Re: Lodgement of Financial Accounts and Statements – CEPU, Electrical, Energy and Services Division, Tasmanian Divisional Branch – for year ending 31 December 2011 (FR2011/2922)

I refer to the above financial statements and accounts which were lodged with Fair Work Australia on 12 June 2012 and to the amended Secretary's Certificate lodged today, 12 July 2012.

The documents have been filed. However I draw your attention to the following.

- The report did not include the Notice required by section 272(5) of the *Fair Work* (*Registered Organisations*) *Act 2009.* This Notice consists of the text of sub-sections 272(1), 272(2) and 272(3). This should be included in next year's report.
- (2) It is not clear from the balance of \$346,743 for "Employee Entitlements" on the Income Statement whether this amount includes any portion paid to elected office-holders separately from that paid to employees. Paragraphs 11(g) and 11(h) of the General Manager's Reporting Guidelines require that, where applicable, separate balances for both categories of salaries must be disclosed either in the Notes or on the face of the Profit and Loss (Income) Statement. In future reports this distinction should be clear from the description of the balance paid as employee entitlements.
- (3) The balance for "Donations" on the Income Statement is \$7,550. If this amount included any individual donation exceeding \$1,000, the relevant particulars required by section 237 should be set out in a separate statement signed and lodged under that section. This statement, where applicable, should be lodged within 90 days of the end of the financial year, that is, by 31 March. I attach the relevant extract from the Act and a proforma you may use if it is required.

Re: Lodgement of Financial Accounts and Statements – CEPU, Tasmanian Electrical Divisional Branch – for year ending 31 December 2011 (FR2011/2922)

I refer to the above financial statements and accounts which were lodged with Fair Work Australia on 12 June 2012 and to your Auditor's Report, dated 9 April 2012.

The documents have been filed. However I would like to draw your attention to the question of the wording to be used in the Audit Opinion. Your Audit Opinion reads, in part, as follows:-

"In my opinion, the general purpose financial report......presents fairly in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia....."

I note this wording was also used in the previous year's report. This wording does not make any reference to the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. Subsection 257(5) of this Act provides, as follows:-

"An auditor must, in his or her report, state whether in the auditor's opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with any of the following that apply in relation to the reporting unit:

- the Australian Accounting Standards; (a)
- (b) any other requirements imposed by this Part" (underline my emphasis)

Fair Work Australia's view is that (b) means that an auditor must opine whether the report presents fairly "in accordance with the requirements imposed by Part 3 (of Chapter 8 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009"). Unfortunately, the phrase "other mandatory professional reporting requirements" does not explicitly signify this, but is rather suggestive of professional requirements of a different nature (e.g. possibly ASAs or APES, etc).

Accordingly I would ask that you add similar or suitable wording to your existing phrasing in future Audit opinion paragraphs in order to make it clear on the face that the financial reports also present fairly in accordance with the Act.

Notes to the Financial Statements Year Ended 31 December 2011

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Workplace Relations Act 1996. except for AASB 124.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in a financial report containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions to which they apply. Compliance with Australian Accounting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes also comply with International Financial Reporting Standards. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of this financial report are presented below. They have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

(b) Comparatives

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation for buildings. It is the policy of the economic entity to have an independent valuation every three years, with annual appraisals being made by the committee of management.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement.

Any accumulated depreciation at the date of revaluation is eliminated against the gross carrying amount of the asset and the net amount is restated to the revalued amount of the asset.

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

(d) Depreciation

Buildings are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. All other fixed assets excluding freehold land are depreciated on a diminishing value basis over their useful life to the union commencing from the time the asset is held readv for use.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other shortterm highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(g) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the union's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

(h) Revenue and Other Income

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST

2 Internal arrangements between Electrical and Plumbing Divisions

The state Electrical Division attends to membership and administration functions of the state Plumbing Division. All plumbing member contributions are collected, processed and recorded by the Electrical Division and figures for both divisions are included in this financial report. Contributions from plumbing division members for 2011 totalled \$98,916. All administration costs relate to both divisions.
