The rules of the CPSU require all elections to be conducted under the Proportional Preferential System.

Reasons for election.

Election for offices and positions marked A to D is required as the term of office are due to expire in the normal course of events under the rules of the organisation.

Elected by:

The electorate for the direct voting system for offices marked A is all financial members of the Branch

The electorate for the direct voting system for offices marked B is all financial members of the relevant electorate (see table below).

The electorate for the collegiate electoral system for offices marked C is members of the Branch Council (totalling a maximum of 18 persons).

The electorate for the collegiate electoral system for offices marked D is the Branch delegates to Federal Council (totalling 4 persons).

Nominations open:

The rules of the Branch require that this election be conducted such that the result is declared not earlier than the 1st of May and not later than the 30th June in each even-numbered year. The Branch Council has resolved that the elections should be conducted at the earliest opportunity in accordance with the rules.

The election will need to be held in three stages as the electorate for offices marked C is not known until the election of offices marked A & B is declared and the electorate for offices marked D is not known until the election of offices marked C is declared.

In all cases the cut off date for the roll of eligible voters will be 7 days prior to the opening of nominations.

Electorates.

The membership of the Branch is allocated into electorates according to Branch rule 9.

- 9.1 The members of the Branch shall be allocated to electorates to be known as Electorate 1, Electorate 2, Electorate 3, Electorate 4, Electorate 5, Electorate 6, Electorate 7, Electorate 8, Electorate 9, Electorate 10 Electorate 11 and Electorate 12.
- 9.2 **Electorate 1** shall be known as the **Higher Education Electorate** and shall consist of all members who are employed in or by a body which the Branch Council declares to be a Higher Education Body.
- 9.3 **Electorate 2** shall be known as the **Health Electorate** and shall consist of all members who are employed in or by a body which the Branch Council declares to be a Health Body.
- 9.4 **Electorate 3** shall be known as the **Government Service Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Government Service body.
- 9.5 **Electorate 4** shall be known as the **Treasury Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Treasury body.
- 9.6 **Electorate 5** shall be known as the **Justice Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Justice body.
- 9.7 **Electorate 6** shall be known as the **School Education and Libraries Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a School Education or library body.
- 9.8 Electorate 7 shall be known as the Primary Industry, Information & Land Services Electorate and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Primary Industry, Information or Land Services body.
- 9.9 **Electorate 8** shall be known as the **Technical Education Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Technical Education body.
- 9.10 **Electorate 9** shall be known as the **Tourism Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Tourism body.
- 9.11 **Electorate 10** shall be known as the **Resources Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Resources body.

- 9.12 **Electorate 11** shall be known as the **Business Enterprise Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be a Business Enterprise body.
- 9.13 **Electorate 12** shall be known as the **Emergency Services Electorate** and shall consist of all members employed in or by a body which Branch Council declares to be an Emergency Service body.

Branch rule 8 provides that one Councillor will represent each electorate on Branch Council for each 300 members or part thereof. Branch rule 9.14 provides that the minimum size of an electorate is 150 members. Rule 12H of the Federal Chapter C rules provides that electorates are determined from the financial members as at 31st December in the year preceding the election.

As at 31 December 2005 the number of members in Electorate 8 – Technical Education Electorate was less than 150. Under Branch Rule 9.14, Branch Council has therefore allocated these members to Electorate 6 – Schools & Libraries Electorate.

After allocation of the members from Electorate 8 to Electorate 6 the details of financial members of each electorate as at 31 December 2005 and therefore the number of Councillor positions for each electorate is as follows:
