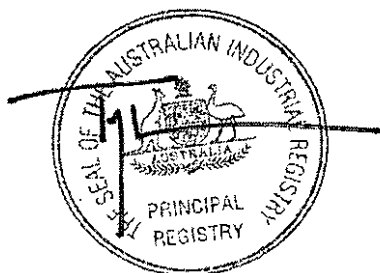



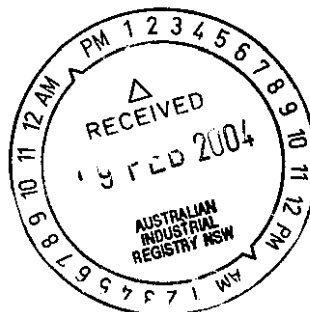

**Election (E2004/117)**

I refer to your letter of 30 January 2004 received in the WA Registry of the Australian Commission on 3 February 2004.

I note your organisation wishes an election to be conducted for certain positions described in your letter, following an order from the President of the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission.

While I appreciate your organisation is seeking to comply with this order and its state rules, an organisation registered under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 seeking to conduct an election must lodge with the Registrar certain information (formally called "prescribed information"). If, after considering that information the Registrar is satisfied an election is required to be held under the federal organisation's rules, he may arrange for the Australian Electoral Commission to conduct it.

Your letter does not contain all the prescribed information. In his letter to you of 14 July 2003 in relation to an earlier election request, the Deputy Industrial Registrar indicated that future requests should conform to the requirements of regulation 138 of the RAO Regulations (the regulations) and provided an example of such a request. I enclose a copy of that letter and the enclosure.

You will note that the regulations also require the prescribed information contain a statement that the information is being lodged under subsection 189(1) of the RAO Schedule.

You may find it useful to use the sample Notice and Statement set out in the enclosure as a "checklist" for the purposes of providing the prescribed information.

I appreciate your organisation wishes to conduct an election at its meeting on 18 February 2004. Once you lodge the prescribed information, I will endeavour to place the matter before the Registrar for his consideration.

The Registrar is making arrangements, under subsection 189(3) of Schedule 1B of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*, with the Electoral Commissioner for the conduct of the subject election by a member of staff of the Australian Electoral Commission, who will contact you in the near future about the election.

The Registrar expressed concern over the information provided in your request for an election. You are advised that the Registrar will insist that your requests in future meet the requirements of reg 138 of the RAO Regulations. For your convenience, I have attached a sample request as attached to RAO Fact Sheet 4: Elections in Organisations and their branches.

You will be aware that the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* has been amended so that The Registration and Accountability of Organisations Schedule (Schedule 1B to the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*) [the **RAO Schedule**], which generally came into operation on 12 May 2003 now contains most of the matters which relate to the registration and functioning of organisations of employers and employees under the Act. I would draw your attention to RAO Fact Sheets on the AIRC home page [http://www.airc.gov.au/fact\\_sheets/factsheets.html](http://www.airc.gov.au/fact_sheets/factsheets.html)

In particular - Fact Sheet No. 04/2003 7 May 2003, Australian Industrial Registry **Elections in Organisations and their branches**, identifies changes to the notification and conduct of elections. Election notifications now require more detailed reasons for the election to be stated as well as the closing day for the roll of voters as provided for under the rules of the organisation. (Section 143(1)(e)(i)).

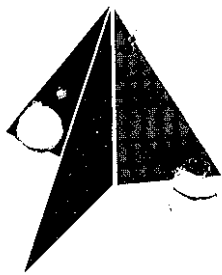

The requirement to lodge election information under s189(2) is a civil penalty provision - s305 refers.]

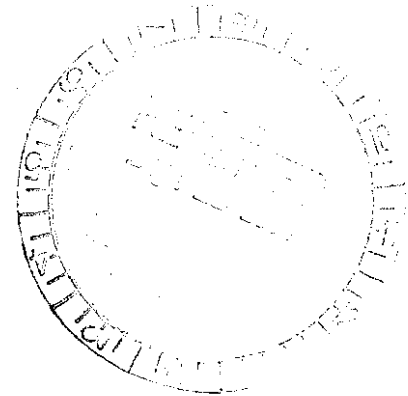

The CEPU WA has been ordered by the President of the WAIRC Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission to conduct an election under our State Rules for Alternate Delegates from the Trade Sections represented on State Council to the Executive Committee.

The Union's Federal Divisional Branch Executive Committee determined to conduct the election for those positions and request your office provide a person to act as the Returning Officer.

The Union has a Sect 71 Certificate that enables both the WA Divisional Branch and the State registered union to conduct the one election for both organisations.

I refer to our Federal Rules, which are the relevant for the purposes of this matter **Rule 15 Elections and particularly 15.11. 15.14.1.**

I also refer to the State registered **Rule 4.1.2 and 4.1.2.1** which I have enclosed for your assistance, which, in short outlines the State registered union is a Branch of and is incorporated with the Federally registered union.

**Rule 15.18.4** outlines who is eligible to stand for election and in this case Alternate Delegates must come from the relevant industry section State Councillors.

**Rule 15.14.1** outlines the Divisional Branch shall conduct its own elections.

**15.25** outlines the contest may be resolved, if drawn, by a toss of a coin.

**15.26** outlines Scrutineers if required.

I believe it would assist the Returning Officer to outline the positions required to be filled.

1. **Electronics/Communications** there is only 1 State Councillor for this Section and no other person is eligible to stand in that section for Alternate Delegate.
2. **Foundry** there are 2 persons representing that section and only 1 eligible to stand as Alternate Delegate.
3. **Manufacturing** same as (2) ✓
4. **Supply** same as (2)
5. **General Trades** there are 4 persons eligible to stand for Alternate Delegate and 1 needs to be elected.
6. **Contracting** same as (5)

I have already spoken to Mr Panegyres of your Perth Office who advised me he is prepared to act as the Returning Officer for the purposes of this election.

Our State Council will meet for this purpose at **8am Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> February 2004** at our Registered address.

I am happy to liaise with Mr Panegyres who has conducted a number of our elections over the years so please contact me if I can be of any assistance.

- 3.18 To establish holiday and rest centres for members of the Union.
- 3.19 To publish a Union Journal.
- 3.20 To afford legal protection to its members in industrial matters.
- 3.21 To enhance the interests of members by providing for the acquisition, control, management and sale of properties.

## RULE 4. - MEMBERSHIP

### 4.1 MEMBERS

4.1.1 The Union shall consist of such of the employees or persons referred to in Rule 2, who duly become members of the Union in accordance with its Rules.

4.1.2 The Union shall be incorporated with and be a Branch of Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia, (CEPU) an organisation of employees registered as such under the provisions of the Industrial Relations Act 1988.

4.1.2.1 Membership of the Union shall be synonymous with membership of the CEPU Electrical Division and admission to, or cessation of membership of the Union shall ipso facto constitute admission to, or cessation of membership of the CEPU Electrical Division except where the admission to, or cessation of membership of the Union results from the transfer of membership to or from another State Branch of the CEPU Electrical Division.

4.1.2.2 Any member on being transferred from one State to another shall be admitted to the Branch to which the member has removed on production of a certificate from the Secretary of the Branch to which the member belonged, stating membership and financial position on the books.

A similar procedure shall be followed where a member is transferred from one district to another necessitating a change of Sub-Branch. This Rule shall not apply to apprentices who are required by their employer to carry out work other than in the State in which they are indentured.

15.17.5 All nominations shall be in writing and endorsed by two financial members, other than the  
candidate, who have been at least three months in this Division of the Union. Before going to a  
ballot, candidates shall signify in writing their willingness to accept office if elected. Such  
candidates shall have seven days from the closing date of nominations during which they may  
withdraw their nomination in writing.

15.17.6 Provided that if the Returning Officer finds a nomination defective he/she shall, before  
rejecting the nomination, notify the person concerned of the defect and, where it is practicable to  
do so, give such person the opportunity to remedy the defect within seven days after being so  
notified.

15.17.7 Should insufficient nominations be received at Divisional Conference to elect the number  
of Divisional Executive Members required by rule 8, "Divisional Executive", the Divisional Council  
shall fill any vacancy in accordance with these Rules.

**15.18 Conduct of Elections - Collegiate Elections**

15.18.1 Where the election provided by these rules is to be conducted otherwise than by a direct  
election by a secret postal ballot, the Returning Officer shall call for nominations at the relevant  
meeting (ie. either at Divisional Branch Council or Divisional Council), or as prescribed by these  
rules. Where a collegiate election is required at the National Council under section A of these  
rules the Returning Officer shall conduct that ballot in a manner consistent with this rule.

15.18.2 Where nominations are called for under 15.18.1 above, and the Returning Officer finds  
that a nomination is defective, he shall take all reasonable steps to give the person nominating an  
opportunity to remedy the defect.

15.18.3 In conducting the ballot, the Returning Officer shall take all reasonable steps to ensure  
the secrecy of the ballot and may give all reasonable directions to ensure that no irregularity  
occurs.

15.18.4 For collegiate elections at or by the Divisional Branch Council and Divisional Council, the  
following persons shall be eligible to stand for the positions indicated in the manner indicated in  
Table 1 below:
