I refer to the above financial statements and accounts which were lodged by the Divisional office with the Fair Work Commission on 19 March 2013.

The documents have been filed. However in the interests of achieving greater transparency and consistency in reporting I wish to clarify several legislative requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 with which future reports for the Divisional office should comply.

Auditor's Report - legislative framework

The correct legislative and financial reporting framework for reports for the Divisional office is the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. For the purposes of its obligations as a reporting unit within a federally-registered industrial organisation, its committee of management is responsible for the preparation of a financial report that is consistent with that Act (the 'RO' Act').¹ References to the Corporations Act 2001 in the Audit report, within that context, are therefore incorrect.

Auditor's Report - wording of opinion

Sub-section 257(8) of the RO Act provides that the "form and content of the auditor's report must be in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards". Australian Auditing Standard (ASA) 700 requires that the auditor's opinion should be in accordance with the applicable financial reporting framework.² Sub-section 257(5) of the RO Act provides that "an auditor must, in his or her report, state whether.....the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with.... (a) the Australian Accounting Standards; (b) any other requirements imposed by this Part".3

For the avoidance of doubt, the Audit opinion wording should in future reflect the form "is presented (or presents) fairly" etc.

Auditor qualifications

Section 256 of the RO Act provides for the appointment of approved auditors, as defined in regulation (4) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009.⁴ Paragraph A37 of ASA 700 explains that "*in certain jurisdictions the auditor may be required to declare....the fact that the auditor or firm, as appropriate, has been recognised by the appropriate licensing authority.*"

The RO Act does not explicitly require such a declaration but the Fair Work Commission considers it a reasonable implication of the combined reading of section 256 and regulation 4 that it must be satisfied that all auditors meet the definition of "approved" and the inclusion of the relevant details under the signatures of auditors would appear to be a suitable means to be so satisfied from year to year.

Prescribed items - individual disclosures

Paragraphs 10 and 11 of the Reporting Guidelines issued by the General Manager set out various items for disclosure in the Notes or Profit and Loss Statement, and it has been brought to my attention that these items must not be separately provided under a Disclaimer, which has been the practice for reports for the Division in recent years. These items include some of those that appear as additional financial data on page 21, such as "donations"⁵ and "meetings & conferences"⁶.

Other items that do not appear to have been disclosed if they applied as in previous years⁷ include "legal costs and other expenses"⁸, "employee benefits paid to holders of office"⁹, "employee benefits paid to employees (other than holders of office)"¹⁰.

Moreover, the income item "Sustentation fees", appearing in the additional data and at Note 7, should also identify the "amount and the name in respect of each…reporting unit" from which it receives the contribution.¹¹

I thank you for your attention to these matters in future reports. The Fair Work Commission is currently preparing an updated version of the Reporting Guidelines, first issued in 2003, which will be consistent with the requirements I have explained above. This Operating Report covers the activities of the Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia – Electrical, Energy and Services Division, for the financial year ended 31 December 2011, the results of those activities and any significant changes in the nature of those activities during the year.

- 1. Principle Activities of the Communications Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia – Electrical, Energy and Services Division
- Implementation of the decisions of the Divisional Executive and Divisional Council.
- Implementation of the union's organising agenda, including direct assistance and strategic advice on particular industry or organising projects, the training and development of officials and assistance to branches.
- Industrial support including representation of member grievances, advice on legal and legislative matters, pursuing relevant changes to the conditions of eligibility rules of the Division, and responding to other unions' rules applications where they impact on membership of the CEPU.
- The administration of federal awards, the variation of awards and making applications to vary federal awards of the division. Co-ordination of National Enterprises negotiations on behalf of branches.
- National media and communications to members and to the broader community via media releases in support of campaigns, video development, and targeted publications, including the national magazine ETU National.
- Developing national policies and representing the division nationally on skills training, licensing, education of members and industrial relations law reforms.

The Divisional office has consulted with the ACTU on the development of policy on wages, redundancy and family leave. The national office has participated in ACTU policy committees in OH&S, VET, union education and superannuation.

The Divisional office has also been involved in lobbying and negotiations with different levels of Government and key industry organisations around issues of importance to CEPU members, e.g. in submission to government inquiries, skilled career paths, skill shortages, quality and accreditation and workforce issues, occupational health and safety and electrical licensing.

2. The Electrical, Energy and Services Division's Financial Affairs

There were no significant changes to the Divisional office financial affairs over the financial reporting year. The majority of income to the Divisional Fund was via 12.5% of fees paid by members. Additional income was received from interest, reimbursements and fees recovered from directorships of union officers.

3. Right of Members to Resign

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 31 December 2011

The financial statements cover Communication Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical, Energy and Services Division as an individual entity. Communication Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical, Energy and Services Division is a registered trade union domiciled in Australia.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations and the Fair Work (registered organisation) Act 2009.

Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

(b) Comparative figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Where the Union has retrospectively applied an accounting policy, made a retrospective restatement or reclassifies items in its financial statements, an additional statement of financial position as at the beginning of the earliest comparative period will be disclosed.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the asset.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

(c) Property, plant and equipment continued the end of each reporting period.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less which are convertible to a known amount of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Union has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Union during the reporting period which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(g) Income tax

The Union is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(h) Revenue and other income

The Union recognises revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of Communication Electrical Electronic Energy Information Postal Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical, Energy and Services Division's activities as discussed below.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. Any consideration deferred is treated as the provision of finance and is discounted at a rate of interest that is generally accepted in the market for similar arrangements. The difference between the amount initially recognised and the amount ultimately received is interest revenue.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies continued

(h) Revenue and other income continued

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(i) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

I refer to your letter dated 24 July 2012 in response to my letter dated 16 July 2012.

I note your explanation as to why the above financial statements and accounts have not yet been lodged and your advice as to the steps so far completed in relation to various legislative requirements. I note that the rules of the Division provide for the presentation of the financial report to the annual meeting of the Divisional Council which you have advised has been delayed due to an unresolved court injunction and that until this is resolved you cannot advise when presentation at Divisional Conference and lodgement will occur.

I note your advice that "the members have been provided with a *draft* report including the committee of management statement, the auditor's report and the operating report". I am not sure whether this means that the members have been provided with signed or with unsigned copies of these documents. If the former, then it would appear that the only action remaining to complete is presentation to the Divisional Conference in accordance with section 266. If the latter, then arrangements will still have to be made to provide and otherwise make available to the membership the signed version of the financial report documents. Confirmation of this will have to be provided on the Certificate under section 268 that accompanies the financial documents when they are lodged.

I do not require you to provide an unsigned copy of the documents at this stage but I would ask you to advise me of any progress in the situation by 31 August 2012 if lodgement of the financial report has not occurred during the intervening period.

However, due to the delay in Divisional Conference, the financial accounts have yet to be finalised.

Further, in answer to your questions in your letter of 16 July 2012:

- i) A committee of management statement and operating report has been prepared;
- ii) The auditor has audited the financial report and signed the audit report;
- iii) Members have been provided with a *draft* report including the committee of management statement, the auditor's report and the operating report;
- iv) The full report has not been presented to a second meeting;
- v) We cannot predict when a copy of the full report will be lodged with FWA until the court injunction has been resolved and a new date for Divisional Conference has been set.

Please advise if you are happy for us to delay lodgement of the financial accounts until the Divisional Conference has ensued, or whether an unsigned copy of the financial accounts would be sufficient for the time being.

If the outstanding documents cannot be lodged in the next 21 days, please advise in writing by 7 August 2012 an explanation why not and whether: (i) a committee of management statement and operating report have been prepared; (ii) the auditor has audited the financial report and, if so, when the auditor signed the audit report; (iii) members have been provided with the full report including the committee of management statement, the auditor's report and the operating report; (iv) the full report has also been presented to a second meeting and (v) when you expect a copy of the full report will be lodged in this office.

I draw your attention to the civil penalty provisions of the FW(RO) Act [see section 305(2)(ze)] which allow the Federal Court to impose a pecuniary penalty upon a person or organisation where accounts are not lodged in accordance with section 268. You should also be aware of the provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 9 of the FW(RO) Act which set out general duties of officers and employees of organisations and their branches in relation to financial management.
