Receipt is acknowledged of the above financial statements which were lodged in the Registry on 4 July 2003. I draw your attention to two matters.

Firstly, your Secretary's certificate covers the financial statements of each of the Branches of the Division with general references to the relevant sections of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*. 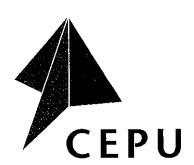

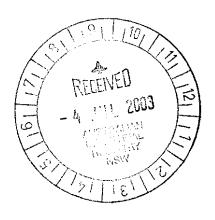

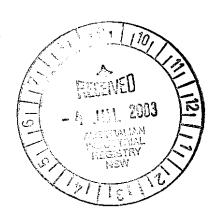

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INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

Scope

We have audited the financial statements of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia, Electrical Division, WA Branch, for the year ended 31 December 2001 as set out on pages 9 to 20, together with the Statements and Declaration on pages 6 to 8. The Committee of Management and Accounting Officer are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information they contain. We have conducted an independent audit of those financial statements in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Union.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the fmancial statements are free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting selected amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Australian and other mandatory professional Standards requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views), so as to present a view of the Communications, Electrical, Electronic, Energy, Information, Postal, Plumbing and Allied Services Union of Australia, Electrical Division, WA Branch, which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position and the results of its operations.

Our audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion

As with similar organisations due to the nature of certain income such as membership contributions, donations, subsidies, and similar, we are only able to audit that income when it is first recorded in the books and records of the Union.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the matter referred to in the preceding paragraph.

- (a) proper accounting records have been kept by the Union so far as appears from our examination of those books including:
 - (i) records of the sources of the receipts of the Union, (including income from members); and
 - (ii) records of the nature and purposes of the payments of the Union.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2001

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- a. In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for organisations, membership contributions are accounted for on a cash receipts basis. Otherwise, the financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the joint professional accounting bodies. In particular
 - i) the financial statements have not been adjusted to record changes in the general purchasing power of the dollar;
 - ii) depreciation is calculated on the straight line basis in order to write off the cost of fixed assets over their estimated useful lives;
 - iii) provisions for employees benefits in the form of long service leave, accrued annual leave and retirement allowances have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment; and
 - iv) no provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

The Union operates from 401 - 403 Oxford Street, Mount Hawthorn, Western Australia.
