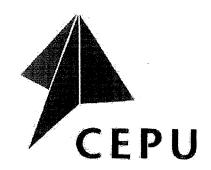

I write in reply to your letter received regarding the above dated 2 October 2009.

It is the case that the financial statements were presented to members on the 6th of August 2009 and subsequently to a meeting of the CEPU Electrical, Energy and Services Division, Divisional Council (the committee) on the 28th of August 2009 as a true and correct account of the financial statements of the Union for the year ending 31st December 2008 as unsigned documents.

Due to a substantial delay this year (and also last year) in receiving the completed statements from the Unions auditors, and the Union wanting to distribute the statements to members and the committee in a timely fashion from the end of year date of the 31st December 2008, they have been released in the unsigned format. They were however distributed as a true and correct copy of the Unions financial statements.

It is an oversight of the Unions auditors that the received documents were unsigned. The documents have been signed and dated at the later date of the 1st of September 2009, rather than the date they were received, which is of course after their distribution date also.

I am aware that this is at odds with the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (The Act) and apologise for this discrepancy. I would also like to assure you that the Union will in the future try to ensure its compliance with The Act in relation to our reporting requirements and will also be following up this matter with our auditors.

for year ending 31 December 2008 (FR2008/548)

I refer to the abovementioned financial statements and accounts which were lodged with Fair Work Australia electronically on 24 September 2009, and received by post on 25 September 2009.

Before filing the documents I draw your attention to the following matter.

There appears to be an incongruity in that the Auditor's report is dated 1 September 2009, and the Operating Report and Committee of Management statement are both dated 28 August 2009. However in your Certificate by Prescribed Designated Officer you state that the report was provided to members on 6 August 2009.

Section 257(9) of the Fair Work (Registered Organizations) Act 2009, like its predecessor legislation, clearly contemplates that the Auditor's report will be signed before being provided to the reporting entity, and by implication when read with s265(5), before the report is provided to members. Unfortunately the later dating of the Auditor's report (and the other mentioned documents) suggests these were not completed by 6 August and thus not provided, at least in signed and completed form, to them. Moreover, the Act has always contemplated that the meeting held in accordance with s266 will be a different and subsequent meeting to any which is held to resolve and sign the financial and other statements making up the report.

A perusal of the recent past financial returns lodged by the Division suggests that, for the most part, the Division has lodged documents dated in accordance with the sequence contemplated by the legislation: specifically, the Auditor's report and other statements have generally been dated prior to the date certified on the Secretary's certificate as the date on or by which members were provided – by whatever means - the report.

I would appreciate if you could advise the circumstances why the auditor's report and other statements lodged for the 2008 return show dates later than 6 August 2009, and whether you foresee any difficulties in ensuring that in future years, the relevant documents will be signed (and dated) before being provided to the members.

If you consider that you are in a position to lodge an amended Certificate by Prescribed Designated Officer certifying different or later dates for (a) having provided copies to members and/or (b) presenting the documents to a meeting under s266, any amended Certificate will be added to the file.

I will defer filing the documents pending your advice.

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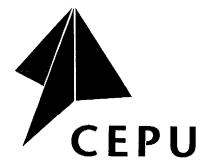

This Operating Report covers the activities of the Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia – Electrical, Energy and Services Division, for the financial year ended 31 December 2008, the results of those activities and any significant changes in the nature of those activities during the year.

- Principle Activities of the Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia – Electrical, Energy and Services Division
 - Implementation of the decisions of the Divisional Executive and Divisional Council.
 - Implementation of the union's organising agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice on particular industry or organising projects, the training and development of officials and assistance to branches.
 - Industrial support including representation of member grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters, pursuing relevant changes to the conditions of eligibility rules of the Division, and responding to other unions' rules applications where they impact on membership of the CEPU.
 - The administration of federal awards, the variation of awards and making applications to vary federal awards of the division.
 - National media and communications to members and to the broader community via media releases in support of campaigns, video development, and targeted publications, including the national magazine ETU News.
 - Developing nation policies on skills training, licensing, education of members and industrial relations law reforms.

The Divisional office has consulted with the ACTU on the development of policy on wages, redundancy and family leave. The national office has participated in ACTU policy committees in OH&S, VET, union education and superannuation.

The Divisional office has also been involved in lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to CEPU members, eg in submission to government inquiries, skilled career paths, skill shortages, quality and accreditation and workforce issues, occupational health and safety and electrical licensing.

2. The Electrical, Energy and Services Division's Financial Affairs

There were no significant changes to the Divisional office financial affairs over the financial reporting year. The majority of income to the Divisional Fund was via 12.5% of fees paid by members. Additional income was received from interest, reimbursements and fees recovered from union officers.

3. Right of Members to Resign.

All members of the Union have the right to resign from the Union in accordance with the rules of the Union, (and Section 174 of the Workplace Relations Act); namely, by providing written notice addressed and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Branch.

4. Superannuation Trustees

Peter Tighe is an officer of the Divisional Office and is a Trustee and Member of the Committee of the CONNECT Superannuation Fund and the C+Bus Superannuation Fund.

5. Membership of the Union

There were 61,000 members of the union as at 31 December 2008

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs. It does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Union is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected not cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected not cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their estimated useful lives to the union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Properties held for investment purposes are not subject to a depreciation charge. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(c) Lenses

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the logal ownership, are transferred to the union are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the union will obtain ownership of the asset, or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Lease incentives received under operating leases are recognised as a liability. Lease payments received reduced the liability.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Union's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on-costs. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the union to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(e) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, each includes cash on hand and at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months and net of bank overdrafts.

(f) Revenue

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Other revenue is recognised when the right to receive the revenue has been established.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

(h) Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.
