- 5. lodgment of copies of the financial documents in the Industrial Registry under cover of a certificate by you in compliance with section 280(1) such certificate should confirm that the documents so lodged are copies of the documents presented to the meeting referred to in step 4 above the type of meeting and the date when it was held should be specified

Note 1 - Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirement of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical cost and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

As a result of applying the revised Accounting Standard AASB 1018 Statement of Financial Performance, revised AASB 1034 Financial Report Presentation and Disclosures and AASB 1040 Statement of Financial Position for the first time, a number of comparative amounts were represented or reclassified to ensure comparability with the current reporting period.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

- (a) Income Tax

 No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- (b) Property, Plant and Equipment

 Each class of property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Union to ensure it is not excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line or a reducing balance basis over the useful lives of the assets to the Union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (cont.)

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (cont.)

(c) Leases

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(d) Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the Union's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount.

Annual leave has been calculated for all employees and officials on the basis of their terms of employment.

(e) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

(f) Revenue

Revenue from membership subscriptions is recognised on an accrual basis.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Going Concern

The committee of management of the Union believe that the Union is a going concern as at the date of this financial report. The committee of management believe that as a result of the continual support of their members, union officials and staff, the union will be able to meet its liabilities when they fall due. The committee of management have also undertaken an extensive cost-cutting program.

1. Your covering letter states that "an abridged report...was circulated to members." However there is no indication as to when the summary was circulated. Section 279 sets out the requirements for providing copies of a summary to members.

I therefore seek your confirmation of when the summary was circulated to members.

2. I note the qualification by the Auditor on page 17 of the Auditor's Report that there is an inherent uncertainty as to whether the Union can continue as a going concern. This was contained in the previous Auditor's Report.

A Registrar is required under section 280(2) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 ('the Act') to investigate any deficiency, failure or shortcoming set out in the report of an auditor. However, an investigation is not required if the Registrar is satisfied that the deficiency, failure or shortcoming is trivial or will be remedied in the following financial year. In your letter dated 4 July 2002 in relation to the previous year's financial statements, you advised that you expected to be "in the black" by late 2002.

I therefore seek your comments in relation to this qualification.

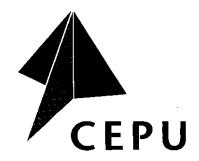
