I have received your Secretary's Certificate accompanied by the financial documents of the reporting unit for the year ended 30 June 2004. The documents were received in this office on 6 May 2005.

The documents have been filed.

Although the documents have been filed I draw your attention to the following matters.

Documents to be presented to a general meeting of members

Your Secretary's Certificate states that the full report was presented to a meeting of the Committee of Management as distinct from the documents being presented to a general meeting of members.

The standard obligation under subsection 266(1) of Schedule 1B of the Act requires the full report to be presented to a general meeting of members of the reporting unit within 6 months of the end of the financial year. The option to present the report directly to a Committee of Management meeting is only available where the rules of an organisation make provision that a general meeting of the reporting unit may be called to consider a financial report, upon demand of no more than 5% of the members of the reporting unit (see s266(3)).

The rules of the SPSF Group do not appear to contain a provision envisaged by Schedule 1B to permit any variation from the standard requirement for the presentation of the financial reports. In these circumstances the organisation remains obliged to present the full report to a general meeting of members. Unless the SPSF Group rules contain such a provision there will be a continuing obligation to present the yearly financial reports, in this case, to a series of meetings that "constitute" a general meeting. For your information I have enclosed a sample rule (attachment A) that meets the requirements of s266(3).

Lodgement of documents in Registry

Section 268 of Schedule 1B of the Act provides that the full report must be lodged in the Industrial Registry together with the Secretary's Certificate within 14 days of presentation to the meeting held under s266 of the Act. Please ensure in future that this timeframe is complied with.

- GENERAL MEETING - FINANCIAL REPORTS

- (1) The National Secretary shall summon a meeting of the members of the Union upon receipt of a written request signed by no less than 5% of the membership of the Union calling for a General Meeting for the purpose of considering the auditors report, the general purpose financial report and the operating report.
- (2) A General meeting of the members of the Union called pursuant to this Rule may be conducted as a series of meetings held at different locations.
- (3) The National Secretary shall give 28 days notice to the members of the Union of any General Meeting called pursuant to this Rule.
- (4) The National Secretary shall give notice of any meeting to be conducted pursuant to this Rule by written notice sent or delivered to and posted on a conspicuous place at each members place of employment or by email communication to each member or by notice published on the Union website to all members who have immediate access to that website.
- (5) A meeting conducted pursuant to this rule is taken to have been completed at the time of the last of the meetings in any series of meetings.
- (6) All decisions at a meeting called in accordance with the Rule shall be taken by a show of hands except where a resolution is carried which determines to submit the question to a secret ballot.
- (7) Attendance at meetings conducted under this rule shall be recorded and such attendance records shall be used to ensure that each member records only one vote.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2004

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards including the disclosure requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the financial report which, unless otherwise stated, have been consistently applied:-

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where otherwise stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

All income and expenditure of the Union has been brought to account on an accruals basis of accounting so as to match income for the period with the expenditure incurred in earning that income.

(b) Employee Entitlements

Provision has been made in the financial report for the Union's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, recreation leave and long service leave which will be settled after one year have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at their expected present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

(c) Income Tax

No provision has been made in the financial report for income tax on the basis that the Union is exempt under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (formerly Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936).

(d) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated in the financial report at historical cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of all fixed assets is reviewed annually by the Executive Committee to ensure the amount at which each asset is recorded in the books of the Union does not exceed its recoverable amount.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2004 (CONTINUED)

(e) Comparatives

Where necessary, comparative information has been reclassified to achieve consistency in disclosure with changes in presentation in the current year.

2. WORKPLACE RELATIONS ACT 1996

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 272, which reads -

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

3. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The members of the Executive Committee are unaware of any contingent liability, the effect of which may be material in relation to the financial report.

4. EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO BALANCE DATE

The Executive Committee is unaware of any events which have arisen subsequent to balance date, the effect of which may be material in relation to the financial report.
