Receipt is acknowledged of the above financial statements which were lodged in the Registry on 4 July 2003. I draw your attention to two matters.

Firstly, your Secretary's certificate covers the financial statements of each of the Branches of the Division with general references to the relevant sections of the Workplace Relations Act 1996. I take this opportunity to remind you that if any individual grant or donation exceeded \$1,000, a separate statement giving the relevant particulars must be lodged pursuant to s269 of the Act.





NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 2001

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES -

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements. The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report.

(a) Current Investments

Investments are brought to account at cost or at the Executive Committee's valuation. The carrying amount of investments is reviewed annually by the Executive to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amounts of these investments.

The recoverable amount is assessed from the share's current market value or the underlying net assets in the particular company. The expected net cash flows from investments have not been discounted to their present value in determining the recoverable amounts. Dividends are brought to account in the Statement of Financial Performance when received.

(b) Fixed Assets

Freehold Land & Buildings are brought to account at cost.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a diminishing value basis over their useful lives to the Electrical Trades Union of Australia, Southern States Branch, commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Depreciation rates are reviewed annually to ensure that they remain appropriate for the assets to which they apply, having regard to their current and envisaged future economic value.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

The carrying amount of fixed assets is reviewed annually by the executive committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets.

The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows, which will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining the recoverable amounts.

(c) Income Tax

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from Income Tax under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936.

(d) Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year except where stated.

(f) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

(g) Revenue

Members are invoiced in November of each year for the following financial year. The receipts received in advance are brought to account as prepaid contributions and not as revenue for the current financial year.

Member Contributions are recognised in the respective financial year.

Interest revenue is recognised when received.

(h) Inventory

Inventories consist of clothing, stationery and promotional items, and are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a specific identification basis and include direct costs and appropriate overheads if any.
