Re: Union elections 2016

I have conducted the election in accordance with the Division's ballot rule 17 and have concluded the ballot process today, the 15th June 2016. The timetable for the election can be found marked Annexure (a) of this report, along with the Local Returning Officers Manual marked Annexure (b) and the Returning Officer Questionnaire Annexure (c).

The Returning Officer manual was updated to more appropriate reflect the current rules and a questionnaire developed with both being approved by myself before the commencement of any training.

Prior to the election being conducted all local returning officers were trained in accordance with the manual and the questionnaire had to be completed by each local returning officer so I could feel confident that they were conversant with the ballot rule and the process that had to be followed. If any local returning officer could not attend the training process they were required to complete the questionnaire electronically.

At the completion of the nomination period the current National office bearers were unopposed and I accordingly declared those positions. All positions in the Northern Mining & NSW Energy District and the Western Australian district were also unopposed and they were also declared on May 9.

In Tasmania those positions that were not contested were subsequently declared on May 9 but there were no nominations received for the following positions:-

- (a) District Check Inspector
- (b) Board of Management member

I have been advised that since the close of nominations the Tasmanian District Board of Management have resolved to remove the Board position that was not contested from their rules. This will obviously have to be followed through by the relevant responsible officer.

In respect to the South West District, all positions were also unopposed except for the position of Board of Management Western Region – Area 4. The ballot was conducted in

two ways with the Clarence Lodge returning officer conducting a mine site ballot of the members and 40 postal ballots were sent out for the members that were entitled to a vote but were not part of the Clarence Lodge.

After a count of the ballot papers that were returned namely the lodge vote along with a small number of the postal ballots I have declared that position also.

There is an issue also in respect to three positions in the South West Districts rules that I did not receive a nomination for, and those positions are as follows:-

Relief Check Inspector Board of Management Southern Area (1) Board of Management Western Area (2)

The Division will also need to make a decision in respect to the above vacant positions also either by reopening nominations or removing the positions from the rules, as it is my understanding they cannot remain open for this entire term of office.

You should also be advised that I received one late nomination, which was rejected for being out of time and another candidate withdrew his nomination because he was made redundant from his workplace.

I would also recommend to the Division that all Districts be notified that at least six months prior to next election their relevant Boards make a decision in respect to the number of Officers/Board of Management and Check Inspector positions that they require for the coming term. Districts should also ensure that their rules adequately reflect their decision, ensuring a seamless ballot process.

Also included in this report is a list of all the successful candidates in this election and their respective positions which can be found in Annexure (d).

In closing this report I would like to thank the National Executive for their confidence in me conducting this election, and a special thanks also going to Melanie Mitchell who assisted me through the entire process, Mick Weise for the training of the Local Returning Officers and his assistance with the manual and questionnaire, Anne Skinner for ensuring the membership lists were ready for any possible ballot and Phil Pasfield from Slater & Gordon for any legal concerns that I may have had.

National Returning Officer's Instruction Manual

A guide to District and National Election Processes of the CFMEU, Mining & Energy Division

Introduction by the National Returning Officer

The role of Local Returning Officer is an extremely important position of responsibility in the CFMEU Mining & Energy Division. Indeed, it has been so since the formation of the Miners Federation in 1915.

Unlike many other unions today, this Union has largely maintained the legal right to conduct its own elections. The right of the Union to conduct its own elections has come under scrutiny in recent times and it is increasingly important that our elections are conducted according to the highest standards of transparency, honesty and accountability.

Since the last General Elections in 2012, there have been significant changes to the Ballot Rules of the Mining & Energy Division. These changes are explained in this publication and will be the subject of training courses.

However, if any matter is unclear or confusing, please feel free to contact me directly to obtain advice on your role and duties.

I have produced this publication to ensure that we maintain the high standards and traditions of our Local Returning Officers. It outlines what is required of you and how we can assist you to carry out your important work with diligence and confidence

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Overview of Elections

This is a guide to the conduct of District and National Elections in the CFMEU Mining & Energy Division¹. Throughout this guide there are references to the "Ballot Rule". This is a reference to Rule 17 – Ballot, which is reproduced in full at the end of this guide.

Timing of Elections

District and National elections will normally be held every 4 years. In this guide, these elections are referred to as "general elections". In contrast, when an election is held for a casual vacancy that occurs during the term of office, it will be referred to as a "by-election".

The Ballot Rule provides that officers elected at a general election will assume office on 1 July in the year in which the general election is held.

The Ballot Rule provides that when a person is elected to office as a result of a byelection, that person assumes office on the first day of the month after the declaration of the ballot.

It is the responsibility of the Divisional National Office to facilitate elections at both National and District level by providing administrative and logistical support to the National Returning Officer.

Lodge elections are conducted at the local (lodge) level, and are not directly assisted by Divisional National Office.

National Returning Officer

The Ballot Rule requires that the Central Council appoint a National Returning Officer to conduct elections for office within the Division and within each District Branch².

There is no longer any provision in the Ballot Rule for the appointment of a District Returning Officer. Therefore, all elections under the Ballot Rule are overseen by the National Returning Officer.

The Central Council is required to be satisfied that the person that it appoints as National Returning Officer has had sufficient training and/or experience to understand his or her duties and obligations under the Ballot Rule.

In turn, the National Returning Officer is required to appoint Local Returning Officers if he or she considers that they have had sufficient training and/or experience to understand their obligations under the Ballot Rule. Local Returning Officers may be

nominated by a Lodge or District Branch and are required to be financial members of the Union.

The National Returning Officer is required to conduct elections in accordance with the Ballot Rule and to carry out those duties free from the direction or influence of any officer or employee of the Division.

The National Returning Officer is also entitled to obtain independent legal advice, external to the Union, as to his or her duties and obligations under the Divisional Rules including the Ballot Rule and the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.* Although the National Office pays for any such advice, it is the National Returning Officer who is the client of the lawyer.

The National Returning Officer has the power to take such steps, or give such directions, as he or she considers necessary to ensure the secrecy of the ballot and to prevent or remedy an irregularity.

The National Returning Officer also has the power to extend a ballot period at either, Divisional, District Branch or Lodge level if he or she considers it necessary to remedy an irregularity or to avoid the improper disenfranchisement of eligible voters.

The Ballot Rule also requires Central Council to appoint another National Returning Officer if the previous appointee resigns after the commencement of the ballot process, but before the declaration of the ballot, or otherwise is unable to conclude the ballot and issue a declaration.

The Ballot Rule stipulates that the appointment of a new National Returning Officer does not affect the validity of any step already taken by the previous National Returning Officer.

A similar obligation applies to the National Returning Officer to appoint a new Local Returning Officer in circumstances where the previous appointee is unable to complete the ballot.

The National Returning Officer has the obligation to determine an election timetable, including the times and dates for the opening and closing of nominations.

How are elections held?

Elections under the Ballot Rule are predominantly "attendance ballots" conducted by Local Returning Officers at, or near, the place of work of Lodge members.

In addition, the National Returning Officer has the discretion to conduct postal ballots as an alternative to attendance ballots where he or she considers that an attendance ballot is not practicable and that a postal ballot will facilitate the fuller participation of members. If a postal ballot is issued, the envelopes used must

comply with the relevant requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The approximate time for the conduct of a general election is 8 weeks.

Local Returning Officers

Nomination and appointment of Local Returning Officers

Local Returning Officers are nominated in accordance with local Lodge policies and/or rules.

District Branches may also nominate a Local Returning Officer, for example, in situations where it is not practical for a Lodge to do so.

The Local Returning Officers are responsible for maintaining a record of ballots and election outcomes conducted during his/her term. Such records are to be produced to the National Returning Officer on request. Records should include making a copy of the "vote return summary sheet".

Local Returning Officers are to carry out their duties themselves without the assistance of any other member or person.

Appointment of Local Returning Officers for District & National elections

The National Returning Officer shall appoint Local Returning Officers for each election under the Ballot Rule.

The usual process to be adopted is as follows:

- 1. The Local Returning Officer is nominated by a Lodge or District Branch.
- 2. The Local Returning Officer attends a training course conducted under the authority of the National Returning Officer.
- 3. The Local Returning Officer completes the course and successfully completes an assessment sheet.
- 4. Being satisfied of the Local Returning Officer's ability to conduct the ballot, the National Returning Officer formally appoints the Local Returning Officer.

Roles and responsibilities of Local Returning Officers

The Local Returning Officer is responsible for conducting the ballot at their individual site. This includes the receipt and return of ballot papers and providing a secure and confidential area for the casting of votes.

The Local Returning Officer is only responsible for the votes of members who appear on the site electoral roll.

Local Returning Officers must make themselves available for communication with the National Returning Officer when required.

The Local Returning Officer must not assist any candidate in their electioneering and must not express their opinion of candidates to members.

If the Local Returning Officer becomes aware of any potential illegality or irregularity in the conduct of the election, including any conduct by a candidate or member, he or she should immediately contact the National Returning Officer. Similarly, if the Local Returning Officer requires any advice, including legal advice, about the conduct of the ballot, he or she should immediately contact the National Returning Officer.

Opening of Election

Upon notification of the need for an election the National Returning Officer will set the timetable for the election process.

The National Returning Officer sends correspondence to the General and District Secretaries notifying them of the need for an election and advising them of the proposed timetable.

Roll of Voters

The National Returning Officer is required to prepare a roll of voters who are entitled to vote in the election.

The names of financial members of the Division or the District Branch who are entitled under the rules to vote in an election forms the roll of voters for the election.

The roll of voters closes seven days before the day on which nominations for the election open.

The National Returning Officer is required to make the roll of voters in an election for an office available for inspection by members at the place where he or she carries out their functions, or by any person authorised by the National Returning Officer, during normal business hours in the period that commences fourteen (14) days before the issuing of ballot papers and ends on the day on which the result of the election is declared.

Notice to Members

The National Returning Officer is required to issue a notice to members at least 21 days before the date of the commencement of the period for lodging nominations. The notice is to be published in newspapers or other media, including electronic media. The notice is required to set out:

The title of the office;

If a District Branch office, the name of the District Branch;

The form in which nominations are to be made;

The place for lodging nominations;

The times and dates of the commencement and close of the period for lodging nominations:

The times and dates of the commencement and close of the period of the ballot and inviting nominations of persons, eligible for election for the office under these rules to stand as candidates for election to the office;

The minimum period during which nominations shall open and close (provided that the minimum period shall be in both cases, 21 days);

The National Returning Officer is required to forward a notice containing the information referred to above to each lodge involved in the election. The notice should be displayed prominently at each lodge and locality;

A sample Notice to Members is shown on page 10³.

Nomination Period

The National Returning Officer shall determine the times and dates of the commencement and close of the period for lodging nominations of candidates for election to an office having regard to:-

The date of the expiration of the term of office of the holder of the office;

The time required to lodge the nominations;

The time required to complete the election.

A sample nomination form is shown on page 11.

Eligibility for nomination

A candidate for election must have been a financial member for at least 12 months prior to the closing date of nominations. They must also be eligible for the position in accordance with the relevant District rules and policies.

Candidates must be nominated by at least two other financial members of the Union.

Upon receipt of the nomination the National Returning Officer checks the financial status and credentials of the candidate and the financial status of the nominees.

Following this check the National Returning Officer will contact the nominee to advise them of the acceptance or rejection of their nomination.

Where the National Returning Officer finds that a document purporting to be the nomination of a person as a candidate for an election to an office is not a nomination in accordance with the provisions of the Ballot Rule the National Returning Officer shall, before rejecting the nomination, notify the person concerned of the defect and, where it is practicable to do so, give the person the opportunity of remedying the defect within seven days of the defect being identified.

A person is not eligible for election unless the nomination of the person as a candidate for election is lodged within the nomination period at the place determined by the National Returning Officer.

Close of Nominations

At the close of nominations if there is more than one nomination for a position the National Returning Officer begins the process to conduct a ballot.

At the close of nominations if there are no nominations for a position the National Returning Officer will declare the position vacant. If there is only 1 nomination for a position the National Returning Officer will declare the candidate elected unopposed to that position and notify the candidate and the relevant District Secretary.

Preparation of Ballot

Draw for Positions

The names of candidates for election for an office shall appear on the ballot paper for that election in the order determined as a result of a draw conducted by the National Returning Officer. Each candidate may either attend the draw in person or nominate a person to attend on the candidate's behalf.

At the completion of the draw for positions, candidates for positions and District Secretaries are notified of the results and ballot papers prepared.

Ballot pack/Local Returning Officers kit

The National Returning Officer prepares a ballot pack to be sent to all Local Returning Officers. This pack contains:

- A roll of voters eligible to vote at that site
- A copy of the Ballot Rules
- Sufficient ballot papers for each voter
- Spare ballot papers to replace spoilt, lost or destroyed papers
- A voting return summary form
- Reply Paid Postal envelope or box to return all ballot papers and documents to National Returning Officer via Registered Post or Express Post (where appropriate) at the completion of voting.

The preparation and distribution of ballot papers varies between Districts. Please allow reasonable time for the delivery of ballot papers. If you have not received your pack 72 hours prior to the advertised opening of the ballot please advise the National Returning Officer as soon as possible.

Communication Responsibilities and Behaviour

Responsibilities of Candidates

Candidates for positions have the right to campaign for their nominated position. Candidates must meet all costs of their campaign and cannot use union resources, including union email accounts and mobile phones.

Candidates or their approved representatives can view the roll of voters in the presence of the National Returning Officer or his/her nominated representative.

Candidates are urged to ensure that any election related material that is intended for distribution (including via social media) is fair, respectful and non-offensive to other candidates or members. Candidates should be aware that there may be personal legal consequences arising from material that contains content that is defamatory, offensive or discriminatory in character. Fair campaigning has generally been a feature of elections conducted under the Ballot Rule and we want to maintain this high standard as far as possible.

Responsibilities of District Offices

District Offices cannot distribute or display campaign material or assist a candidate in any way. To do so would be contrary to the Ballot Rule and the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The inappropriate use of union resources to assist a candidate may constitute an irregularity that would justify intervention by the National Returning Officer under the Ballot Rule, or may lead to legal action brought by a candidate by way of an election inquiry conducted by the Federal Court of Australia.

Any concerns about such matters should be directed to the National Returning Officer.

The Ballot

Conduct of Site Ballot

The ballot period is at the discretion of the National Returning Officer. However, the ballot period will be set having regard to the various minimum time periods specified in the Ballot Rule as well as the National Returning Officer's judgment concerning minimum time frames for certain steps.

In addition, the National Returning Officer has the power to extend the period during which ballots may be cast (including postal ballots) at either Lodge, District or Divisional level in circumstances where an extension is necessary to avoid the improper disenfranchisement of eligible voters, or to remedy an irregularity.

The Local Returning Officer will provide a secure ballot box for votes to be cast. The ballot box must be kept in a locked, secure place.

The Local Returning Officer must make arrangements in conjunction with the Lodge Executive to conduct the ballot at an approved site.

The Local Returning Officer must:

- Mark the member off the membership list
- Initial a ballot paper and issue that paper to the member
- Ensure that any ballot paper not initialled will be deemed informal, whether marked or not
- Ensure that unused ballot papers must not be initialled.

The Local Returning Officer must provide a clear area for voting with no campaign or how to vote material displayed within a reasonable distance from the voting area. Local Returning Officers must not attempt to influence or intimidate their members during the voting process, nor permit any person to attempt to influence members' voting intentions in the vicinity of the voting area. Except for the purpose of casting their own vote, candidates for positions must remain a reasonable distance away from the voting area.

The Local Returning Officer is only responsible for the votes of members who appear on the site electoral roll.

A member who will be absent from the lodge or locality during a ballot, may apply to the National Returning Officer, for a ballot paper. Any such absentee ballot paper shall be sent to an address nominated by the National Returning Officer and shall be subject to the requirements as other ballots cast as postal ballots.

Further, on application before the close of the ballot, the National Returning Officer or a Local Returning Officer is satisfied that a ballot paper issued to a person whose name is on the roll of voters has not been received or has been lost, destroyed or spoilt, the relevant Returning Officer shall issue to that person, a duplicate ballot paper.

The payment and reimbursement of expenses incurred by the Local Returning Officer is the responsibility of the lodge or relevant District. The National Office is only responsible for the relevant expenses of the National Returning Officer.

Returning the ballot papers

At the completion of the ballot, all ballot papers, whether used or unused, the ballot summary sheet and the membership list will be returned to the National Returning Officer in accordance with the time and date advised in the Notice to Members. Ballot papers postmarked after that time and date cannot be accepted unless the lodge or locality has been the subject of an extension of the ballot by the National Returning Officer.

It is therefore important for Local Returning Officers to complete the site vote as early as possible to allow the maximum time for return.

Conduct of a Postal Ballot

The issuing of postal ballots is at the discretion of the National Returning Officer.

Attendance ballots of members voting in Lodges remains the primary form of ballot under the Ballot Rule.

The issuing of postal ballots will generally occur where it is not practical for members to vote in a Lodge and where the postal ballot will facilitate the participation of members.

Postal ballots are to be conducted in accordance with the requirements in section 188 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and Regulations 5 and 6 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 relating to the use of mandatory declaration envelopes in conjunction with ballot papers.

The process adopted for postal ballots will generally be as follows:

The National Returning Officer sends by ordinary Australia Post mail to each postal voter an envelope containing:

- A letter of instructions
- An initialled ballot paper
- Two internal envelopes consisting of:
 - A larger, self-addressed reply paid envelope; and
 - A smaller declaration envelope with a detachable signature strip for the use of the voter. The declaration envelope is designed to protect the identity of the voter when ballots are counted and is placed inside the self-addressed, reply paid envelope.

The letter of instructions will direct the voter to place the ballot paper inside the declaration envelope and to sign and date the detachable strip. The letter of instructions will also specify the date by which the external envelope must be postmarked in order for the ballot to be received as a valid vote.

Postal votes must be mailed to the National Returning Officer by the voter in the external envelope provided.

Postal votes cannot be accepted by Local Returning Officers at sites.

Postal ballot voters who spoil a ballot paper may apply to the National Returning Officer for another ballot paper, provided that there is sufficient time remaining for the postal ballot to be received.

Conduct of the count of votes

The National Returning Officer will determine the time, place and date of the commencement of counting of votes after the close of the ballot.

The count of the votes is to be carried out in the following manner:

- A secure room is to be set aside for the vote to be carried out.
- Authorised persons only are permitted in the counting room.
- Election counters are to be approved by the National Returning Officer.
- Only scrutineers appointed in accordance with the Ballot Rule are allowed to observe the count.

Scrutineers

Each lodge or locality shall in respect of each election appoint a scrutineer.

Each candidate may appoint a scrutineer in respect of each election for which the candidate has nominated. Any appointment of a scrutineer by a candidate shall be made by notice in writing addressed to the National Returning Officer or the Local Returning Officer.

Scrutineers may be present during the following processes and may direct the attention of the National Returning Officer to any irregularity:

- Opening of postal envelopes and ballot post packs.
- Sorting of formal and informal votes.
- Counting of votes.

Scrutineers are not permitted to bring mobile phones, electronic equipment or bags into the counting room. Scrutineers must not address the counters and must direct any inquiries or concerns to the National Returning Officer. Scrutineers must maintain a reasonable distance between themselves and the counters.

Scrutineers must comply with the directions of the National Returning Officer.

Failure to do so may result in the scrutineer being asked to leave the counting room.

Counting the Votes

The daily counting schedule will be determined by the National Returning Officer. Entry into the counting room will be by authorised people only.

All ballot post packs from Lodges will be opened by the National Returning Officer. The number of returned ballot papers will be reconciled against the records of the Local Returning Officer on the return summary sheet.

Any discrepancy between the return of the Local Returning Officer and the receipt by the National Returning Officer will be addressed before counting is commenced for that site.

Once the return is reconciled the papers will be counted.

In respect to individual postal ballots, the process adopted shall be as follows:

- The external, self-addressed pre-paid envelope shall be checked to ensure that the post-mark date on the envelope falls within the election timetable determined by the National Returning Officer.
- The internal mandatory declaration envelope is then removed from the external envelope and the authorised counter checks that the detachable signature strip has been signed and dated by the voter.
- The detachable slip is then removed from the mandatory declaration envelope and the voter's name is marked off the roll of voters as having voted. The detachable slip is then stored by the National Returning Officer in a separate, secure location to the ballot papers.
- The ballot paper is then extracted from the inner envelope and is added to the count for the particular position or positions applicable to the ballot.

The method of counting will be determined by the National Returning Officer.

Any counter or scrutineer who wishes to question the formality of a ballot paper will refer the paper to the National Returning Officer.

Informal ballot papers

The National Returning Officer determines whether a ballot paper is informal. Characteristics of an informal ballot paper are as follows:

Any paper which has a mark or writing by which the voter can be identified.

- Any paper which does not have the initials of the Local Returning Officer or (in the case of postal ballots) the initials of the National Returning Officer.
- Any paper which is not the same colour as those specifically issued to the Division or District (as per samples displayed)
- Any paper as reasonably determined by the National Returning Officer to be a forgery or unauthorised copy of the ballot paper.

Ballot papers marked with other than a cross and where the voter's intention is clear will be accepted as formal.

Information to candidates/officials during course of count

Information may be provided periodically to candidates and/or officials during the course of the count. This will be at the discretion of the National Returning Officer.

Conclusion of Ballot

As soon as is practicable after the conclusion of the count, the National Returning Officer shall declare the result of an election by giving notice in writing to the Division at its registered office (and to any District Branch in relation to which such election applies) of the result.

When declaring the result in respect of the election the National Returning Officer shall also declare in respect of the election:-

- The number of ballot papers issued (other than duplicate ballot papers);
- The number of duplicate ballot papers issued;
- The number of ballot papers admitted as formal;
- The number of ballot papers rejected as informal.

As soon as practical after the declaration of the results of an election, the National Returning Officer shall prepare a report for the General Secretary summarising the result of each election conducted.

In preparing this report the National Returning Officer may also make recommendations for the consideration of Central Council as to how to improve the participation of members in the election process and other relevant matters. The General Secretary is required, within 21 days of Central Council receiving the report of the National Returning Officer, to file a copy of the report with the General Manager of the Fair Work Commission.

Frequently asked Questions

1. What is the difference between the National Returning Officer and the Local Returning Officer?

The National Returning Officer is the person officially responsible for carrying out union elections. He/she is appointed by Central Council prior to general union elections every four years and holds the position until the next general election, or as otherwise determined by Central Council.

Local Returning Officers are nominated either by a lodge or District and are appointed by the National Returning Officer.

They are responsible for carrying out the election at their individual site.

2. How often do elections occur?

General elections occur every 4 years, with the new term of office commencing on 1 July in the year in which an election is held.

However, if a position becomes vacant before a term has expired (for example, due to the resignation or death of the officer) a by-election may be held to fill the vacancy, in accordance with the requirements of the Ballot Rule.

3. Is the National Returning Officer responsible for the election of lodge officers?

No. The elections at lodge level are the responsibility of the lodge/district.

4. Who can become a Local Returning Officer?

Any financial member of a lodge, provided they are not an elected lodge official, can become a Local Returning Officer.

Candidates standing for positions cannot become a Local Returning Officer.

5. Who is eligible to nominate for a position?

A candidate for election must have been a financial member for at least 12 months prior to the closing date of nominations. They must also be eligible for the position in accordance with the relevant District rules and policies.

6. What happens if my nomination is rejected?

If your nomination for a position is rejected by the National Returning Officer for any reason you will be given reasonable time, as determined by the National Returning Officer, to rectify your nomination and resubmit it.

7. What time zones are used when setting times for election schedules?

The time zone will be specified by the National Returning Officer in his/her notice to members.

8. What happens if there are no nominees for a position?

The position is declared vacant by the National Returning Officer at the close of nominations.

9. What happens if there is only one nomination for a position at the close of nominations?

The nominee is declared the successful candidate for the position by the National Returning Officer at the close of nominations.

10. Is a candidate for a position entitled to be present when the draw for positions on the ballot paper is carried out?

Yes, a candidate or a nominated representative is entitled to be present for the draw for positions on the ballot paper. Representatives must have prior approval from the National Returning Officer. Any costs associated with the attendance of a candidate or their representative at the draw are to be met by the candidate.

11. How long can a Local Returning Officer expect to wait to receive the ballot papers following the close of nominations?

The preparation and distribution of ballot papers is a substantial task. A Local Returning Officer can expect to receive their ballot papers generally within a week after the close of nominations.

12. What happens if the ballot is due to start within 72 hours and the Local Returning Officer has not received their ballot papers?

The Local Returning Officer should contact the National Returning Officer as soon as possible so that the whereabouts of the papers can be determined or a new set of papers sent out.

13. What is contained in the ballot pack that is sent to Local Returning Officers?

The ballot pack contains a roll of voters eligible to vote at the site, a copy of the ballot rules, sufficient ballot papers for all registered voters, spare ballot papers to replace any spoilt, lost or destroyed papers, a voting return summary form, a reply paid postal envelope or box or express post package (where appropriate) to return the papers to the National Returning Officer.

14. How many spare ballot papers will be included with the ballot pack?

There will be 2 spare papers per 50 members.

15. Is a candidate entitled to campaign for their nominated position?

Yes, a candidate can campaign for their nominated position.

However, we urge all candidates to campaign in a respectful and fair manner. Candidates should be aware that producing campaign material that is defamatory, offensive or discriminatory may lead to personal exposure to legal consequences.

16. Can candidates use union resources, (eg printers, fax machines) to send out campaign materials to members?

No. Candidates cannot use union resources.

17. Can candidates apply to the union for funding for their campaign?

No. Candidates must fund all aspects of their own campaign.

18. Can candidates gain access to the membership rolls from either the National Office or District Office?

Consistent with the Ballot Rule, candidates can view the roll of voters in the presence of the National Returning Officer or his/her nominated representative.

19. During the ballot period, where are votes cast?

Votes are cast in a safe, secure and confidential area that is determined by the Local Returning Officer. A sealed container must be provided by the Local Returning Officer.

20. Does the Local Returning Officer initial all ballot papers in the ballot pack?

No. The Local Returning Officer only initials ballot papers as they are handed to members to vote on. Unused ballot papers are not initialed.

21. If a Local Returning Officer issues a ballot paper to a member and the paper is not returned what is the process?

The paper is marked down on the return sheet as lost. All papers must be accounted for on the return sheet.

22. Under what circumstances can spare ballot papers be issued to members?

Spare ballot papers can only be issued to members in the event that the original ballot paper they were issued has been lost, spoilt or destroyed.

23. Is the Local Returning Officer permitted to display campaign material of candidates near the voting area or hand voters how to vote information?

No. The voting area must be kept clear of all campaign material and the Local Returning Officer must not attempt to influence the voting choices of members.

24. What is the procedure if voters are being intimidated or coerced at the voting site?

Intimidation or coercion of voters at a voting site is an offence under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act and is contrary to our Ballot Rule.

The Local Returning Officer should investigate any complaint of coercion or intimidation and liaise with the National Returning Officer concerning any steps to be taken.

Complaints regarding the behaviour of the Local Returning Officer, should be reported directly to the National Returning Officer.

27. If the Local Returning Officer is unable to complete their duties for personal or other reasons, can a replacement Local Returning officer be appointed?

Yes. The National Returning Officer is required to appoint another Local Returning Officer in the event that the incumbent is unable to complete his or her duties.

28. If a member is on away from site during an election are they entitled to cast their vote?

It is the member's responsibility to apply to the national Returning Officer for a postal vote if they will be absent during an election.

30. After completing the voting at my lodge when do I send the ballot papers to the National Returning Officer?

You are required to send your papers back to the National Returning Officer immediately after completing the voting. Papers which are postmarked after the deadline may not be accepted by the National Returning Officer. If you

believe you may miss the deadline you must contact the National Returning Officer immediately.

31. Who will receive a postal vote?

Eligible members who do not belong to a lodge, or for whom it is not practical to vote in an attendance ballot, will receive a postal ballot from the National Returning Officer.

34. How do standing officials cast their vote?

Standing officials have the option to cast their vote with their lodge or receive a postal vote. They must notify the National Returning Officer by the close of nominations as to their preferred voting method.

35. When does the counting of votes commence?

The counting of votes commences as soon as possible after the close of the ballot, as determined by the National Returning Officer.

36. Are candidates entitled to be present at the counting of votes?

No. Candidates are not entitled to be present at the counting of votes but are entitled to have one approved scrutineer represent them at the count.

37. Who is able to be a scrutineer?

A scrutineer must be approved, in writing, by the National Returning Officer.

38. Under what circumstances are ballot papers determined to be informal?

A ballot paper is deemed to be informal if:

- It has not been specifically issued by the National Returning Officer
- It has a mark or writing on it which can identify the voter
- It has not been initialled by the Local Returning Officer if it is an attendance ballot, or by the National Returning Officer if it is a postal ballot.
- It has been reasonably deemed by the National Returning Officer to be a forgery or unauthorised copy.

39. A ballot paper has been marked by the voter with numbers instead of a cross. Is this informal?

No. A voter's intention must be clear for the paper to be considered a formal vote. This can be by way of numbering, ticking or any other clear indication.

40. When can a candidate for a position expect to be notified of the results of a ballot?

A candidate will be notified of the results of a ballot immediately following the conclusion of counting. Scrutineers may notify their candidate of tallies periodically during breaks in counting.

Appendix 1

Rules of the CFMEU, Mining & Energy Division and its District Branches

17 - BALLOT

- (a) The Central Council shall appoint a National Returning Officer to conduct elections for office within the Division and within each District Branch (called in this Rule the National Returning Officer).
 - (1) The Central Council shall only appoint a National Returning Officer if satisfied that the person has had sufficient training and/or experience to understand his or her duties and obligations under this Rule.
 - (2) The National Returning Officer shall for the purpose of each election appoint Local Returning Officers who may be nominated by a Lodge or District Branch. The Local Returning Officer shall be responsible for the conduct of elections at each lodge or locality in such a way as to ensure, as far as practicable that no irregularities can occur in relation to an election. The National Returning Officer shall only appoint a Local Returning Officer if satisfied that the person has had sufficient training and/or experience to understand his or her duties and obligations under this Rule.
 - (3) The National Returning Officer or Local Returning Officer shall not be the holder of any office in or be an employee of the Union, a Division or a District Branch or lodge of the Division. However the Local Returning Officer is required to be a financial member of the Union.
 - (4) The National Returning Officer shall conduct elections in accordance with this Rule and shall carry out those duties free from the direction or influence of any officer or employee of the Division. The National Returning Officer may obtain independent, expert advice as to his or her duties and obligations under these Rules and the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. Any legal advice provided to the Returning Officer related to the conduct of an election under this Rule shall be paid for by the Division but the client-lawyer relationship shall subsist between the Returning Officer and the lawyer.
 - (5) The National Returning Officer may, if he or she considers it beneficial, issue an instruction manual for the use of Local Returning Officers concerning the conduct of elections under this Rule. The National Returning Officer may utilise external legal advice in the preparation of the instruction manual, but the cost of the production and distribution of the manual shall be borne by the Division.
 - (6) The National Returning Officer shall be provided with all necessary administrative support by the Division so as to efficiently acquit his or her duties under this Rule.

- (7) In respect of any matters pertaining to the conduct of the elections, and in spite of anything else contained in these rules, the National Returning Officer shall take such action and give such directions as the National Returning Officer considers necessary to ensure the secrecy of the ballot and to prevent or remedy an irregularity.
- (8) If a National Returning Officer resigns after the commencement of the ballot process, but before the declaration of the ballot, or otherwise is unable to conclude the ballot and issue a declaration, the Central Council shall appoint a new National Returning Officer to carry out the duties still required to conclude the ballot. The appointment of a new National Returning Officer shall not affect the validity of any step already taken by the previous National Returning Officer.
- (9) If a Local Returning Officer resigns after the commencement of the ballot process, but before the declaration of the ballot, or otherwise is unable to conclude the ballot and issue a declaration, the National Returning Officer shall appoint a new Local Returning Officer to carry out the duties still required to conclude the ballot. The appointment of a new Local Returning Officer shall not affect the validity of any step already taken by the previous Local Returning Officer.
- (b) The National Returning Officer shall determine the times and dates of the commencement and close of the period for lodging nominations of candidates for election to an office having regard to:-
 - (1) the date of the expiration of the term of office of the holder of the office;
 - (2) the time required to lodge the nominations;
 - (3) the time required to complete the election.
- (c) (1) The National Returning Officer shall, within the period of 21 days before the date of the commencement of the period for lodging nominations of candidates for an election for an office within the Division or a District Branch, cause to be published by the Division in a newspaper or such other publications (including electronic media) as the Returning Officer considers appropriate a notice setting out:-
 - (A) the title of the office;
 - (B) if a District Branch office, the name of the District Branch;
 - (C) the form in which nominations are to be made;
 - (D) the place for lodging nominations;
 - (E) the times and dates of the commencement and close of the period for lodging nominations;

- (F) the times and dates of the commencement and close of the period of the ballot and inviting nominations of persons, eligible for election for the office under these rules to stand as candidates for election to the office.
- (G) provided that, the minimum period during which nominations shall open and close and the ballot shall open and close, shall in both cases, be 21 days.
- (2) The National Returning Officer shall forward a notice containing the information referred to in paragraph (c)(i) to each lodge involved in the election and the notice should be displayed at each lodge and locality.
- (d) A person is not eligible for election for an office unless the nomination is in writing and is signed by the person and two other financial members.
 - (2) Where the National Returning Officer finds that a document lodged at the place and within the period determined by the National Returning Officer under paragraph (b) of this Rule and purporting to be the nomination of a person as a candidate for an election to an office is not a nomination in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph the National Returning Officer shall, before rejecting the nomination, notify the person concerned of the defect and, where it is practicable to do so, give the person the opportunity of remedying the defect within not less than seven days after the National Returning Officer being so notified.
 - (3) A person is not eligible for election unless the nomination of the person as a candidate for election is lodged at the place determined by the Returning Officer under paragraph (c)(l)(D) of this Rule and within the period for lodging nominations under paragraph (b)(2), or under paragraph (d)(2) of this Rule.
- (e) Where on the expiry of the period for lodging the nomination of a candidate for election to an office, only one candidate is nominated for election for the office, the National Returning Officer shall declare under paragraph (I) of this Rule that the candidate has been elected to that office.
- (f) The National Returning Officer shall prepare a roll of voters who are entitled to vote in the election.
 - (2) The names of members of the Division or the District Branch who are entitled under the rules to vote in an election shall form the roll of voters for the election. The roll of voters shall be closed on the date which is seven days before the day on which nominations for the election open.
 - (3) The National Returning Officer shall, at the place where the National Returning Officer carries out the functions as National Returning Officer, make the roll of voters in an election for an office available for inspection by members or by any person authorised by the National Returning Officer, during the ordinary hours of business in the period that commences fourteen (14) days before the date of commencement of the issuing of

ballot papers and ends on the day on which the result of the election is declared.

- (g) (1) Subject to sub-rule 17(m), where more than one candidate is nominated for election for an office the National Returning Officer shall determine the date of commencement of issuing ballot papers and the time and date of the close of the ballot having regard to:
 - (a) the date of expiration of the term of office of the holder of the office;
 - the time required for the National Returning Officer to send the Local Returning Officers return ballot papers by post;
 - (c) the time required for postal ballots to be sent to members and returned to the Returning Officer; and
 - (d) the time required to complete the election.
 - (2) The names of candidates for election for an office shall appear on the ballot paper for that election in the order determined as a result of a draw conducted by the National Officer. Each candidate may either attend the draw in person or nominate a person to attend on the candidates behalf.
 - (3) As soon as practicable after the date determined for the commencement of issuing ballot papers in respect of an election, the National Returning Officer shall issue by posting by registered post to each Local Returning Officer appointed under paragraph (a) of this Rule, sufficient ballot papers for each person whose name appears on the roll of voters for the relevant lodge or locality.
- (h) (1) Where, on application before the time of the close of the ballot in an election, the National Returning Officer or a Local Returning Officer is satisfied that a ballot paper issued to a person whose name is on the roll of voters, has not been received or has been lost, destroyed or spoilt, the Returning Officer shall issue to that person, a duplicate ballot paper.
 - (2) A member who will be absent from the lodge or locality during a ballot, may apply to the National Returning Officer, for a ballot paper. Any such absentee ballot paper shall be sent to an address nominated by National Returning Officer and shall be subject to the requirements of sub-rule 17(m).
- (i) The Local Returning Officer shall as soon as practicable after the receipt of the ballot papers from the National Returning Officer as provided for in paragraph (g)(3), but in any event before the close of ballot as determined by the National Returning Officer pursuant to paragraph (g)(1):
 - (a) provide to each member whose name appears on the roll of voters in the lodge or locality, a ballot paper either by attending the mine or work site at the beginning of each shift or such other means as may be required;

- (b) initial each ballot paper so provided;
- ensure that each ballot paper so provided contains written instructions to the voter as to the proper method of completion of the ballot paper in order to record a formal vote;
- (d) provide a sealed container into which each member voting shall place the completed ballot paper;
- (e) at the close of the ballot, open the sealed container and send the contents thereof in sealed envelopes by registered post to the National Returning Officer.
- (j) (1) The National Returning Officer shall open the sealed envelopes in which the ballot papers have been placed, withdraw each ballot paper and after rejecting informal ballot papers:-
 - (a) count the number of votes to ascertain which candidate is successful in the election to the relevant office;
 - (b) place into a container or containers the ballot papers admitted as formal, seal each of the containers and endorse on each of the containers:-
 - (i) if relevant, the name of the District Branch and the title of the office;
 - (ii) the words "Ballot Papers admitted as formal";
 - (iii) the Returning Officer's signature; and
 - (iv) the date of signing.
 - (c) place into a container or containers the ballot papers rejected as informal, seal each of the containers and endorse on each of the containers:-
 - (i) if relevant the name of the District Branch and the title of the office;
 - (ii) the words "Ballot Papers rejected as informal";
 - (iii) the Returning Officer's signature; and
 - (iv) the date of signing; and
 - (d) subject to the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, keep each of the containers in safe custody.
 - (2) The National Returning Officer shall reject as informal a ballot paper that:-

- (a) does not bear the initials of the Local Returning Officer;
- (b) has upon it a mark or writing by which the voter can be identified.
- (3) Where, during the scrutiny, the National Returning Officer is informed by a scrutineer appointed under paragraph (k) that the scrutineer objects to a ballot paper being admitted as formal, or rejected as informal, as the case may be, the Returning Officer shall decide the matter and endorse the decision on the ballot paper.
- (k) (1) Each lodge or locality shall in respect of each election appoint a scrutineer. Each candidate may appoint a scrutineer in respect of each election for which the candidate has nominated. Any appointment of a scrutineer by a candidate shall be made by notice in writing addressed to the National Returning Officer or the Local Returning Officer. Not more than one scrutineer shall be allowed to each candidate in an election at each lodge or locality.
 - (2) Subject to sub-paragraph (3), a scrutineer appointed under this sub-rule may:-
 - (a) be present while the National Returning Officer carries out the functions under paragraphs (j) or while a Local Returning Officer carries out the functions under paragraph (i); and
 - (b) direct the attention of the National Returning Officer or a Local Returning Officer to any irregularity concerning the issue of ballot papers, the admission of any envelope to scrutiny, the admission of a ballot paper as formal, the rejection of a ballot paper as informal or the counting of the votes.
 - (3) Where a scrutineer appointed under this sub-rule:
 - (a) interrupts the scrutiny otherwise than in accordance with subparagraph (2)(b); or
 - (b) fails to carry out a lawful request by the Returning Officer;

the Returning Officer may direct the scrutineer to leave the place where the scrutiny is being conducted.

- (4) A scrutineer appointed under this paragraph shall comply with a direction by the Returning Officer under sub-paragraph (3).
- (5) Notwithstanding anything else contained in this Rule, the National Returning Officer shall have the power to extend the period during which ballots may be cast (including postal ballots) at either Lodge, District or Divisional level, if the National Returning Officer believes such a step is necessary to avoid the improper disenfranchisement of eligible voters, or to remedy an irregularity.

- (1) As soon as is practicable the National Returning Officer shall declare the result of an election by giving notice in writing to the Division at its registered office (and to any District Branch in relation to which such election applies) of the result.
 - (2) When declaring the result in respect of the election the National Returning Officer shall also declare in respect of the election:-
 - (a) the number of ballot papers issued (other than duplicate ballot papers);
 - (b) the number of duplicate ballot papers issued;
 - (c) the number of ballot papers admitted as formal;
 - (d) the number of ballot papers rejected as informal.
 - (3) As soon as practicable after the declaration of the results of an election, the Returning Officer shall prepare a report for the General Secretary summarising the results of each election conducted. In preparing this report, the Returning Officer may also make recommendations for the consideration of Central Council as to how to improve the participation of members in the election process and other relevant matters. The General Secretary shall, within 21 days of receiving the report of the National Returning Officer, file a copy of the report with the General Manager of the Fair Work Commission.
- (m) Notwithstanding anything else contained in this Rule, the Returning Officer shall have the discretion to issue postal ballots as an alternative to an attendance ballot where it appears to the Returning Officer that an attendance ballot is not practical and that the issuing of a postal ballot will facilitate the participation of members in an election conducted under this Rule. In conducting a postal ballot under this rule, the Returning Officer shall ensure that there is compliance with any legislation applicable to postal ballots for registered organisations, including the requirements of section 188 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and Regulations 5 and 6 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 relating to the use of envelopes in conjunction with ballot papers.
- (n) Notwithstanding anything else contained in the Rules of the Division, or the Rules of a District Branch, a person elected to office under this Rule shall assume office:-
 - (1) In the case of a general election on 1 July in the year in which the general election is held;
 - (2) In the case of a casual vacancy on the first day of the month following the declaration of his or her election to office.
- (o) <u>Term of office of certain persons elected in 2012 general elections</u>:

Notwithstanding anything else contained in the Rules of the Division or of any District Branch and for the avoidance of doubt, a person declared elected to an office in May or June 2012 shall continue to hold office until 30 June 2016 or until their successor is elected.

Contraventions by the ACT Branch of the CFMEU, Construction & General Division

I write to express the concerns of the Fair Work Commission (FWC) about what appears to be an emerging trend of statutory contraventions by the ACT Branch of the Construction and General Division of the CFMEU (the Branch) and to seek clarification about a number of issues to assist the FWC in determining what further action might be required.

Set out below are specific issues which are the basis for these concerns and a series of questions to which your response is sought.

Entry permit RE2012/1939

On 22 November 2012 entry permit RE2012/1939 was issued to a Mr Halafihi Kivalu who at that time was an official of the Branch. On 17 July 2015, the fact that Mr Kivalu continued to hold RE2012/1939 was reflected on the FWC website which recorded him as a current permit holder.

Around 17 July 2015, however, I became aware of extensive media reporting concerning Mr Kivalu's arrest by the Australian Federal Police including him being charged with Blackmail following evidence he gave to the Trade Union Royal Commission (TURC). It was apparent from the extensive media coverage concerning Mr Kivalu's evidence to the TURC and his subsequent arrest for criminal offences that he had not been an official or member of the CFMEU since late 2014 and on that basis was not entitled to be listed on the FWC website as the holder of a current entry permit RE2012/1939 after his departure from the CFMEU.1

¹ In the Canberra Times on 15 July 2015 it was reported that 'Mr Kivalu's union membership was terminated – with a written notification of expulsion couriered to him - on Tuesday after the commission heard two days of allegations that he solicited and collected tens-of- thousands of dollars in cash from Canberra tradesman. CFMEU national secretary Dave Noonan has called for the allegations to be referred to the police, with a pledge that any subsequent investigation would have the co-operation of the union

On 17 July 2015 staff from the RCB contacted you by phone and also wrote to you requesting confirmation of the date Mr Kivalu ceased to be an official or employee of the CFMEU and also requested his entry permit be returned. I have attached that correspondence for ease of reference.

The records of the FWC indicate that you verbally advised Mr David Vale on 17 July 2015 that Mr Kivalu had not been an employee of the CFMEU since late in October 2014. By letter dated 23 July 2015 Mr Zachary Smith of your branch advised that Mr Kivalu ceased to be employed by the Union on 7 November 2014 and enclosed Mr Kivalu's entry permit RE2012/1939.

The FWC later became aware, via documents published on the TURC website, that on 10 November 2014, Mr Kivalu had written to you resigning 'immediately from the CFMEU'. The FWC also became aware that you provided evidence to the TURC on 8 October 2015 that Mr Kivalu had resigned in November 2014 although according to your evidence, he remained on the Branch Committee of Management and continued to attend meetings.²

The FWC has a number of concerns about these circumstances.

Firstly, it is very significant that between Mr Kivalu's resignation in November 2014 and the return of his entry permit in a letter dated 23 July 2015, it appears Mr Kivalu maintained possession of entry permit RE2012/1939. Mr Kivalu gave evidence to the TURC on 16 July 2015 that he was employed by a labour hire company and therefore he could have been exercising the rights associated with entry permit RE2012/1939 in any number of unfettered, inappropriate or unlawful ways. The fact that Mr Kivalu has, according to more recent media reports, entered a plea of guilty to blackmail charges only exacerbates that very significant concern.

Secondly, the fact that Mr Kivalu continued to hold an entry permit between 10 November 2014 until at least 17 July 2015³ and during that period appeared on the FWC website as a current permit holder, created very significant risks both to the integrity of entry permit system and also the reputation of the FWC. If, at the time of Mr Kivalu's arrest for criminal charges of blackmail, either the TURC or any media agency had conducted a simple entry permit search on the FWC web site, that search would have identified Mr Kivalu as a current entry permit holder. In the circumstances that Mr Kivalu had not been entitled to hold an entry permit since at least 10 November 2014, there would have inevitably been adverse publicity and consequential reputational damage to the FWC and its administration of the entry permit system.

It appears from the documents and your evidence to the TURC that as the Branch Secretary, you were personally involved in Mr Kivalu's resignation. In my view, the failures by Mr Kivalu to comply with s 517 of the Act and the failure by the Branch to ensure such compliance, exposed the FWC to these significant risks.

The specific contravention

Relevantly s 516(1)(a) of the Act provides that a permit expires in circumstances which include:

(b) when the permit holder ceased to be an official of the organisation that applied for the permit.

As you know, s 517 of the Act requires the following:

A permit holder must return an entry permit to the FWC within 7 days of any of the following things happening:

(c) the permit expires.

While I accept that the Act requires 'a permit holder' to return an entry permit to the FWC, the Branch is the applicant on behalf of the permit holder and has an obligation to ensure compliance with the Act.

I advise that I am giving consideration to referring this matter to the Fair Work Ombudsman for investigation regarding the contravention of s 517 of the Act.

Contravention of s 233(2) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act)

On 1 February 2016 you wrote to the FWC notifying of a change to the records of the Branch under s 233(2) of the RO Act. In your letter, you acknowledged that you were required to notify the FWC of a change to the records required to be kept under s 230(1) of the RO Act and provided the following.

'On 28 July 2015 the following changes were made in the records required to be kept under s 230(1)(c) of the RO Act:

You declared that the above information was correct and you acknowledged that the declaration was outside of the time allowed for such declarations under s 233 of the Act and sought an extension of time for lodgement. I note you provided reasons for the contravention of 233.

As you appear to be aware, s 233(2) of the RO Act obliges the 'organisation' to lodge with the FWC, within the prescribed period, notification of any change made to the records required to be kept under paragraphs 230(1)(b), (c) and (d) certified by declaration by the Secretary or other prescribed officer of the organisation. The prescribed period is 35 days.⁴

While it appears from the records that Mr Kivalu had ceased to be an employee of the Union as of 10 November 2014 and had also apparently ceased to be a CFMEU member at about that time, no advice was received about Mr Kivalu's position as a member of the Branch Committee of Management until 1 February 2016. Your written advice dated 1 February 2016 was that on 28 July 2015 a change was made to the records required to be kept under s 230(1)(c) of the Act that the Committee of Management office position of Mr Halafihi Kivalu was vacant.

The specific contravention

It appears from the information above that, even if 28 July 2015 had been the date on which the office actually became vacant, you have conceded a specific contravention of s 233(2) of the RO Act because the change was notified some eight (8) months after the date you state the change was made.

Further contravention of s 233(2) of the RO Act

On 23 March 2016 you provided further notifications of changes to records under s 233(2) of the RO Act. In your letter, you acknowledged that you were required to notify the FWC of a change in the records required to be kept under s 230(1) of the RO Act and set out that on 16, 22 and 24 July 2015 the following changes were made in the records required to be kept under s 230(1)(c) of the RO Act:

You declared that the above information was correct and you acknowledged that the declarations were each outside of the time allowed for such declarations under s 233 of the Act and sought an extension of time for lodgement. I note you provided what appeared to be identical reasons for the contravention of s 233 as you had in your 1 February 2016 letter concerning the Kivalu matter above.

You also set out the circumstances in which the contraventions of s 233 emerged and that the Branch has taken steps to its governance and administration procedures with a view, among other things, to ensure that such delays do not occur in the future.

The specific contravention

It appears from the information above that you have conceded three (3) specific contraventions of s 233(2) of the RO Act because the changes were notified some eight (8) months after the date you state the changes were made.

Matters requiring clarification

It will be clear from this correspondence that neither a formal inquiry under s 330 nor a formal investigation under s 331 of the RO Act has been commenced although the relevant contraventions in Chapter 8 of the RO Act are civil penalty provisions and therefore fall within the investigatory powers of the General Manager.

I advise that in the event of any inquiry or investigation or any subsequent proceedings commenced in the Federal Court, the FWC proposes to use any responses provided by the organisation or the Branch in those proceedings.

In relation to Mr Kivalu, please provide responses to the following:

- (a) What date did Mr Kivalu become an elected office holder on the Branch Committee of Management?
- (b) What date did Mr Kivalu actually cease to be an elected office holder of the Branch Committee of Management?
- (c) Please provide the specific dates that Mr Kivalu attended Branch Committee of Management meetings by reference to the Minutes of those meetings between his resignation on 10 November 2014 as an employee of the Branch and the date he was no longer an office holder of the Committee of Management.
- (d) What was the process, including by reference to the specific rules of the CFMEU which enabled the process, by which Mr Kivalu ceased to be a member of the Committee of Management?
- (e) Please provide the documentary evidence relied upon to determine the date upon which Mr Kivalu ceased to be a member of the Committee of Management.
- (f) Please provide reference to the rules of the CFMEU which enabled Mr Kivalu to continue to be a member of the Branch Committee of Management between the 10 November 2014 and the date upon which he ceased to be a member of the Committee of Management.

In relation to each of Mr King, Mr Gair and Mr Clemence

- (a) What date did each former Council Member become a Council Member?
- (b) What date did each former Council Member actually cease to be a Council Member?
- (c) For each former Council Member, please provide documentary evidence which identifies the process by which each person ceased to be a Council Member?

Please provide responses to these matters by Friday 22 April 2016.

Re: FWC Correspondence – CFMEU Construction and General Division ACT Divisional Branch

We refer to your letter of 11 April 2016.

We note your advice that should court proceedings arise in relation to the matters you raise in your letter, the FWC proposes to use any responses provided by the Union/Branch in those proceedings. Having regard to that advice, we respond as follows:

Kivalu

- 1. Mr Kivlau most recently became an elected member of the Divisional Branch Management Committee in the 2012 Divisional Branch elections (E2012/308). I note that that the declaration of the election in E2012/308 is available on the FWC website and that the date of Mr Kivlau's election is a matter of public record. Nonetheless, a copy of the declaration in respect of the Divisional Branch, which includes these details, is attached for your information.
- 3. Mr. Kivalu resigned from paid employment as an organiser with the Divisional Branch in November 2014.
- 4. Mr Kivalu was removed from the office of Divisional Branch Management Committee member by a special meeting of the Divisional Branch Management Committee on 28 July 2015. A copy of the relevant resolution is attached. This meeting was conducted in accordance with

the requirements of Rule 51 (in relation to removal from the Committee) and Rule 53 (in relation to expulsion from the Union). I note you have referred to an article in the Canberra Times dated 15 July 2015. The report is incorrect. Mr Kivalu's membership of the Union was not terminated on 14 July 2015. Mr Kivalu was sent a notice on 14 July 2015 advising that a special meeting to consider his expulsion from membership would occur on 28 July 2015.

- 5. The minutes of the Branch Committee of Management disclose that between the date of Mr Kivalu's resignation as an employee of the Branch and the date referred to in point 3 above, Mr Kivalu attended one meeting of the Divisional Branch Management Committee on 24 March 2015.
- 6. Notwithstanding that Mr Kivalu's paid employment with the Divisional Branch came to an end in November 2014, he retained his membership with the Branch until his expulsion from membership and removal from office on 28 July 2015. As you would no doubt be aware, as an elected member of the Divisional Branch Management Committee he was entitled to retain that office until his term of office expired or he resigned, or was otherwise removed from office.
- 7. In relation to Mr Kivalu's entry permit, as noted above, Mr Kivalu remained eligible to hold an entry permit during the period between 10 November 2014 and 28 July 2015 because he remained an official of the Union as that term is relevant defined by the *Fair Work Act 2009*. Mr Kivalu's entry permit expired on 28 July 2015 when he ceased to hold office. At the time the permit expired it had already been returned to the Commission. In any event, insofar as we are aware, Mr Kivalu did not purport to exercise rights as a permit holder after the cessation of his employment in November 2014. If you have any information to the contrary, please let us know.
- 8. In the circumstances, we say that there has not been any contravention of s.517 of the Act.

King, Gair and Clemence

- We refer to the enclosed declaration of results and note that that the declaration of the election in E2012/308 is available on the FWC website and that the date these officials were elected is a matter of public record.
- 2. We further advise that:
 - a. Mr King resigned in writing on 16 July 2015.
 - b. Mr Gair resigned in writing on 22 July 2015.
 - c. Mr Clemence resigned in writing on 24 July 2015.
- 3. We attach copies of letters of resignation signed by each former Council Member.

Delay in filing notices in pursuant to s 233 of the Act

You have noted that the Union has not filed notices in accordance with the timeframe required by s 233 of the Act in the case of Kivalu, King, Gair or Clemence. You have suggested that these are separate contraventions. It is our view that these are in fact a single course of conduct arising out of the particular and unusual circumstances which the Branch faced in late July and August 2015.

The Divisional Branch was the subject of hearings in the Trade Union Royal Commission on:

- 13 17 July 2015
- 20 24 July 2015
- 27 30 July 2015
- 4 6 August 2015
- 10 14 August 2015 (hearings also dealt with CFMEU NSW)
- 17 19 August 2015 (hearings also dealt with CFMEU NSW)
- 1 4 September 2015
- 6 October 2015 (hearings also dealt with CFMEU NSW)
- 7 8 October 2015

At various times all of the officers of the Divisional Branch and several of the staff were summoned to attend the Royal Commission. Some of the hearings took place in Canberra and some hearings took place in Sydney. When hearings took place in Sydney those summoned were required to travel to Sydney for significantly longer than the period that they were actually called before the Commission, because the summonses did not specify particular days for each official to appear. Even when not summoned to attend, senior officials of the Divisional Branch were required to spend substantial amounts of time instructing our legal advisors in relation to the proceedings.

In addition, the Divisional Branch was required to comply with notices to produce issued on 23 June 2015, 9 July 2015, 14 July 2015, 20 July 2015, (two notices), 21 July 2015, 4 August 2015 (two notices), 11 August 2015, 13 August 2015, and 2 September 2015. The need to conduct repeated searches of our records and to produce large numbers of documents at very short notice consumed a large amount of the Divisional Branch's administrative resources. It is not an exaggeration to say that during this period 90% of the officers and staff of the Divisional Branch were solely engaged on addressing those notices.

In addition, a result of matters arising out of the Royal Commission the Australian Federal Police conducted a raid of the Union's office on 25 August 2015. The effect of this raid was profoundly disruptive to the Union's record keeping and general administrative processes. Large numbers of documents were taken by the AFP and copies were not provided to us at that time. Subsequently, the conduct of the AFP in this raid was found by the ACT Supreme Court to be inconsistent with the terms of the search warrant which was purportedly being exercised. However, at the time the Union was obliged to spend considerable resources dealing with this search warrant and its consequences.

As we indicated in our original correspondence in relation to these matters two members of Divisional Branch staff who would ordinarily have had administrative responsibility for arranging the filing of s 233 notices were on maternity leave during the relevant period. To illustrate the significance of this absence in the circumstances I ask the Commission to note that we are a small branch and that at the time, not counting the two employees on maternity leave the Divisional Branch consisted of the Secretary and the Assistant Secretary, one legal officer, five organisers, one administrative/industrial officer and one membership officer. While ordinarily the absence of these

two staff members would have been able to be addressed within the Divisional Branch by other employees, in the particularly unusual circumstances of late 2015, outlined above, that absence had the effect that we did not turn our mind in a timely manner to our obligations under s 233.

You have indicated that the Commission's goal is to achieve high levels of voluntary compliance with the obligations set out in the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*. We suggest that in this case, in fact, a high level of voluntary compliance has been achieved. The Union has self-reported in relation to its failure to meet the time frames set out in the Act in relation to the s. 233 obligations which arose in July 2015. We have done our best to rectify the situation, by ensuring that our senior officials are aware of their obligations in this regard, to limit the risk that it will occur in future. It is our view that the circumstances of July/ August 2015 were very usual and unlikely to be repeated and consequently the risk of repeated failures of this kind is limited.

We note that there is not a history of breaches of this kind in the Divisional Branch.

We are genuinely concerned that this matter was not addressed in a more timely fashion and do not wish for these occurrences to be repeated. However we say that in the circumstances the public interest in, and value of, further formal investigation or prosecution of these matters will be negligible and we strongly urge that no further action be taken.
