Further to our discussion on Friday, 6 September 2013, I have examined the report for the year ended 31 December 2012 and have identified the following balance categories that do not appear to have been separately disclosed in accordance with the Reporting Guidelines [RGs] applicable for the year. They include:

- 1. Sustentation or "contribution towards the administrative expenses of (another) reporting unit, including the amount and name of that reporting unit" [see RG 11(b)]
- 2. Fees for "affiliation to any political party, any federation......having an interest in industrial matters" [see RG 11(d)]
- 3. Amounts "transferred to a fund or account kept for a specific purpose by the reporting unit" or an amount "withdrawn from such a fund or account" including the name of the fund or account [see RG 12(a)]
- 4. The name of the other reporting unit "where an item is disclosed as a receivable or payable.....as a result of one or more transactions and or other past events with another reporting unit of the organisation". [see RG 13]
- 5. "The name and balance of each fund or account operated....required by the rules of the organisation" [see RG 14(g)]

[NB - Note 2 lists cash and cash equivalent investment balances for three funds described in abbreviated form but does not list comparative 2011 figures for them, raising a question whether this guideline has been satisfied].

6. The separate disclosure of the name of the other reporting unit concerned where it "is the source of a cash inflow or the application of a cash outflow" [see RG 15]

In addition, I have identified the following balance categories that do not appear to have been separately disclosed in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard (AASB) 1054:

7. "fees to each auditor......separately for (a) the audit of the financial statements; and (b) all other services performed during the reporting period(and) shall describe the nature of other services"

[NB – I note that in the Operating Report it is reported that a service agreement was entered into with the ETU NSW during the year. I am unsure whether this is connected with the omission of an audit expense disclosure]

By comparison, in the financial report for the year ended 31 Dec 2011:

- item 1 was disclosed as "Sustentation fees" and "National Council Funding" at Note 6 "National Council costs" on page 10. [*NB. The name "National Council" was taken at that time to stand for the name of the Division, rather than the National Office, but if this was incorrect, then any ambiguity should be clarified in future reports*]
- item 2 was disclosed as "Affiliation fees" in the Statement of Comprehensive income on page 7. [NB. It was clear from the figure that this did not incorporate sustentation and other categories]
- item 3 was disclosed in separate financial statements for each of the three funds on pages 14-19.
- Item 4 receivables by name (incl. the related party of the ETUNSW) were disclosed at Notes 8 and 9 on page 11; item 4 payables were disclosed by aggregate amount but not by name at Note 11 on page 11.
- Item 5 appears to have been disclosed at Note 7 on page 10 and in the financial statements for the three funds on pages 14-19.
- Item 6 appears to be covered by the disclosure at Note 6 [see above]
- Item 7 was taken to have been disclosed as "Auditor's remuneration" at Note 3 on page 10. [NB. For 2012, for the purposes of AASB 1054, this would have had to be either described more precisely as "audit fees" or else, where it

The presentation of these categories in the 2012 report differs from that of previous years' reports. At face value, it appears to me these reporting guidelines have not been met but in case I have overlooked any relevant information, I would invite the Branch's comments and advice on the matter. The service agreement with the state-registered union may be relevant and if so, an explanation of what it covers in greater detail would assist. If the Branch agrees that there have been omissions in some or all of the above categories, I think a supplementary summary of the relevant disclosures added to the already published financial statements would serve to complete the disclosure requirements for the benefit of members.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 31 December 2012

The financial statements cover C.E.P.U. Electrical Division (NSW Branch) as an individual entity. C.E.P.U. Electrical Division (NSW Branch) is registered trade union domiciled in Australia.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations and the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.*

Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

(b) Comparative figures

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the asset.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, is depreciated on a reducing balance basis over the asset's useful life commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less which are convertible to a known amount of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

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Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 31 December 2012

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies continued

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Union has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Union during the reporting period which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(g) Income tax

The Union is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(h) Revenue and other income

The Union recognises revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of C.E.P.U. Electrical Division (NSW Branch)'s activities as discussed below.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. Any consideration deferred is treated as the provision of finance and is discounted at a rate of interest that is generally accepted in the market for similar arrangements. The difference between the amount initially recognised and the amount ultimately received is interest revenue.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(i) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

I refer to your letter of application for an extension of time of one month to provide copies of the full report to members under subsection 265(5) of the Act, which was received on 18 June 2013.

I note the Branch's intention to present, in accordance with its rules, the full report to a second meeting of the committee of management after providing time for comment, and the circumstances you have advised preventing the Branch from providing copies within the 5 months prescribed by paragraph 265(5)(b).

I also note that 18 June 2013 was, at the date of the application, the proposed date for provision of the report to the members.

I also note that 8 July 2013 is the proposed date for presentation of the report to a second meeting of the committee of management.

I should point out that a careful reading of subsection 265(5) means that though an extension of time to provide a report to members will automatically mean an extension of time to present the report to a general meeting of members due to the requirement of a 21 day period, an extension of time to provide the report to members does not necessarily represent an extension of time to present the report to a meeting of the committee of management. The 21 day period required by paragraph 265(5)(a) to elapse between providing a report to members and holding a general meeting of members is not required to elapse prior to holding a second meeting of the committee of management. This means that, practical arrangements aside, there may be nothing to prevent the Branch from presenting the report to its committee on or before 30 June 2013 and thus comply with the ordinary timeframe prescribed by subsection 266(1).

The Branch should keep this in mind in the event of any circumstances in the future where it considers it necessary to apply for an extension of time in relation to either or both of these key financial reporting events.

I accept the Branch's advice and have taken into account the provisional dates already scheduled in Annexure A. I consider that I may, pursuant to subsection 265(5), extend the period in which copies of the report may be provided to members and the period during which the

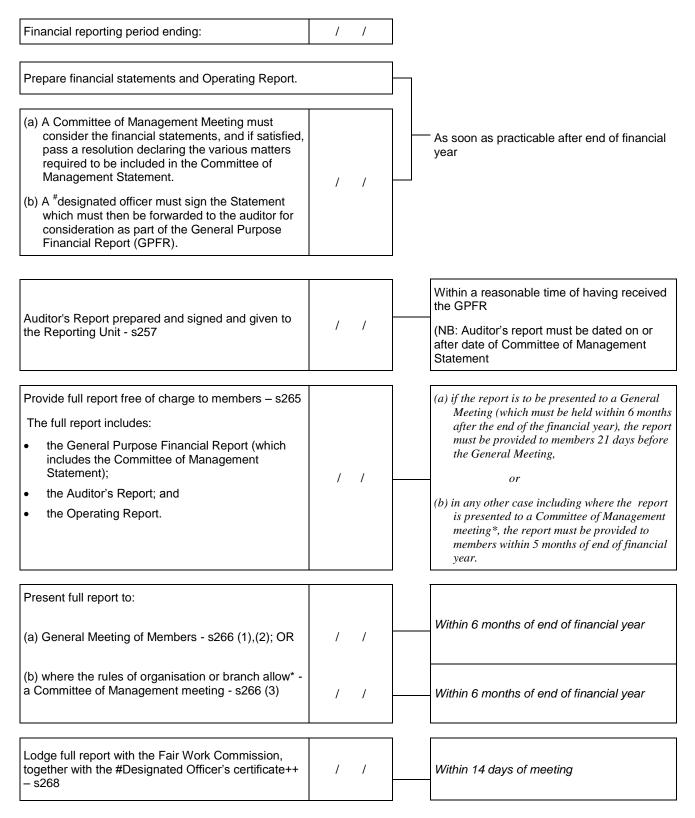
