Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the Financial Report, being the Balance Sheet, Statement of Accumulated Funds, Income Statement, Statement of Cash Flows and Notes to and Forming Part of the Accounts, of the Construction, Forestry, Mining & Energy Union, Mining & Energy Division, South Australian Branch, for the year ended 31st December 2011.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Committee of Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the Financial Report and has determined that the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the Financial Report, which form part of the Financial Report, are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL REPORT For the year ended 31st December, 2011

Note 1. Accounting Methods

Membership Contributions are accounted for on a cash basis. Otherwise, the Financial Report is prepared under the Historical Cost Convention on an accruals basis and in accordance with the Accounting Standards jointly issued by the Australian Professional Accounting Bodies. In particular:-

- (a) The Financial Report has not been adjusted to reflect changes in the general purchasing power of the dollar or in the prices of specific assets.
- (b) Provision for Annual Leave and Long Service Leave has been made based on the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees, on the basis of their terms of employment.

Note 2. Divisional Rationalisation & Financial Support

Since 1st September 1996, the Mining & Energy Division, South Australian Branch, has operated financially via a loan account with the Construction & General Division of the CFMEU, South Australian Branch, utilising that Branch's Bank Account for all of its income and expenditure.

The Division will be able to continue operating provided it continues to receive the financial support of the Construction & General Division.

Note 3. Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, the attention of Members is drawn to the provisions of Section 272, which read as follows:-

- "(1) A Member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1)."

Note 4. Mining & Energy Division Sub Branches

The Mining & Energy Division operates sub-branches at Leigh Creek and Port Pirie in South Australia. These sub-branches are funded via a self-imposed levy that is added to the members' contributions, and is then redistributed via the Adelaide branch.

Note 5. Leigh Creek Levy Fund & Port Pirie Welfare Fund

Although the above Levy Funds are administered by the Union, the Levy Fund Bank Accounts are assets of the Members, and as such are not available to the Union for its ongoing operations.

Note 6. Salaries - Officials

Since 1st July 2000, the President of the SA Branch of the Mining & Energy Division has been employed by the SA Branch of the Construction & General Division of the CFMEU. His salary and on-costs continue to be allocated to the Mining and Energy Division via the Loan Account described in Note 2.



The financial year of the South Australian District Branch has recently ended. This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the obligation to prepare the reporting unit's financial documents and to lodge audited financial accounts and statements with Fair Work Australia within the prescribed time frame unless a 1 month extension is applied for and granted.

The documents you must lodge include:

(i) A general purpose financial report [see section 253(2)]; (ii) A Committee of Management statement (see the General Manager's Reporting Guidelines); (iii) An operating report [see section 254(2)]; (iv) An <u>auditor's report</u> [see sections 257(5) to 257(11)]; and (v) A <u>certificate</u> of the secretary or other designated officer [see section 268(c)].

I draw your particular attention to

- (a) \$237 which requires you to prepare and lodge <u>a separate statement</u> providing the prescribed particulars of any loan, grant or donation made during the year which exceeds \$1,000;
- (b) s265(5) which requires you to publish or otherwise provide your members with completed/signed copies of the audited accounts, report and statements before final presentation and lodgment; and
- (c) \$256 which requires you to present the completed documents to a second meeting (which, by past practice and under the rules will include Lodge meetings endorsing presentation to the Board).
