- 5. lodgment of copies of the financial documents in the Industrial Registry under cover of a certificate by you in compliance with section 280(1) such certificate should confirm that the documents so lodged are copies of the documents presented to the meeting referred to in step 4 above the type of meeting and the date when it was held should be specified

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

To the members of the Construction Forestry Minerals and Energy-Union – Federated Furnishing Trades Society Union Division, Victoria Branch.

SCOPE

I have audited the financial statements, being a special purpose financial report, as well as inspecting the accounting records of the Construction Forestry Mining and Energy Union – Federated Furnishing Trades Society Union Division, Victoria Branch for the 12 months ended 31st December 2001. The Union's Committee of Management and Accounting Officer are responsible for the preparation and presentation of financial statements and the information they contain and have also determined that the accounting policies used and described in Note 1 to the financial statements are appropriate to meet the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and the needs of the members. I have conducted an independent audit of those financial statements in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Union and Industrial Relations Commission on their preparation and presentation. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used and described in Note 1 are appropriate to the needs of the members and the Industrial Relations Commission.

The financial statements have been prepared for distribution to the members for fulfilling the Committee of Management's financial reporting requirements under the Workplace Relations Act 1996. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial statements to which it relates to any other than the members and the Industrial Commission, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and significant estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements. These policies do not require the application of all statements of Accounting Concepts and Accounting Standards.

The audit opinion in this report has been formed on the above basis.

AUDIT OPINION

In my opinion, the accounts of the Construction Forestry Minerals and Energy Union - Federated Furnishing Trades Society, Victoria Branch are properly drawn up to ensure that:

- 1. They were kept by the organisation in respect of the twelve months ended 31st December 2001. Satisfactory accounting records detailing the sources and nature of the income of the organisation (including income of members) and the nature and purpose of the expenditure, and:
- The attached accounts and statements, prepared under the Historical cost convention, and in accordance with Section 273 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 as amended, are properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of;

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting -

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and applicable Accounting Standards other than membership contributions which are accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

The report is also prepared under the historical cost convention and except where stated does not take into account changing money values or current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report;

(a) Provision for Leave

Provision for Long Service Leave is raised against employees and Officials of the Society who have in excess of one year continuous service.

Annual leave is provided for all employees and officials pro rata from the date of employment using current rates of pay.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets has been calculated using both the Prime Cost and Reducing balance methods, at rates considered adequate to write such assets off over the period of their estimated economic life.

(c) Income Tax

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the Union is a branch of a Registered Industrial Trade Union that is exempt from Income Tax in accordance with the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended.

During the year the Victorian Branch paid fees for industrial relations consultancy to J Pagonis and Associates Pty Ltd of which Julie Pagonis is a director. Julie Pagonis is the daughter of the former branch Secretary and Divisional Office Secretary, Mr Lou Kyriacou. The majority of these payments were made on behalf of the Divisional Office and are dealt with in the Divisional Office accounts. All transactions were considered to be of a normal commercial nature.

11. CONTINGENT ASSET

As at balance date, three bank accounts exist and known as the Glass Picnic Fund, Glass Strike Fund and the Eureka Fund totalling \$125,911.99. At balance date these funds have not been recognised as assets of the Union as there currently exists doubt as to who has control of these funds. There is a Federal Court action pending in order to ascertain if these funds belong to the general Union membership, or a specific category of members.

12. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

The details and estimated maximum amounts of contingent Liabilities, classified according to party from whom the contingent liability arises are set out below. The executive are not aware of any circumstance or information which would lead them to believe that these liabilities will crystallise and consequently no provisions are included in the accounts in respect of these matters.

In respect of the Victoria Branch, the Victorian Trades Hall Council has submitted invoices for affiliation fees now totalling the sum of \$40,154.59. The Victorian Branch does not admit liability.
