





Arrangement for conduct of election - amending decision.

[1] On 19 July 2013 I made arrangements for the conduct of an election for various offices and positions in the PSU Group of the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union. It has come to my attention that the decision did not state the correct Section Officer vacancies for two sections in Schedule A and did not correctly describe the names of three sub-sections in Schedule B. In Schedule A, the vacancy of “Section Secretary” indicated adjacent to Section 24 Tax should have been “Deputy Section President” and the vacancy of “Deputy Section President” indicated adjacent to Section 14 Sustainability, Environment, Water, Heritage and the Arts should have been “Section Secretary”. In Schedule B the sub-section described as “22.03 AQUIS Victoria and Tasmania” should have been “22.03 AQUIS Victoria and Tasmania”, the sub-section described as “22.08 AQUIS Northern Territory” should have been “22.08 AQUIS Northern Territory” and the sub-section described as “32.01 Department of Industry, Innovation Science, Research and Tertiary Education” should have been “32.01 Department of Industry, Innovation, Climate Change, Science, Research and Tertiary Education”. I have amended my decision accordingly.

[2] I am satisfied that an election for the offices and positions set out in Schedules A and B (as amended) is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.
