Community and Public Sector Union SPSF Group Tasmanian Branch Financial Report for the year ended 30 June 2012 - [FR2012/483]

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report of the Community and Public Sector Union - SPSF Group, Tasmanian Branch (CPSU-SPSF Tas). The documents were lodged with the Fair Work Commission (FWC) on 10 September 2012.

It is my understanding that FWC has been working with CPSU-SPSF Tas once it was discovered that the Community and Public Sector Union (State Public Services Federation Tasmania) Inc., a state registered body, general purpose financial reports had in the past been lodged with and filed by FWC. I understand that discussions have centred on the proposal for CPSU-SPSF Tas to apply for a certificate under s.269 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act) which would enable reduced reporting requirements due to CPSU-SPSF Tas having substantial common membership with a state registered body.

As you are aware, I have recently been advised that there are significant legislative difficulties relating to the issuing of a s.269 certificate for a reporting unit which is registered under the Industrial Relations Act 1984 (Tas. In accordance with that advice, I am unable to issue a s.269 certificate to CPSU-SPSF Tas. I am aware that the CPSU-SPSF Tas has recently re-lodged its 2013 financial return to the FWC in accordance with the requirements of Part 3 Division 5 of Chapter 8 of the RO Act. This financial return has been filed by the FWC.

Based on the above mentioned advice in relation to the issuing of a s.269 certificate and the fact that CPSU-SPSF Tas has re-lodged its2013 financial return, I have now authorised the closure of the CPSU-SPSF Tas financial report for the year ended 30 June 2012, FR2012/483. You are not required to take any further action in respect to this file.

Future requirements

The FWC is currently reviewing these circumstances and if appropriate, will consider seeking to have Regulation 163 of the RO Regs amended to remedy this anomaly for those reporting units registered in Tasmania. In the meantime however and until the potential anomaly has been resolved, future financial reports for the CPSU-SPSF Tas must adhere to the requirements of Part 3 Division 5 of Chapter 8 of the RO Act.

As stated previously, FR2012/483 has been closed and no further action is required on this file.

I Mathew Johnston, being the Assistant General Secretary of the CPSU (SPSFT) Inc, report operations for the year ended 30 June 2012 as follows:

Review of Principal Activities

- 1. Representing individual members in grievance disputes with employers resulting in members being treated fairly and their rights respected.
- 2. Representing all members at various workplaces regarding disputes with employers resulting in a fair outcome.
- 3. Negotiate Enterprise Bargaining Agreements resulting in increased wages and conditions for members covered by those Agreements.
- 4. Negotiate Industrial Agreements at a number of worksites resulting in the settlement of disputes or resulting in flexible working arrangements.
- 5. Representing members in the Tasmanian Industrial Commission in unfair dismissal cases resulting in a fair outcome for members.
- 6. Monthly committee and finance meetings to initiate, monitor and evaluate operational and finance activities.
- 7. Providing Union Delegates and Worksite Committee members with training and education to enable them to better represent members in the workplace.

No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

The surplus of the union for the financial year amounts to \$38,103. There were no significant changes to the financial affairs during the year.

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

- a) The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs.
 Subscription income is recognised on receipt as provided under Section 252 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.
- b) "Land & Buildings are stated at 2011 Independent Valuation". Property and equipment is stated at the lower of cost less depreciation or the recoverable amount. With the exception of land, property and equipment is depreciated over the expected useful life of each asset using the straight-line basis. Depreciation rates for each class of depreciable assets are:

Sick Leave - on cessation of employment no sick leave is paid out therefore no current liability is held Retirement & Super - not a retirement fund organisation therefore recorded as expense when occurs It is noted this policy has changed from prior years, when the threshold from non-current to current was 5 years.

1A Impact of adopting Australian Equivalents to IFRS

General purpose financial reports for years ending 2006 onwards are required to restate accounting policies and financial reporting from current Australian Standards (AGAAP) to Australian equivalents of international Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). The Union's Management Committee considers the effect to be immaterial.

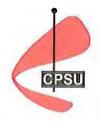
