1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stafed.

(a) PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at independent or Committee of Management valuation, less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed periodically by the Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows, which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal.

The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed periodically by the Board to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated over their useful lives to the Union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

(b) <u>EMPLOYEE BENEFITS</u>

Provision is made in respect of the Union's liability for annual leave, sick leave and long service leave arising from services rendered by officers and employees to balance date. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all officers and employees with more than 5 years service. Related on-costs are included in these provisions.

Contributions are made to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses where incurred.

(c) INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary, as the Union (being a registered Industrial Trade Union) is exempt from tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(d) Comparative Figures

Where required, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation in the current financial year.

(e) <u>INVENTORIES</u>

Inventories comprise promotional items and is valued at cost price being the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(f) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and fixed assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

(g) <u>Grants</u>

The Union receives grant funding from various sources for varying purposes. All funds received are isolated in the balance sheet, from which all expenditures are made. Given that the grant projects generally have an operating period that differs from the financial year-end, amounts are carried forward in the balance sheet:

- as an asset where expenditures exceed funding received to the balance date and where such expenditures are recoverable under the Terms of the Grant
- as a liability where funding received exceeds expenditures to the balance date and the grant is ongoing. Refer to Note 12, "Unexpended Grants Carried Forward". --

(f) RECLASSIFICATION OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Some line items and sub-totals reported in the previous financial year have been reclassified and repositioned in the financial statement as a result of the first time application on 1 January 2001 of the revised standards AASB 1018 Statement of Financial Performance, AASB 1034 Financial Report Presentation and Disclosures and the new AASB 1040 Statement of Financial Position. Adoption of these standards has resulted in the transfer of the reconciliation of opening to closing accumulated funds from the face of the statement of financial performance to Note 17.

The Committee of Management second meeting was held on 10 December 2002. I did omit to advise this date in my 6 January 2003 correspondence. As stated in my Secretary's Certificate, the Financial Statements were published in the "Summer Edition – December 2002" journal. I confirm that the Journal was published and distributed to Members on or around 1 December 2002.

The After Balance Date Event referred to in the Auditor's report is in relation to the integration of the Divisional entities previously known as the *Forestry*, Forest, Building Products and Manufacturing Division (Forestry Division) and the Federated Furnishing Trades Society Division (FFTS Division). The integration occurred pursuant to the "Scheme of Amalgamation" which formed the CFMEU.

On 11 February 2002, the Construction, Forestry, Mining & Energy Union National Executive passed a number of resolutions giving effect to the above mentioned integration. Relevant alterations to the Rule's were Certified by the Deputy Industrial Registrar on 19 July 2002 (R No's 5 and 118 of 2002). As a result of those Rule changes the new name of the Division became the Forestry, Furnishing, Building Products and Manufacturing Division (FFPD Division).

In respect to the Forestry Divisional and FFTS Divisional NSW Branch's, the physical/actual integration took place on 1 April 2002, that is, Membership, Finances, Administration, Offices, Organisers, etc., from both Divisional Branch's were merged into one and known as the Forestry, Furnishing, Building Products and Manufacturing Division, NSW Divisional Branch (FFPD Division, NSW Divisional Branch).

The Financial Reporting process for the year Ended 31 December 2002, will be conducted in the following manner:

An Audit of the FFTS Division NSW Divisional Branch accounts will be conducted for the period 1 January 2002 to 31 March 2002, the Branch Auditors will prepare a Financial Report and the reporting obligations under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 will be followed in respect to that report.

An Audit of the Forestry Division NSW Divisional Branch accounts will be conducted for the period 1 January 2002 to 31 March 2002, the Branch Auditors will prepare a Financial Report and the reporting obligations under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 will be followed in respect to that report.

An Audit of the FFPD Division NSW Divisional Branch accounts will be conducted for the period 1 April 2002 to 31 December 2002, the Branch Auditors will prepare a Financial Report and the reporting obligations under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 will be followed in respect to that report.
