An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.



NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER 2003.

NOTE 1 – STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are general purpose financial reports that have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) and Section 273 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996. The financial statements have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account the changing money values or, except were stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these statements:

(A) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as trade unions are exempt from income tax under section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(B) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(C) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are included at cost or at independent valuation. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings but excluding freehold land and strata titles are depreciable over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.
