual per contravention) being imposed upon your organisation and/or an officer whose conduct led to the contravention.

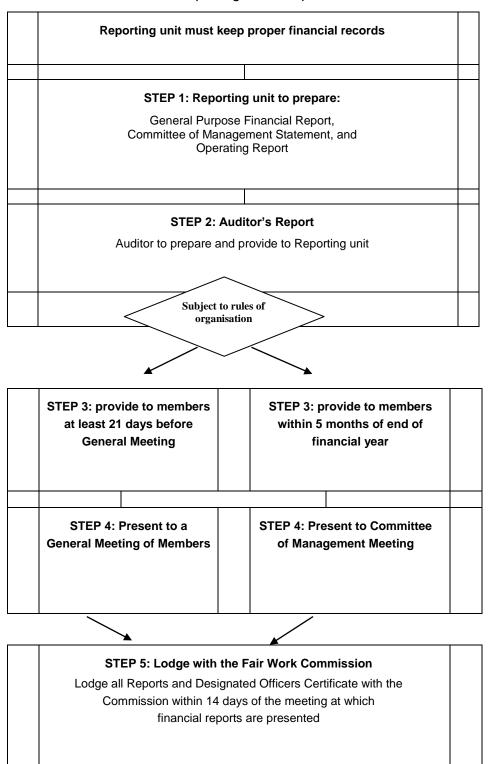
