

2008/2009 Annual Report

Presented by Branch Secretary - Bryan Watkins

Continuing on with the trend of the past few years the financial year 2008/09 has again been a year of considerable activity and change for the Union.

As reported last year we now operate as the one Branch in WA, this continues to deliver cost savings and efficiencies within the Branch office which has allowed us to continue to spend more time in work places. It is our intention over the next twelve months to increase this activity to make even more direct contact with members.

Telecommunications

As members in Telstra would know discussions for a new EA unfortunately stumbled very early in the piece and for some considerable length of time a variety of industrial action was undertaken to try and place pressure on Telstra management.

The bulk of this action was undertaken by a small but decisive group of members here in WA and in other parts of the country, fortunately we are now back at the table with Telstra and we would all hope that a quick resolution to all outstanding issues is reached as soon as possible.

Thanks are extended to those who made contributions to the Member Welfare Fund; your generous assistance to your fellow workmates was much appreciated


Activity continues within the other areas of telecommunications outside of Telstra, i.e. Silcar, Stratos and Broadcasting.

Postal

Whilst another twelve months have gone by it is still disappointing to report that we appear to be no nearer to resolving a number of outstanding issues in EBA7.

The main areas of concern still are as follows:

- 1. Dispute Resolution Process;
- 2. Employment Issues Full time Vs Part time;
- 3. Future Delivery Design;



- 4. Retail Conversions/Franchising etc;
- 5. The use of Facility Nominated Doctors; and
- 6. The protection of shift penalties.

Also we are now dealing with Post's decision to close down Call Centres in all states except Victoria and Queensland, in WA this means 55 people are now looking for redeployment or new jobs at a time when there are very few vacancies within Post and a shrinking job market outside

Over the next few weeks we will be visiting as many outlets as possible to bring members up to date with what is currently happening with the EBA and the future direction recommended by your union.

Branch Membership

Branch membership levels have fallen slightly over the past twelve months, though most of this reduction happened early in the financial year when members were still leaving Post and Telstra to seek other employment as a result of the opportunities provided by what finished up as the end of the economic boom.

Branch Finances

The Branch Finances once again this year are stable, we have reported a loss for the financial year but this was due mainly to the paying of a redundancy to one of our administration staff.

We are still seeing the cost benefits of operating as one Branch but like all organisations we will be closing watching our expenditure over the next year or so but are determined that this would not see a reduction in our organising program.

Acknowledgements

I would like to once again thank Branch President Gary Carson for his efforts and hard work over the past twelve months, his knowledge of telecommunications is second to none and his assistance in the Postal area has been invaluable.

I would also like to thank Assistant Secretary Barry McVee for his efforts and hard work over the past twelve months, with his assistance we have been able to develop and maintain a comprehensive organising program along with other improvements within the Branch.


And not to forget the contribution of the Branch Committee of Management, all of them have given of their own time over the past twelve months and have helped us maintain a strong and active Branch.

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
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

The financial accounts of the Union have been audited in accordance with the provisions of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996 and the following concise financial report is provided for members in accordance with Section 272 (5) of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996 and prepared in accordance with Section 265 of the RAO Schedule.

Certificates required to be given under the Acts by the Secretary and the Committee of Management have been completed in accordance with the provisions of the Acts and contain no qualifications.

Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of Section 272(5) of the RAO Schedule, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Sections 272(1) to Section 272(3) of the RAO Schedule, which reads as, follows:

- (1) A member of the branch, or a Registrar, may apply to the branch for specified prescribed information in relation to the branch to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the branch.
- (3) The branch must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

The discussion and analysis is provided to assist members in understanding the concise financial report. The discussion and analysis is based on the Communications Electrical Plumbing Union, Communications Division WA Branch's financial statements and the information contained in the concise financial report has been derived from the full 2009 Financial Report of the Communications Electrical Plumbing Union, Communications Division WA Branch.

Significant Event

Branch Amalgamation

On 1 April 2007 the CEPU Communications Division Postal and Telecommunications Branch and the CEPU Communications Division Telecommunications and Services Branch amalgamated to become CEPU Communications Division WA Branch. No comparative figures are provided due to the consolidation.

INCOME STATEMENT:

Key points to note are:

- Membership numbers have remained comparable over the year, causing membership contribution income to remain constant in membership fees for certain members.
- Overall the Branch made a net loss of \$76,160 for the year which is largely due to redundancy expenses of approximately \$75,000.
- The union has continued to operate in the state of Western Australia throughout the whole of the 2008/09 financial year.

BALANCE SHEET:

Assets

Cash at Bank of \$1,082,503 is held on hand and in term deposits generating approximately 5%.

Liabilities

 Current provisions relate to employee entitlements which is disclosed on the balance sheet for \$284,357.

Equity

Total accumulated funds at year end have increased from last year, with a closing balance of \$1.810,145.

CASHFLOW STATEMENT:

Cash flows from operating activities:

 Cash at the end of the year is \$65,724 lower than last year, mainly due to an increase in outflows arising from payments to suppliers and employees.

This Operating Report records the activities of the Branch Committee of Management for the Western Australian Branch of the CEPU Communications Division for the financial year ended 31 March 2009; the results of those activities; plus any significant changes in the nature of those activities during the year.

1 Principal Activities of the Branch Committee of Management:

The Principal activities of the Branch Committee of Management during the preceding year fell into the following categories:-

- Implementation of National, Divisional and Branch decision;
- Industrial support, including representation of individual members' grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters, initiating Union elections as provided for in the rules of the Union, within the scope of any statutory or legal obligations;
- The administration of Awards, the certification of Industrial Agreements, and the variation of Awards;
- The administration of the Branch Membership;
- The administration of the Branch's financial affairs;
- Communications to members, the media, and the broader community.

2. Right of Members to Resign:

All Branch members have the right to resign from the Union in accordance with Rule 32 of the Communications Division Rules (and section 174 of the Workplace Relations act), namely by providing written notice addressed and delivered to the Branch Secretary via Post, Facsimile, e-Mail or in person.

3. Directorships of Superannuation Funds:

To the best of our knowledge and belief no Officer of the Branch is, by virtue of their Office on the Branch Committee of Management of the CEPU Communications Division (Western Australia)



NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report of Communications Electrical Plumbing Union Communications Division WA (CEPU) complies with all Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (A-IFRS) in their entirety.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis. It is based on the historical costs and does not take into account changing money values with the exception of freehold land and building which is accounted for at fair value.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements are appropriate for the needs of the members.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

a. Branch Amalgamation

On 1 April 2007 the CEPU Communications Division Postal and Telecommunications Branch and the CEPU Communications Division Telecommunications and Services Branch amalgamated to become CEPU Communications Division WA Branch.

b. Income tax

The CEPU Communications Division WA and the grants and funds administered by the council are exempt from tax by virtue of section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

c. Grant funding

Grants unexpended at the end of the year are shown as unexpended grants in the liability section of the balance sheet.

d. Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

e. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

f. Cash and cash equivalents

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, the organisation considers cash to include cash on hand, at banks or financial institutions and on deposit.

g. Trade and other receivables

All trade and other receivables are recognised at the amounts receivable, as they are due for settlement no more than 30 days. Collectability of debtors is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts, which are known to be uncollectible.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2009

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont)

h. Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on a periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation for buildings.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured at a cost basis less depreciation.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the organisation to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciation amount of all fixed assets is calculated using the straight line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets to the organisation commencing from the time the asset is ready for use

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Organisation prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. These amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

j. Employee entitlements

Provision is made for the organisation's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year, together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries and annual leave, which will be settled after one year have been measured at their nominal amount.

Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Provision for employee entitlements have been measured to include salary on-costs including superannuation, payroll tax and workers compensation.

k. Superannuation

Contributions are made by the organisation to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.
