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OPERATING REPORT

The Committee of Management present their operating report in respect of the year ended 31 December 2004 as follows:

Members of the Management Committee

The members of the Management Committee at any time during the year and the period for which he/she held the position were:

Each of the above members held the position for the full year.

Review of Activities

The principal activity of the Branch during the course of the financial year was to act as the Western Australian representative of the federally registered Construction, Forestry, Mining, and Energy Union – Construction and General Division. The primary role of the Branch is to act on behalf of and to further the interests of its members.

There were no significant changes in the nature of the Branch's activities during the year.

The results of the activities for the year are summarised as follows:

- Total income was \$4,055,185 which is similar to the prior year
- Within total income, subscriptions increased 19% to \$3,400,066 whilst the Defence Fund income and legal levy income fell substantially due to the cessation of those sources of fundraising, which related to the 2002 Royal Commission.
- The surplus for the year was \$99,837 compared with \$554,973 in 2003. Full details of income and expenditure are set out on page 4.

Significant Changes in Financial Affairs

Significant changes in the state of affairs of the Branch during the year were:

- Total assets increased to \$2,353,352 as at 31 December 2004 (2003: \$1,993,925) with the increase comprising additional Cash at Bank and Motor Vehicles.
- Total liabilities increased to \$925,014 as at 31 December 2004 (2003: \$665,424) with the increase comprising additional Sundry Creditors & Provisions for Holiday Pay / LSL.
 - Net Assets increased to \$1,428,338 as at 31 December 2004 (2003: \$1,328,501)

There were no other significant changes in the Branch's affairs during the financial period.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and the reporting guidelines made under section 255 of Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention and the accounting policies adopted are as follows;

(a) BASIS The accounts have not been adjusted to record either changes in the general purchasing power of the dollar or in the price of specific assets, unless otherwise stated.

- (b) MEMBERSHIP CONTRIBUTIONS Membership contributions are accounted for on a cash receipts basis.
- (c) NON CURRENT ASSETS

Non current assets acquired are brought to account at cost and are reviewed at least annually to determine whether their carrying amounts require write down to recoverable amounts.

Depreciation of furniture and fittings are calculated in order to write the assets off over their estimated useful life.

(d) INCOME TAX

No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997).

(e) EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision for employee benefits in the form of Long Service Leave, Accrued Annual Leave and related allowances have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements, as at year end, of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

Superannuation contributions made by the Branch are expensed when due.

(f) REGISTRATION STATUS

The Construction Forestry Mining and Energy Union Construction and General Division – WA Branch is a federally registered divisional branch of the Construction Forestry Mining and Energy Union.

(g) GOODS & SERVICES TAX (GST) Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST except:

- Where GST incurred on purchases is not recoverable from the ATO, GST is recognised as part of the cost of the purchase.
- Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included.

Australia is currently preparing for the introduction of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) effective for financial years commencing 1 January 2005. This requires the production of accounting data for future comparative purposes at the beginning of the current financial year (ie as at 1 January 2004).

The Branch's management, along with its auditors, are assessing the significance of these changes and preparing for their implementation.

The Committee of Management are of the opinion that the major differences in the Branch's accounting policies which will arise from the adoption of IFRS are:

- Impairment of Assets

The Branch currently determines the recoverable amount of an asset on the basis of either undiscounted or discounted (depending on the specific asset) net cash flows that will be received from the assets use and subsequent disposal. In terms of AASB 136: Impairment of Assets, the recoverable amount of an asset will be determined as the higher of the fair value less costs to sell and value in use. It is expected that this change in accounting policy will generally lead to impairments being recognised more often than under the existing policy. However, based on assets currently held, the Committee of Management anticipate no material change, if any, to the carrying value of assets as at 31 December 2005.

Branch Financial Return - year ending 31 December 2004 (FR2004/712)

I refer to the financial return of the Branch lodged in the Registry on 11 August 2005.

Before the documents can be filed, I would appreciate your comments on the following:

Provision of the financial report to members

The documents lodged include a two page "summary of financial report for the year ended 31 December 2004". A "summary" was an abridged version of the financial statements and auditor's report which, before the RAO Schedule¹ applied, could be given to members instead of the full set of accounts.

Under the RAO Schedule, however, the option of giving members a "summary" is no longer available. Instead, the legislation now gives the option of providing a "concise report" instead of the full report. The detail and other information required in a concise report are, however, quite different to the old "summary".

The summary attached to the documents lodged would not meet the requirements of a concise report.

Although your certificate indicates the "full report" (general purpose financial report, operating report and auditor's report) was provided to members, the presence of the "summary" indicates that perhaps this was provided instead of the full report. If the Branch has not provided the full report to members, it should now arrange to do so and, following provision to the members, present the full report to its committee of management or to a general meeting of members. Please let us know when the documents have been presented to the meeting.

Provision by posting on website

If the Branch has a website, it can provide the full report to members by posting it there. Members should be informed of its availability on the website and both financial and non-financial members should be able to gain access to the documents.

Committee of Management Statement

Please note the requirement to include the date of the resolution of the committee when preparing next year's Statement.
