#### **OTHER MATTERS PERTAINING TO ROLL OF VOTERS**

Where a workplace address is provided, in many cases both the office physical and postal addresses are shown on the membership records in Excel provided by the CPSU. However there are no separate fields in the data for physical as opposed to postal address resulting in both addresses being printed on the address label. This can result in incorrect delivery or at least confusion on the part of Australia Post. The AEC understands that steps are being taken by the CPSU to rectify this problem.

The rules concerning the roll of voters do not yet comply with Section 143 of Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act

#### **ALLEGATIONS OF IRREGULARITIES RECEIVED**

There were no written complaints or allegations of irregularities.

**OTHER MATTERS**

Ballot papers for the more senior positions directed voters to the CPSU's website, national phone number and email address for access to candidates statements which had been lodged with the union under rule 6.23 of the PSU Group rules. As this service is not provided for in the rules of the organisation, the AEC strongly suggested to the CPSU in September that this arrangement be enshrined in the rules so that there is a clear obligation on the returning officer to provide the advice on the ballot paper. The AEC would appreciate being consulted on the content of any proposed rule change concerning this advice to voters appearing on the ballot paper.

Provided the above conditions are met, the AEC feels that this is an ideal opportunity to use electronic rather than hardcopy material in the conduct of elections within the constraints of the legislation. It should also assist in giving voters an informed choice based on candidates' claims for election as permitted under rule 6.23 of the PSU Group rules.

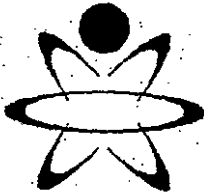

RE: Sub-section officer positions, CSIRO Section CPSU

I write with respect to elections for various CSIRO Section Sub-section officer positions, which have become casually vacant. These got caught up with the CPSU notification of elections to the Registrar, and there is a need to clarify the status of these positions.

## Background

As you are aware, in a decision of February 2001, the Deputy Industrial Registrar granted an exemption from conduct by the AEC for the CSIRO Section, CPSU Sub-section officer positions.

These positions are defined pursuant to the CPSU Rules, specifically Chapter B, Rule 8.2, and to the extent it is consistent with 8.2, Chapter B, Rule 3.18. Each of the 8 Sub-sections in the CSIRO section has 4 officer positions – President, Deputy President, Secretary and Treasurer, elected by and from the members of that Sub-section for a two-year term.

The Rules further (8.4) provide for the Section Council to appoint a returning officer to run the elections in the event the Registrar does not arrange for their conduct. Casual vacancies are to be filled by the relevant Sub-section Delegates Committee (SDC) appointing someone, but an election is necessary if the vacancy occurs more than 12 months before the end of term of office (Rule 8.5).

Rule 8.2 provides for the term of office for Sub-section officers to be two years, commencing 1 July in even numbered years starting in 1998. Due to oversight and confusion about the role of the AEC under the then rules an election was not held in 2000. Following the decision from the Deputy Registrar, I, as Returning Officer, conducted an election in 2001 for a term of office of one year to bring the term of office into line with the rules (see attached copies of relevant newsletters).

In 2002 again an election was held (see attached newsletter) with term of office going to 30 June 2004. Unfortunately we have not been able to locate relevant nomination documents for 2002, and there is no record of a formal declaration of the poll. It is clear from the records we do have that there were no contested positions. As advised to you, we now have a number of casual vacancies in Sub-section officer positions.

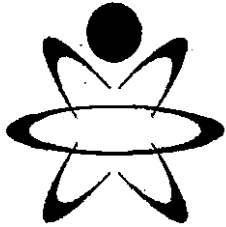

## Inquiry into the AAHL Fatality – Final Report Issued

The CSIRO Committee of Inquiry has finalised its report on the death of Set Van Nguyen in Geelong last December. The Report is now on the Intranet and accessible to all staff. The Staff Association was represented on the Inquiry by Victorian Organiser Gerry Harris. Gerry and other members of the Committee should be congratulated on their thorough consideration of the circumstances which led to the tragedy. It is important that the Report is read and considered by as many staff as possible to help ensure that no one else in CSIRO dies at work.

Any serious incident will stem from a range of factors, coming together in an unforeseen way. The Report thoroughly documents the factors which came together to cause Set's death, in the process highlighting the importance of the findings of the 2001 CSIRO Health and Safety Culture Review. The Staff Association strongly endorsed that Review. Our longstanding concerns about improving the strong public commitment of all levels of management to a safe and healthy working environment are central to the recommendations of the Report being addressed. Apart from the broader cultural issues, other key points include:

- Considering OHS implications as well as reducing costs when changing maintenance and engineering systems
- Rigorously assessing and managing hazards such as liquid nitrogen stores

The Staff Association is committed to providing better support for Health and Safety Reps (HSRs), and working with them to improve safety. In that context, our enterprise bargaining claims include the proposal for a \$500 annual allowance for HSRs.

### Women Achieving In Science – 2

The first conference was an outstanding success – the second will be bigger and better than ever. The Second National Conference on Women In Science Technology and Engineering is on 18 - 19 July 2002 at the University of Sydney Faculty of Nursing.

It is the only conference in Australia that brings together women from all areas of science, engineering, mathematics, technology to network and discuss the issues affecting them in progressing careers for women in science. Topics to be covered include competition and funding, public and professional recognition, mentoring, new ways of working, science education and equality of opportunity in careers. Even though the program is still being developed, we already have a great line-up of outstanding women to lead discussions.

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## News from Staff Association Council

Staff Association Council, along with additional representatives from the delegate committees in each state and territory, met in Melbourne 3-5 May. Council was addressed by Senator Kim Carr, Shadow Minister for Science and Research, and Dr Rod Hill, Chief of CSIRO Minerals and Chair of the Corporate Health and Safety Committee, and worked on identifying priority issues in the next 12 months. These were identified as:

- Enterprise bargaining - concluding an acceptable agreement
- OHS - building a more consistent and better supported network of reps and committees
- Advocating for the rights of Term staff
- Triennial funding and the adequate supplementation of agreed pay increases

The meeting decided to participate in a broader CPSU Science Division with members in the other science agencies, subject to adequate safeguards to our autonomy being articulated in a resourcing agreement with the CPSU National Council. Also, the meeting endorsed policy statements on Equity and the Work for the Dole scheme in CSIRO, which will be placed on our website.

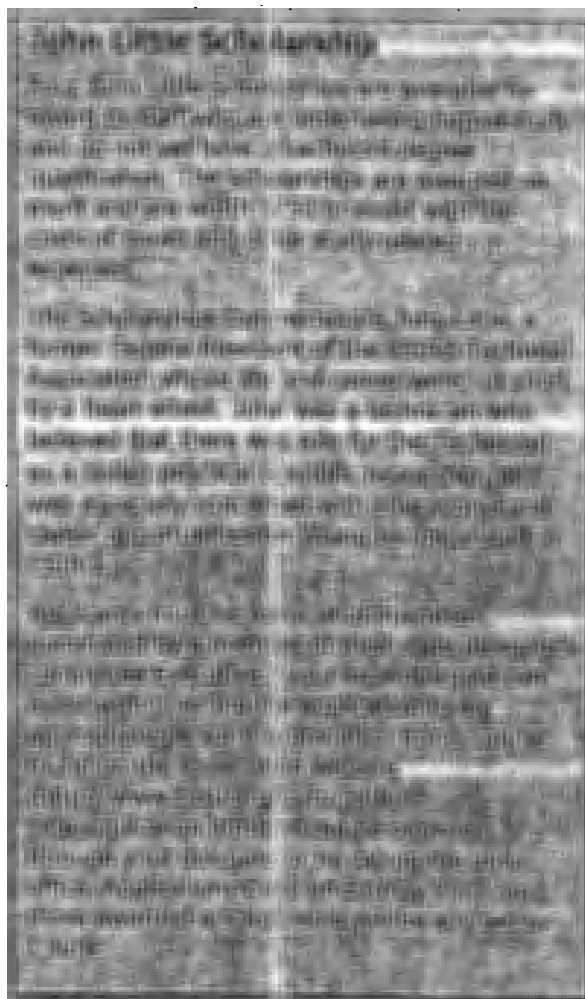
## Salary Packaging FYI

## News from Staff Association Council

Staff Association Council, along with additional representatives from the delegate committees in each state and territory, met in Melbourne 3-5 May. Council was addressed by Senator Kim Carr, Shadow Minister for Science and Research, and Dr Rod Hill, Chief of CSIRO Minerals and Chair of the Corporate Health and Safety Committee, and worked on identifying priority issues in the next 12 months. These were identified as:

- Enterprise bargaining - concluding an acceptable agreement
- OHS - building a more consistent and better supported network of reps and committees
- Advocating for the rights of Term staff
- Triennial funding and the adequate supplementation of agreed pay increases

The meeting decided to participate in a broader CPSU Science Division with members in the other science agencies, subject to adequate safeguards to our autonomy being articulated in a resourcing agreement with the CPSU National Council. Also, the meeting endorsed policy statements on Equity and the Work for the Dole scheme in CSIRO, which will be placed on our website.

By now I hope you all have seen the results of the CSIRO wide staff poll - Insight. You should have seen the results for your Division as a whole and for your Program or Work Area - if you haven't, check with your Manager or with your HR group. Also, some of you will have participated in follow up activities.

I'd like to ask you to focus on the poll itself. ISR, the company which conducted the poll have a 5 year contract with CSIRO to carry out an annual staff poll - so you'll be asked to fill out a questionnaire again at the end of this year. What would you like to change? What questions did you really want to be asked? What feedback/explanations did you want and not get? There will be a meeting of the CSIRO-wide Steering Committee overseeing the poll in late May to look at those questions.

We need your input to make the poll as useful as possible, so please send any concerns, ideas, suggestions, criticisms to me or to your Union rep for passing on to me. Don't sit back and think that someone else will cover the things that concern you - they may not and anyhow its always useful to know whether an issue is relevant to a few or many staff.

One of the areas that I have difficulty with is the "Comments" section. When the Steering Committee set up the poll we were adamant that there be a section for staff to make comments. However, the reality on my own site has been that it has been difficult to make good use of those comments. For reasons of confidentiality, I and the other Managers have not had access to the comments (which we understand), only a precis of their general themes. And that makes it difficult to address the concerns in a concrete way.

The ideal is to build towards a culture where no-one feels they need anonymity to raise issues - but until we get there, what do we do? And what would be the first step(s) in getting to that culture? I'd love to hear from you.

Dear Editor

The piece on OHS&E in the March Wavelength contains a misleading statement about the dangers of nitrogen. It asks how many staff had felt a bit woozy and failed to report it. This suggests that in a high nitrogen and low oxygen environment there are warning signs (a common assumption and one that I had made before Set's death) and that you therefore have a chance to get out. In fact the real danger is that there are no warning signs - you can't see it or smell it and it is not toxic - it simply turns the brain off and within a couple of breaths you are unconscious.
