This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 31 December, 2002.

The legislative scheme set out in Part IX, Division 11 of the Act is directed at ensuring that a registered organisation or a branch of such an organisation discharges obligations of accountability to its members in relation to its financial affairs through proper and regular disclosure of financial information. The various steps of the financial reporting requirements must be carried out within the time-scales prescribed by the legislation so as to ensure the relevance of the financial information provided to the members.

Now that the financial year has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation. Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the obligations arising under Part IX, Division 11 in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

I have adopted this course of action following advice from other Divisional entities of the CFMEU where similar integrations have occurred in the past and a consolidated report has been produced. Further, a consolidated report resulted in an expedited preparation of the report by our Auditors and commensurate cost savings in Audit fees.

I trust that this meets with your understanding and acceptance for the purposes of our reporting obligations. I will of course provide the Registry with copies of the report under cover of my Secretary's Certificate in accordance with section 280 of the Act., at the appropriate time.

I have received your correspondence of 22 January 2003, regarding the above.

In response to matters which require further information, I advise a follows:

The Committee of Management second meeting was held on 10 December 2002. I did omit to advise this date in my 6 January 2003 correspondence. As stated in my Secretary's Certificate, the Financial Statements were published in the "Summer Edition - December 2002" journal. I confirm that the Journal was published and distributed to Members on or around 1 December 2002.

The After Balance Date Event referred to in the Auditor's report is in relation to the integration of the Divisional entities previously known as the Forestry, Forest, Building Products and Manufacturing Division (Forestry Division) and the Federated Furnishing Trades Society Division (FFTS Division). The integration occurred pursuant to the "Scheme of Amalgamation" which formed the CFMEU.

On 11 February 2002, the Construction, Forestry, Mining & Energy Union National Executive passed a number of resolutions giving effect to the above mentioned integration. Relevant alterations to the Rule's were Certified by the Deputy Industrial Registrar on 19 July 2002 (R No's 5 and 118 of 2002). As a result of those Rule changes the new name of the Division became the Forestry, Furnishing, Building Products and Manufacturing Division (FFPD Division).

In respect to the Forestry Divisional and FFTS Divisional NSW Branch's, the physical/actual integration took place on 1 April 2002, that is, Membership, Finances, Administration, Offices, Organisers, etc., from both Divisional Branch's were merged into one and known as the Forestry, Furnishing, Building Products and Manufacturing Division, NSW Divisional Branch (FFPD Division, NSW Divisional Branch).

The Financial Reporting process for the year Ended 31 December 2002, will be conducted in the following manner:

An Audit of the FFTS Division NSW Divisional Branch accounts will be conducted for the period 1 January 2002 to 31 March 2002, the Branch Auditors will prepare a Financial Report and the reporting obligations under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 will be followed in respect to that report.

An Audit of the Forestry Division NSW Divisional Branch accounts will be conducted for the period 1 January 2002 to 31 March 2002, the Branch Auditors will prepare a Financial Report and the reporting obligations under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 will be followed in respect to that report.

An Audit of the FFPD Division NSW Divisional Branch accounts will be conducted for the period 1 April 2002 to 31 December 2002, the Branch Auditors will prepare a Financial Report and the reporting obligations under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 will be followed in respect to that report.

I trust the above satisfactorily responds to the information requested.

Scope

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2002

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

This financial report represents the merged Branch comprising the former Forestry and Forest Products Division – New South Wales Branch and the Federated Furnishing Trade Society Union Division, New South Wales Branch. The Industrial Registrar certified the rules of the newly formed Branch on 19 July 2002 having been lodged on 11 February 2002.

For the purposes of reporting to the members it has been deemed more appropriate to prepare these financial report as though the merger was effective from 1 April 2002. The Committee of Management believes that this financial report reflects the intention of the membership.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) <u>PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT</u>

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost less where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed periodically by the Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated over their useful lives to the Union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

(b) <u>EMPLOYEE BENEFITS</u>

Provision is made in respect of the Union's liability for annual leave, sick leave and long service leave arising from services rendered by officers and employees to balance date. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all officers and employees with more than 5 years service. Related on-costs are included in these provisions.

This year for the first time the Union recognised a provision for Severance. During the year the Union established a severance scheme, which has a deemed start date of 1 January 1999. Accordingly a non-recurring charge of \$62,085 representing entitlements accrued from 1 January 1999 to 31 December 2001 has been made. The current year entitlement charge of \$22,818 forms part of operating expenditure. No on-costs have been included on this provision.

Contributions are made to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses where incurred.

(C) INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary, as the Union (being a registered Industrial Trade Union) is exempt from tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(d) <u>COMPARATIVE FIGURES</u>

Where required, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation in the current financial year.

(e) <u>INVENTORIES</u>

Inventories comprise promotional items and are valued at cost price being the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(f) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and fixed assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is included as a current asset or liability in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are included in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

(g) Grants

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2002

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

This financial report represents the merged Branch comprising the former Forestry and Forest Products Division – New South Wales Branch and the Federated Furnishing Trade Society Union Division, New South Wales Branch. The Industrial Registrar certified the rules of the newly formed Branch on 19 July 2002 having been lodged on 11 February 2002.

For the purposes of reporting to the members it has been deemed more appropriate to prepare these financial report as though the merger was effective from 1 April 2002. The Committee of Management believes that this financial report reflects the intention of the membership.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) <u>PROPERTY</u>, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost less where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed periodically by the Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated over their useful lives to the Union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

(b) <u>EMPLOYEE BENEFITS</u>

Provision is made in respect of the Union's liability for annual leave, sick leave and long service leave arising from services rendered by officers and employees to balance date. Long service leave is accrued in respect of all officers and employees with more than 5 years service. Related on-costs are included in these provisions.

This year for the first time the Union recognised a provision for Severance. During the year the Union established a severance scheme, which has a deemed start date of 1 January 1999. Accordingly a non-recurring charge of \$62,085 representing entitlements accrued from 1 January 1999 to 31 December 2001 has been made. The current year entitlement charge of \$22,818 forms part of operating expenditure. No on-costs have been included on this provision.

Contributions are made to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses where incurred.

(C) INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary, as the Union (being a registered Industrial Trade Union) is exempt from tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

(d) <u>COMPARATIVE FIGURES</u>

Where required, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation in the current financial year.

(e) <u>INVENTORIES</u>

Inventories comprise promotional items and are valued at cost price being the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(f) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and fixed assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is included as a current asset or liability in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are included in the Statement of Cash Flows on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

(g) Grants

The Union receives grant funding from various sources for varying purposes. All funds received are isolated in the Statement of Financial Position, from which all expenditures are made. Given that the grant projects generally have an operating period that differs from the financial year-end, amounts are carried forward in the Statement of Financial Position:

- as an asset where expenditures exceed funding received to the balance date and where such expenditures are recoverable under the Terms of the Grant
- as a liability where funding received exceeds expenditures to the balance date and the grant is ongoing. Refer to Note 12, "Unexpended Grants Carried Forward".

Please confirm in writing when this has occurred.


