

Pursuant to Sections 182(1) and 189 of *The Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, the Communications Electrical and Plumbing Union (Electrical Division) requests that the Fair Work Commission arrange an election for Executive Officers of our Electrical Division. The election relates to the positions of Divisional President, Divisional Vice-Presidents and other Divisional Branch representatives on the Divisional Executive (CEPU Rules Section B rule 15, specifically rules 15.5, 15.14.4).
