Your primary review

Your ORP statement had a **primary review** which checked whether it was signed by an officer, lodged on time, included the required NIL statements and whether you met the requirements that the ROC raised with you last year.



Your ORP statement satisfied the requirements of the primary review and has been uploaded to the ROC website.

The ROC's risk-based approach

This year your ORP statement was assessed against a primary review. A primary review does not check all legislative requirements.

Over a five year period the ORP statement of every organisation and branch will be subject to at least one advanced review.

An advanced review is a more comprehensive review which includes amongst other things, an assessment of whether there are any inconsistencies between the disclosures set out in the ORP statement and the Branch's financial report. The ROC's [advanced review checklist](#) is published on our website.

In assessing the Branch's 2020 ORP statement we have noted that the current CPSU – SPSFT Inc. rules (at July 2019) prescribe that the offices of the CPSU (SPSFT) Inc. (the **state registered association**) are held by persons elected to the corresponding positions in the CPSU (SPSF Group) Tasmanian Branch (the **Branch**). In other words, the officers of the state registered association and the Branch are one and the same.

As you are aware, for the purposes of the disclosures required to be made under sections 293B and 293BC of the RO Act, these will include any payments made to Branch officers by reason of their holding a position on the committee of management of the state registered association.

It would assist our future assessment, and members understanding of the disclosures set out in the Branch's ORP statements, if a short note could be included in the ORP statement which clearly explains the dual roles held by the Branch officers and that all remuneration and employment related expenses are paid by the state registered association.
