Re: CFMEU - Mining & Energy Division, South Western District Branch Financial Reporting Obligations under *Workplace Relations Act 1996* 

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 31 December, 2002.

The legislative scheme set out in Part IX, Division 11 of the Act is directed at ensuring that a registered organisation or a branch of such an organisation discharges obligations of accountability to its members in relation to its financial affairs through proper and regular disclosure of financial information. The various steps of the financial reporting requirements must be carried out within the time-scales prescribed by the legislation so as to ensure the relevance of the financial information provided to the members.

Now that the financial year has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation. Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the obligations arising under Part IX, Division 11 in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

- 4. presentation of the financial documents to a meeting of the members or the committee of management in compliance with sections 279(6) and (7) (following provision of copies to the members as per step 3 above)
- 5. lodgement of copies of the financial documents in the Industrial Registry under cover of a certificate by you in compliance with section 280(1) such certificate should confirm that the documents so lodged are copies of the documents presented to the meeting referred to in step 4 above the type of meeting and the date when it was held should be specified.

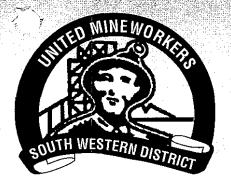

### Financial Statements (FR2002/825)

I refer to your letter of 14 November 2003 and enclosures.

As discussed yesterday with your office, I have examined these documents on a preliminary basis and would like to draw your attention to the following:

### Status of Documents

The entire financial report including the certificates of the accounting officer and board of management are all headed "draft only" and the signature blocks on the certificates, the auditor's report and summary of the financial report carry no signatures. It appears that a draft version of the report may have been enclosed with your letter. Please provide the final signed version for examination.

### **Donations**

The detailed statement of financial performance at page 19 includes an item described as "donations and presentations" adjacent to which is the amount \$10,755. If any individual donation exceeded \$1,000 a statement showing the relevant particulars must be lodged pursuant to subsection 269(1) of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* (the Act). I enclose a copy of this provision for your information. You will note that the particulars required are:

- (a) the amount of the grant or donation;
- (b) the purpose for which the grant or donation was made; and
- (c) except where the grant or donation was made to relieve a member of the organisation, or a dependant of a member of the organisation, from severe financial hardship—the name and address of the person to whom the grant or donation was made.

I note paragraph (v) of the certificate of the District Secretary dated 14 November 2003 refers to a statement of donations being "lodged herewith" but this document does not appear to be enclosed with your letter.

<u>Date of presentation of report, accounts and financial statements to members or committee of management</u>

Paragraph 4 of your covering letter states that the financial report was circulated and made available to members on 26 - 27 March 2003 and paragraph 5 states the report was subsequently tabled at the Board of Management Meeting held on the same days. Section 279(6) of the Act provides that:

- (6) Subject to subsection (7), an organisation shall cause the report, accounts and statements referred to in subsection (1) to be presented:
- (a) within the period (in this subsection and subsection (7) called the *relevant period*) starting on the eighth day after the report, accounts and statements are, or the summary referred to in subsection (2) is, supplied to the members and ending 28 days (or such longer period as a Registrar allows) after the end of the period referred to in subsection (3)—to a general meeting of the members of the organisation or a meeting of the committee of management of the organisation; or
- (b) if such a meeting is not due to be held within the relevant period—to the first meeting of the committee of management held after the relevant period.

This means that the "second meeting" at which the financial report must be presented must take place no earlier than eight days after the supply of the report to members. The purpose of this interval is to give members time to consider the report after it is supplied to them and, if they wish, to raise any matters at the "second meeting". From the contents of your letter, your organisation does not appear to have presented the report as required.

I would appreciate your comments and your advice on these matters. If you have any queries, please contact me.

Please arrange for these documents to be lodged and confirm the date of the "second meeting" by 30 January 2004.

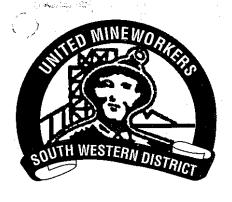

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2002

### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report.

### (a) COMPARATIVES

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

### (b) PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost less where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed periodically by the Board of Management to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated over their useful lives to the Union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvement.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

### (C) EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision for employee benefits in the form of untaken Sick Leave and Accrued Annual Leave have been made for the estimated accrued benefits of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment. Provision for employee benefits in the form of Long Service leave has also been made for the estimated accrued benefits of the Office Staff. Related on-costs are included in these provisions.

Contributions are made by the Union to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

### (d) INCOME TAX

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the Industrial Trade Unions are exempt from Income Tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

### (E) INVESTMENTS

Shares in listed companies held at balance date are carried at cost. The gains or losses realised are included in profit from ordinary activities.

Non-current investments are also measured on the cost basis. The carrying amount of non-current investments are reviewed periodically by the Union to ensure they are not carried in excess of the recoverable amount of those investments. The recoverable amount is assessed from the quoted market value for listed investments or the underlying net assets for other non-listed investments.

### 2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

- (a) In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274 which reads as follows:
  - (1) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
  - An organisation shall, on application made under sub-section (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
  - (3) A Registrar may only make an application under sub-section (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received of an application made at the request of the member.
