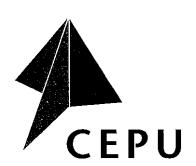

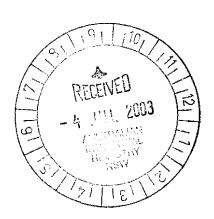

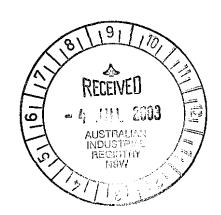

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2001

#### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) and the Workplace Relations Act, 1996. The financial statements have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the accounts.

### (a) Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated on the straight line basis in order to write the assets off over their useful life.

The depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Asset	Depreciation rate
Buildings	2%
Furniture and fittings	15 - 33%
Motor vehicles	15%

### (b) Employee entitlements

Provision for employee benefits in the form of accrued annual leave, long service leave and retiring allowance have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

In the case of long service leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is considered that this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting estimated future cash flows.

### (c) Income tax

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as Industrial Trade Unions are exempt from Income Tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

### (d) Branch property loans

By agreement of the branches who sponsored the divisional office loan, a moratorium continued to be in place in relation to repayments made on the principle amount of the branch property loans for the year ended 31 December 2001.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2001

### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

#### (e) Investments

Investments are brought to account at cost or valuation. Provisions are made where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount of the asset.

### (f) Revenue

Revenue from branches in the form of sustentation fees is recognised in the financial period to which the membership applies.

Interest income is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the applicable interest rate on the financial statements.

## (g) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of Goods and Services Tax (GST). Receivable and payable are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from or payable to, the Australian Taxation Office is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet. Cash flows in the Statement of Cash Flows are included on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities that are recoverable from, or payable to, the Australian Taxation Office are classified as operating cash flows.

## NOTE 2: INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274 which reads as follows:-

- 1. A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- 2. An organisation shall, on application made under Sub-Section (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
- 3. A Registrar may only make an application under Sub-Section (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received of an application made at the request of the member.

#### **NOTE 15: FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS**

The accounting policies and methods adopted in relation to each class of financial asset and liability are disclosed in Note 1. The Union does not participate in the use of derivative financial instruments as all financial assets and liabilities are denominated in Australian dollars.

#### a Credit risk

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or any other security, at balance date to recognise financial assets is the carrying amount, net of any provision for doubtful debts, as disclosed in the balance sheet and notes to the financial statements.

The Union does not have any material risk exposure to any single debtor or group of debtors under financial instruments entered by the Union.

#### b Net fair values

The net fair values of debtors, loans and other amounts are determined by discounting the cash flows, at the market interest rates of similar securities, to their present values.

The carrying amount of all financial assets and liabilities does not exceed their net fair values.

#### c Interest rate risk

The Union's exposure to interest rate risk, which is the risk that a financial instrument's value will fluctuate as a result of changes in market interest rates and the effect weighted average interest rates on these financial assets and liabilities is as follows:

#### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

To the members of the Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical Division.

### Scope

We have audited the financial statements comprising the Income and Expenditure Account, Balance Sheet, Statement of Cash Flows and Notes to the financial statements of the Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical Division, for the year ended 31 December 2001. The Union's Committee of Management and Accounting Officer are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial accounts and the information they contain. We have conducted an independent audit of these financial accounts in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Union.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial accounts are free of material misstatement. Our procedures, included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial accounts, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial accounts are presented fairly in accordance with applicable accounting standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) and statutory requirements so as to present a view of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic Energy Information, Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical Division which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position and the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

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### **Audit Opinion**

In our opinion:

- satisfactory accounting records were kept by the Union in respect of the year ended 31 December 2001, including:
  - i records of the sources and nature of the income of the Union (including income from members); and
  - ii records of the nature and purposes of expenditure of the Union; and
- the financial statements and other statements required to be prepared under sec 273 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 have been properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of:
  - i the financial affairs of the Union as at 31 December 2001; and
  - ii the income and expenditure, and surplus, of the Union for the year ended on that date; and
- the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements.

We have obtained all the information and explanations we required from the officers and employees of the Union, which were necessary for the purposes of our audit, and there were no deficiencies, failures or shortcomings in relation to the matters referred to above.
