Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Commission a declaration of results for the election [E2015/207]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and persons elected to office.

Section 154D(1) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires the rules of organisations (and branches of organisations) to require each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe.

Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which should be provided for in your organisation's rules.

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia - Electrical, Energy and Services Division - Western Australian Divisional Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;
 - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and
 - the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. I have attached a template notification of changes which may assist you. If any change does not apply until a specific date, you don't need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.

[1] On 16 July 2015 the Western Australian Divisional Branch (the Branch) of the Electrical, Energy and Services Division of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia lodged with the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) the prescribed information in relation to an election for the following offices:

- [2] On 4 August 2015, the Fair Work Commission wrote to the abovenamed organisation informing them that it was unclear when nominations were to open for this election and that under section 189(2) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the Act) prescribed information must be lodged before the prescribed day or a request for an extension of time to lodge would be required.
- [3] On 5 August 2015, Mr Les McLaughlan, the Divisional Branch Secretary of the abovenamed organisation wrote to the Commission and stated that the above election had initially been planned to take place at the next State Council meeting on 5 August 2015 but was now planned to occur on 7 October 2015. Accordingly, the prescribed information has been lodged before the prescribed day. Mr McLaughlan also added that he was of the opinion under the rules that the need to lodge the prescribed information two months prior was in relation to the direct quadrennial election and that the collegiate election would follow from that.

- [4] I am aware that the Divisional rulebook of the organisation provides that such an election is to occur at the first Divisional State Council meeting following the quadrennial elections however it is up to the organisation to ensure that its rules do not conflict with the requirements set out in the Act and its regulations.
- [5] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.

ARRANGEMENT FOR THE CONDUCT OF AN ELECTION - E2015/207

I refer to your letter dated 4 August 2015 in relation to the request for a collegiate election to be conducted.

Foundry Divisional Branch Executive Member

We have not requested the election of a Foundry Executive Member because the position of Divisional Branch Councillor for the Foundry Section was left unfilled following the declaration of the quadrennial election, therefore there was no one eligible to fill the position.

Electrical Contracting Divisional Branch Executive Member

Rule 11.11.2.1 and 11.11.2.2 only apply in relation to our Victorian Branch. The Rule that applies to our Branch in relation to the number of Divisional Branch Executive Members is 11.11.1. We have complied with this Rule.

Date of Divisional State Council Meeting

The date of the first State Council meeting after the declaration of results is 5 August 2015. We lodged the document the day after the declaration of our quadrennial election.

We were of the opinion under the Rules that the need to lodge the prescribed information two months prior was in relation to the direct quadrennial election and that the collegiate election would follow from that, given that it is dependent on the declaration of those results.

If we were mistaken in that interpretation, then we seek an extension of time for the lodgement of the prescribed information and the reason for the lateness is our misinterpretation as above.

Our next State Council meeting is the 7 October 2015 and we would seek the conduct of the collegiate elections on that date.

Arrangement for the conduct of an election - E2015/207

I refer to the prescribed information lodged on 16 July 2015 for the conduct of an election for offices within the Western Australian Divisional Branch (**the Branch**) of the Electrical, Energy and Services Division (**the Division**) of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia (**CEPU**).

The election is a collegiate election, which follows the quadrennial Branch election in E2015/158.

Number of Divisional Branch Executive Members

The prescribed information does not list any Divisional Branch Executive Members from the Foundry Industry Section. However, the decision in E2015/158 listed one Divisional State Councillor from the Foundry Industry Section. In accordance with sub-rule 11.11.2.1 of the rulebook of the Division, it appears that a Divisional Branch Executive Member from the Foundry Industry Section was omitted from the prescribed information.

The amended prescribed information for E2015/158, which was lodged on 21 May 2015, showed that the Electrical Contracting Industry Section had 3,875 members. In accordance with sub-rules 11.11.2.1 and 11.11.2.2 of the rules of the Division it appears that two Divisional Branch Executive Members are required to be elected in this instance. However, only one Divisional Branch Executive Member from the Electrical Contracting Industry was listed in the current prescribed information for the current election.

If you agree with the above analysis, could you please provide amended prescribed information which includes a Divisional Branch Executive Member from the Foundry Industry Section and two Divisional Branch Executive Members from the Electrical Contracting Industry Section.

Date of Divisional State Council Meeting

Sub-rules 15.7 and 15.11 of the rules of the Division provide that this election will occur at the first meeting of the Divisional State Council after the ballot for the quadrennial election. The prescribed information does not include the date of this meeting. In the amended prescribed information, could you please include the date on which the Divisional State Council Meeting is scheduled to be held. Further, if the date of that meeting is before 17 September 2015, could you please provide a request for an extension of time, including brief reasons for lodging the

prescribed information after the prescribed day in accordance with section 189(2) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.
