The Construction, Forestry, Maritime, Mining and Energy Union-Construction and General Division, Victoria-Tasmania Divisional Branch's Amended Officer and related party disclosure statement (ORP Statement)

Thank you for lodging your Branch's amended ORP statement. We note the amended ORP statement included non-cash benefits that Mr Setka obtained from legal services paid by the Branch.

Note 1: During the financial year, the Branch funded a malicious prosecution and false imprisonment proceeding brought by John Setka that related to matters that arose in the course of performing his role as Secretary of the Branch. The proceeding sought to: (a) recover legal fees that had been incurred in relation to defending earlier criminal charges brought against Mr Setka and another officer of the union; (b) publicly vindicate Mr Setka's legal rights in order to deter similar wrongs being committed against officers of the Branch in future; and (c) recover compensation for damages suffered by Mr Setka as a result of the original prosecution.
