Re: Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia-Communications Division-South Australian & Northern Territory Telecommunications & Services Branch - Outstanding Financial Documents - Workplace Relations Act 1996

The Accounts and Audit Part of Schedule 1 of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* requires, as a general rule, that the audited financial statements of a reporting unit of a registered organisation, be lodged in the Industrial Registry within 6 months and 14 days from the end of its financial year.

To date, the Registry has no record of lodgement of the financial reports of the above named reporting unit for the year ended 31 March, 2006. For details of these provisions and organisations' financial reporting obligations please refer to the Registry's earlier correspondence.

In particular there is no record of lodgement of copies of:

- the general purpose financial report;
- · the auditor's report; or
- the operating report.

These three reports are referred to as the "full report".

Section 268 of the RAO Schedule¹ requires that a copy of the full report be lodged in the Registry within 14 days (or such longer period a Registrar allows) after the full report is presented to a general meeting of members (or to a committee of management meeting if the rules make provision consistent with s266(3)).

Section 266 (1) requires that the full report be presented to the meeting within 6 months of the end of the financial year. Therefore, lodgement of the documents in the Registry was required by **15 October, 2006.**

Section 305(2)(ze) of the RAO Schedule is a civil penalty provision. It provides that a failure to meet the requirements of s268 is a contravention of that civil penalty provision. The Federal Court may on application of the Industrial Registrar impose a pecuniary penalty on the person or organisation whose conduct contravened the civil penalty provision.

I also draw your attention to the provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 9 of the RAO Schedule which set out the general duties of officers and employees of organisations and their branches in relation to financial management.

In the absence of lodgement of a copy of the full report, I request you state in writing by 8 November, 2006:

- whether the auditor has audited the general purpose financial report and if so, the date on which the auditor signed the audit report
- · whether the committee of management has prepared the operating report
- whether the full report has been provided to members, and if so, when
- whether the full report provided to the members has been presented to a general or committee of management meeting, and if so, when
- when a copy of the full report will be lodged in the Industrial Registry.

The full report when lodged must be accompanied by a certificate of the secretary or other authorised officer that the documents lodged are copies of the documents provided to members and presented to the general or committee of management meeting in accordance with s266.

Financial Return - year ending 31 March 2006

Our records show your organisation's financial year ended recently. This letter outlines some of the things you must do to meet your financial reporting obligations and when you have to do them. For simplicity, we will call the documents you have to lodge with us your *financial return*.

New legislation

This letter is intended as guide to the law applicable on the date of this letter and should not be used as a substitute for legal or accounting advice. We only summarise some of the reporting requirements in this letter. More detailed information is at the end of this letter.

The legislation has changed since your last return. In May 2003 the Industrial Registrar wrote to all organisations forwarding a number of facts sheets outlining the major changes made by Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 ('RAO' ¹). While the immediate changes affected the rules and elections in organisations, the changes affecting financial returns involve a longer lead time.

The key differences under the new legislation affecting financial returns are:

- a reduced financial reporting cycle (now maximum periods of 5 or 6 months depending on internal arrangements of organisation)
- a greater emphasis given to Australian Accounting Standards
- the introduction of a new report, known as an Operating Report (broadly similar in concept to a Director's Report under the corporations legislation)
- extensions of time are limited to one month
- restructured penalty provisions involving more extensive use of Civil Penalties
- the introduction of the Industrial Registrar's Reporting Guidelines
- organisations and their branches to report according to their financial structures, known as 'reporting units'.

We recommend you discuss the new requirements with your accountant or auditor.

Reporting Unit

One of the new concepts of the RAO legislation is that reporting entities are known as "reporting units". Where an organisation is **not** divided into branches the reporting unit is the whole of the organisation. Where an organisation **is** divided into branches each branch will be a reporting unit unless the Industrial Registrar has determined a division of the organisation into reporting units on an alternative basis. We can discuss this with you if you need more information.

For simplicity, we will refer to your organisation as a reporting unit in this letter.

Industrial Registrar's Guidelines

The Industrial Registrar's reporting guidelines set out certain disclosure requirements in addition to those prescribed by Australian Accounting Standards having in mind the nature of organisations registered under the Workplace Relations Act.

The disclosure requirements prescribed by the reporting guidelines are directed towards providing members of the reporting unit with information to enable them to gauge the performance of the committee of management and other holders of office in relation to the financial management of the reporting unit. In addition, the reporting guidelines seek to improve the quality of information available to users of the financial report about the reporting unit's economic support of, or economic dependency on, other reporting units of the organisation.

Timeline Planner and Checklist

We have attached a <u>Timeline/Planner</u> (*Attachment A*) to help you **plan** your financial return and carry out all the necessary steps. We have also attached a <u>Document Checklist</u> (*Attachment B*) to **check** your documents before lodging them in the Registry. Both documents are abbreviated summaries of the relevant provisions of the RAO Schedule, RAO Regulations and the Industrial Registrar's Reporting Guidelines.

In the following section we describe some of the documents your reporting unit must prepare and the sequence of their preparation and completion.

Three Reports

Your reporting unit must prepare two reports <u>as soon as practicable</u> after its financial year, which, together with the Auditor's Report, comprise the reporting unit's financial return.

1. **General Purpose Financial Report** - this must comply with the Australian Accounting Standards and the Industrial Registrar's Reporting Guidelines. The GPFR consists of:

Financial Statements containing:

- a profit and loss statement, or other operating statement; and
- a balance sheet; and
- · a statement of cash flows; and
- any other statements required by the Australian Accounting Standards; and

Notes to the Financial Statements containing:

- · notes required by the Australian Accounting Standards; and
- information required by the Industrial Registrar's Reporting Guidelines under section 255); and

Committee of Management Statement as required by the Registrar's Reporting Guidelines (a sample certificate for illustrative purposes is at Attachment C)

2. **Operating Report** - this report includes a review of your <u>reporting unit's</u> principal activities for the year and other specified information.

Your reporting unit must appoint an auditor to audit the GPFR and to provide:

3. an Auditor's Report.

First Meeting (Committee of Management)

For simplicity, we will call the meeting at which the committee of management first considers the GPFR the first meeting. At the first meeting your committee, if satisfied that all is in order, will resolve to express its opinion on the GPFR and complete a Committee of Management Statement.

The Auditor

After the first meeting, the auditor takes the GPFR and the Committee of Management Statement and prepares a report on the GPFR. In practice, your auditor may have already completed most of his or her examination of your accounts. The auditor may only be waiting on the Committee to pass the required resolution and make the Statement before signing the report the same day.

Informing Your Members

Your <u>reporting unit</u> must provide free of charge to the general membership, copies of the GPFR, the Operating Report and the Auditor's Report. RAO calls these the "full report". Under certain circumstances, your <u>reporting unit</u> can provide a more limited *concise report*.

The reporting unit can meet its obligation to provide copies of the full or concise report to members by publishing the report in a journal that is available to the members free of charge.

A reporting unit may meet this obligation in whole or in part by publication of the report in a journal published on a web site on the Internet dependent on:

- a. the extent of the accessibility of the members of the reporting unit to the Internet; and
- b. that the members are notified by the reporting unit in the usual manner in which it communicates with its members that the report has been so published at a specified Internet address.

The report must be provided within 5 or 6 months from the end of the financial year, depending on the internal arrangements of the organisation for the presentation of its financial reports.

The Second Meeting - if it is a General Meeting of Members

After providing the full report to members it must be presented to a general meeting of members. For simplicity this is referred to as the *second meeting*.

Your reporting unit must always allow a minimum of 21 days for members to receive the full report before presenting it to a general meeting of members (s265(5)). The purpose of the interval and the second meeting is to enable the members to have time to consider the report and, if they wish, to attend the second meeting to discuss it.

If the rules of the organisation permit a general meeting to be a series of meetings held at different locations, the full report may be presented to such a series of meetings. In this case the 'date' of the general meeting is taken to be the date of the last meeting in the series (see s266(2)).

The Second Meeting - if it is a Committee of Management Meeting

If the rules of your organisation contain a provision that allows up to 5% of members to demand a general meeting to be held consider the report (see s266(3)), it is permissible to present the report directly to a Committee of Management meeting.

Lodge full report within 14 days of meeting

You must lodge a copy of the full report and any concise report in the Industrial Registry within 14 days of the second meeting. For your convenience you are encouraged to lodge the material electronically (see eFiling Tab at www.airc.gov.au).

The Secretary (or another officer appropriately authorised under the rules of the organisation) must *certify* that the full report is a copy of the one provided to members <u>and</u> presented to the second meeting and provide the date of the meeting (a sample certification for illustrative purposes is at *Attachment D*).

When we receive your return we will check that it includes the information you must provide your members and that you have provided it to them correctly.

Complying with time limits

This letter has outlined some of the steps in preparing and lodging your return. Many of the steps must be completed within fixed time limits.

Failure to complete them in time could make your reporting unit or its officers liable to financial or "civil penalties".

Extensions of Time

We appreciate that sometimes circumstances beyond your reporting unit's control may delay completion of a financial return. If you believe your reporting unit is going to be unable to meet a time limit tell us as soon as you know. We can advise you if the step is one for which you may apply under RAO to the Industrial Registrar for extra time to complete. The maximum extra time allowed can be no more than one month.

Reduced Reporting Requirements

If your reporting unit meets certain conditions, some of these reporting requirements can be reduced. Such conditions might be where the annual income of the reporting unit (where the reporting unit is the whole of the organisation) is less than \$100,000, or where the reporting unit has no financial affairs in the financial year, or where the financial affairs of the reporting unit are encompassed by the financial affairs of its counterpart State industrial association.

We encourage you to contact the Registry on (02) 8374 6666 as early as possible if you believe preparation or lodgment of your return will be delayed or if you have any queries. We can offer you advice on procedure but we cannot give you legal or accounting advice.

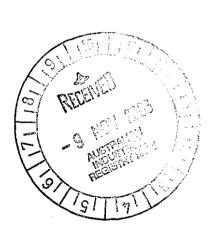

This Operating Report records the activities of the Branch Committee of Management for the SOUTH AUSTRALIAN / NORTHERN TERRITORY TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND SERVICES BRANCH of the CEPU Communications Division for the financial year ended 31st March, 2006; the results of those activities; plus any significant changes in the nature of those activities during the year.

1. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES OF THE BRANCH COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:

The Principal activities of the Branch Committee of Management during the preceding year fell into the following categories:-

- Implementation of National, Divisional and Branch decisions;
- Industrial support, including representation of individual members' grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters, initiating Union elections as provided for in the Rules of the Union, within the scope of any statutory or legal obligations:
- The administration of Awards, the certification of Industrial Agreements, and the variation of Awards;
- The administration of the Branch Membership;
- The administration of the Branch's financial affairs;
- Monthly Newsletters and other communications to members, the media, and the broader community.

2. CHANGES IN THE BRANCH'S FINANCIAL AFFAIRS:

There were no significant changes in the Branch's financial affairs during the year.

3. PRINCIPAL FACTORS AFFECTING FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE WERE:

The principal factors affecting financial performance were :-

- * increased income from leasing the Hurtle Square premises surplus to the Union's requirement;
- * increased costs from :-
- office alterations prior to leasing &
- visiting and training of members particularly in country areas as a result of changes in workplace legislation.

4. RIGHT OF MEMBERS TO RESIGN:

All Branch members have the right to resign from the Union in accordance with *Rule 32* of the Communications Division Rules (*and Section 174 of the workplace relations act*), namely by providing written notice addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary via Post, Facsimile, e-Mail, or in person.

5. DIRECTORSHIPS OF SUPERANNUATION FUNDS:

NOTE 1.1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES.

NOTE 1.1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Financial Accounting and Reporting Standards, applicable in Australia and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 as amended.

Excepting for contributions received in advance, the financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis, is based on historical costs, and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Excepting for contributions received in advance, contributions are accounted for on a cash basis.

(d) Provision for Employee Benefits in the form of Long Service Leave, Accrued Annual Leave, etc., have been made for the nominal value of estimated accrued entitlements of all Employees on the basis of their terms of Employment.

NOTE 1.2 INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OF REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsection (1), (2) and (3) of sections 272, which read as follows:

T&S Branch Secretary, John Lee, welcomed the Branch Auditor, Ms. Christine Wellington to the meeting and advised that Christine would be available to answer any questions regarding the Branch finances. particularly in relation to the Annual Financial Statements and Auditors' Report.

John referred those present to the 'signed copy' of the document which had been presented to Branch Committee of Management members at the monthly meeting on Wednesday, 9th August, 2006, and further circulated to members by means of posting the complete document on the SA/NT Branch Web Site, plus a direct mail out to all work sites throughout South Australia and Northern Territory.

John introduced the Report by indicating that the Branch finished the Financial Year with a deficit of \$32.097 (page 13). However, when one took into account the 'once off' costs resulting from the internal building alterations of some \$21,425 (page 13) and the payment to the P&T Branch of \$20,000 (page 13) towards the employment costs of Geny Kandelaars for the twelve month period, (which have now ceased due to Gerry's retirement), the Branch was in a reasonably sound financial position.

Of other note was the expense incurred on the Telstra E.B.A. campaign during the first half of 2005, which involved the Salaries, Travelling Allowance, Air fairs and Vehicle expenses for not only John, but also half of Graham Thomas' costs as they jointly covered most work locations from Mount Gambier to Darwin,

Branch President, Gerry Kandelaars, also highlighted the cash reserves in the Branch 'Special Fund' of some \$230,185 (page 17).

John concluded his report by reminding Committee members that the Branch will now have an additional income of about \$26,000 per year from leasing office space to our three tenants. This will assist in jointly paying for an additional Admin resource for one day per week.

Prior to opening the meeting for general questions, John recalled the two questions asked by Mick Giles at the August meeting in relation to why the Bank Interest earned on the Special Fund was not accounted for in the Special Fund amount (page 17), but identified separately under "Interest Received" (page 14). Also Mick sought an explanation as to why the amount shown against "Members Contributions" (page 12) differed from the amount shown against "Receipts from Members" (page 14). Christine explained that the difference is due to the subtraction of the amounts held against "Contributions in Advance" (page 18) for both 2005 and 2006 audits.

Helen Macmullen enquired what constituted the "Other Income" of \$33,113 (page 12). John advised that the P&T Branch contributed 50% of Tania Shearer's employment costs through the year, and also 50% of Ian Reynolds' employment costs over the last two months whilst relieving in the office. This was by far the bulk of this item.

Christine Wellington then gave a report on the financial operation of the Branch over the last twelve months which generated several general questions and comments.

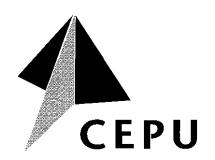
