Re: CFMEU - FFP Division - Albury Sub-Branch of Pulp & Paper Workers Branch Financial Reporting Obligations under *Workplace Relations Act 1996*

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 31 December, 2002.

The legislative scheme set out in Part IX, Division 11 of the Act is directed at ensuring that a registered organisation or a branch of such an organisation discharges obligations of accountability to its members in relation to its financial affairs through proper and regular disclosure of financial information. The various steps of the financial reporting requirements must be carried out within the time-scales prescribed by the legislation so as to ensure the relevance of the financial information provided to the members.

Now that the financial year has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation. Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the obligations arising under Part IX, Division 11 in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

The documents have been filed, however, I would like to draw your attention to the following matters for your future reference:

Accounting Officers & Committee of Management Certificates

The copies that were received are not dated. Please ensure in future financial returns that the documents are dated. This is necessary for the Registry to determine whether the report complies with the sequence of events contemplated by the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*.

The sequence contemplated by the Act is that (1) prescribed statements are prepared; (2) the Auditor signs his or her report; (3) the audited accounts, statements and report are supplied to the members, and at least seven days later, (4) the audited accounts, statements and report are presented formally to a meeting of the Committee of Management (or general meeting of members). When these events have occurred, the Secretary prepares his or her certificate to accompany the lodgement of the documents.

The above sequence ensures that the auditor has the relevant documents on which to base his or her opinion, and that the members have adequate time to peruse the accounts and report before they are ratified and lodged.

Notes to Accounts - Notice under Section 274(4)

Section 274(4) of the Act states that accounts shall include a notice drawing to the attention of the members subsections 274(1), (2) and (3), and setting out those subsections. Attachment "A" to this letter provides an example of this notice for your future reference. Please ensure this notice is included in future returns.

Notes to the Accounts

In accordance with the requirements of the Act, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274 which read as follows:

- (1) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- (2) An organisation shall, on application under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such a manner, and within such time as prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.
