Rule 3.8 i and j provide some guidance to the returning officer in formatting the ballot paper for National positions although the AEC believes that the rule should be more clearly worded. The format of the ballot paper is attached to this report and was in a different format to all other ballot papers used in the election. On the national ballot paper, voters were instructed to vote across the page similar to below-the-line voting in Senate elections, however informal voting figures show that this may have proved confusing to some voters especially where preferences for more than one candidate were required.

NOMINATIONS - Nominators

Rule 3.5d states that nominations shall be signed by two financial members who are eligible to vote in the election and by the person nominated. The AEC interprets 'who are eligible to vote in the election' narrowly as meaning eligible to vote for the particular office. For example a candidate for a Section Councillor position needs to be nominated by two members of that particular elecorate/sub-branch. This can result in defective nominations in some cases as a person's nominator may work nearby in the workplace but is in a different electorate or sub-branch. If the CPSU believes that the rule should be interpreted more broadly to widen the nominator eligibility criteria, then rule 3.5d needs to be amended.

NOMINATIONS – Team Nominations

Rule 3.7 Provides for the lodgement of a 'Team Nomination' (TN) for national officer positions and provides some guidance in processing Team Nominations. This was a new rule used for the first time in these elections and was applied by the AEC as follows:

- A group of candidates for National Officer positions may nominate as a Team Nomination (TN), which must have a name
- The name of a TN must not be the same as another team nomination or be deceptive in any way.
- Where the name of a TN uses the name of one of the candidates in the team, the first and last name of the candidate must be used.
- A TN cannot use as its name the name of any candidate in the election who is not a member of the team.
- Procedures for dealing with TN name issues are contained in the rules.
- A TN must include a candidate for each National Office which is being contested, that is, when all nominations have been processed and either accepted or rejected, a TN is only valid if it includes a nomination (whether accepted or rejected) for each office which is being contested, that is, where a ballot is necessary.
- An incomplete TN, that is, one that does not include a nomination for each position, cannot be

- rectified/made complete after the close of nominations the RO will reject the team but treat the nominations as individual nominations.
- TN must be signed by each candidate and contain two nominators for each candidate.
- A withdrawn candidate (withdrawn prior to the close of nominations) can be replaced by another person who is not a member of any other TN and who consents to becoming a member of a TN. If a withdrawn candidate is not replaced by the close of nominations and the withdrawal renders the TN invalid (no nomination for each contested office), the RO will reject the team but treat the nominations as individual nominations.
- Ineligibility of a TN candidate does not invalidate the TN.

CANDIDATE STATEMENTS

Rule 3.23d provides that candidates for certain positions may lodge a statement of up to 250 words for distribution with the ballot material and that the order of statements printed be in ballot paper order.

As no other guidance is provided in the rules in relation to the publication of these statements, the AEC took the following view in relation to issues surrounding the lodgement of candidate statements:

- Statements must be received by the returning officer not later than 14 days after the close of nominations or not later than the time for lodgement of election claims by candidates for inclusion in the National Journal or other PSU Group publication under rule 3.23(a).
- Statements can only be lodged for positions specifically mentioned in rule 3.23d, that is; candidates cannot lodge statements for the positions of Section Councillors, Sub-Section officers, etc.
- Photographs, pictures and diagrams are not permitted
- A candidate for multiple positions is entitled to lodge a statement for each office for which the person is nominating
- A combined statement of more than 250 words for a Team Nomination is not permitted—TN candidates need to lodge individual candidates
- More than one document was necessary, that is, one document for national positions and separate documents for Governing Councillor and Section Secretary offices.

In addition the permitted content of the statements is not prescribed in the rules (eg personal details, employment history, policies, how-to-vote tickets etc) – the AEC believes that rule 3.23d should be expanded to address this and some or all of the other issues mentioned above.

COMMENTS - THE ROLL OF VOTERS

- Rule 3.4d of the PSU Group rules provides that the roll of voters shall be closed 28 days
 before the date on which nominations open. Consideration should be given to altering this
 day to a day closer to the opening of nominations (whilst still complying with s143 (3) of
 Schedule 1B of the Act) as there were logistical and voter eligibility problems encountered
 by both the CPSU and the AEC in closing the roll at such an early date.
- Advice received by the AEC in relation to the rules concerning the close of the rolls and section 143(3) of Schedule 1B of the Act resulted in the following determinations by the returning officer:
 - No additions to the roll were permitted after the roll close day unless inadvertently omitted previously
 - ➤ Deletions were processed up to the opening date of the ballot these included persons who were no longer members or deceased members
 - Members who became unfinancial after the roll close day were still entitled to vote provided they were still members on the opening day of the ballot
 - No changes were permitted to a member's Section or Sub- Section /Electorate details (and therefore eligibility to vote status) after the roll close date
- Rule 3.8d provides that ballot papers shall be posted to the home address of members
 unless requested otherwise. The AEC believes that the CPSU needs to be rigorous in
 urging members to advise it of not only change of workplace but also change of home
 address. Where no current home address was available ballot papers were posted to the
 voter's workplace address.

ALLEGATIONS OF IRREGULARITIES RECEIVED

Number of complaints / allegations	 Complaints were received concerning the roll of voters for members attached to Section 15 (Food Inspectorial Section). Investigations revealed that the names and postal addresses for most members had been transposed on the list provided by the CPSU, that is, the addresses contained in the postal address field had slipped one line and were matched against the name next appearing after the correct member's name.
	 Some complaints were received concerning the AEC's interpretation of the candidates' statement rule (r3.23d) in that candidates for Section Councillor could not lodge statements.
	 One verbal complaint was received concerning the ineligibility of an elected candidate's nominators.
	 One or two complaints were received concerning non-receipt of ballot material in time to cast a vote.

Action taken by AEC	A corrected section 15 list of members was received from the CPSU and ballot papers were re-issued to all section 15 members. An information slip was included with the ballot material and a copy is attached to this report.
	Complainants were advised of the AEC's view that only candidates for offices specifically mentioned in rule 3.23d were permitted to lodge candidate statements.
	The complainant was advised to put his complaint in writing but is yet to do so.
	 Non-receipt of ballot material was generally due to failure of members to update their home address with the CPSU.




