

I refer to the prescribed information required under Regulation 61(1) and the statement required under Regulation 61(2) in relation to forthcoming Victorian Branch elections that was lodged with my letter of 10 February 2000.

It has been brought to my attention that the number of members in each electorate and the number of Delegates to the Branch Council to be elected from each electorate were inadvertently omitted from the prescribed information.

The relevant information (as at 31 December 1999) is as follows:

Please note that the situation whereby there are no members allocated to Electorate 11 arises due to that electorate being made up of persons whose eligibility for membership arose through the operation of a Section 202 Agreement that no longer applies to the Victorian Branch.

Proposed alterations to the SPSF Group Rules and the Victorian Branch Rules designed to confer voting and representation rights on that same group of persons are currently the subject of discussions between the Registry and this Branch. Should these rule alterations be certified, the number of persons in Electorate 11 would be 667 and the number of Delegates would be 2.

CPSU, SPSF GROUP, VICTORIAN BRANCH ELECTION REQUEST.

Please find attached the prescribed information required under Regulation 61(1) and the statement required under Regulation 61(2) in relation to elections required by the Victorian Branch under the rules of the CPSU, SPSF Group.

In lodging these documents I wish to draw your attention to two matters.

Firstly, in relation to the requirement of CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 54A that each election shall be conducted so that the result is declared not earlier than the 1st May and not later than the 30th June in each election year, the Victorian Branch Council has resolved that these elections be conducted so that the result is declared and that the persons elected take office with effect from 1 June 2000.

Secondly, you will note that that the prescribed information refers to two (2) Vice President positions whereas the Victorian Branch Rules currently provide for one (1) such position. On 16 December 1999, documentation was lodged in the Registry notifying alterations to the Branch Rules to provide for a second Vice President position. The conduct of an election for a second position will obviously be contingent on the certification of those alterations.

PRESCRIBED INFORMATION IN RESPECT OF ELECTION: REGULATION 61(1)

The following information is lodged in accordance with Regulation 61 of the Act in relation to elections required by the CPSU, SPSF Group, Victorian Branch.

 In accordance with CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 54A elections are required to be conducted for the Branch Officer positions as specified under Rule 7 of the Branch Rules, ie,

Branch President,

Branch Vice Presidents (2),

Branch Secretary,

Branch Assistant Secretary,

Executive Councillor (Country Representative)

- 2. In accordance with CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 54A elections are required to be conducted for the positions of Delegates to the Branch Council as specified under Rules 8 and 9 of the Branch Rules.
- 3. The reasons for these elections are that as follows:
 - (a) In the case of the Branch Officers, CPSU, SPSF Group Rule Rule 54A requires that each Branch shall elect its Branch Officers four yearly. The previous elections for these positions were conducted in 1996.
 - (b) In the case of the Delegates to the Branch Council, CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 54A, together with Victorian Branch Rule 8 requires that the Victorian Branch shall elect its Delegates to the Branch Council four yearly. The previous elections for these positions were conducted in 1996.

- 4. CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 54A specifies the procedures for conducting these elections. It provides that the returning officer shall fix the date on which nominations close, and that nominations shall be called for at least 14 days prior to the date on which nominations close. The rule further specifies that each election shall be conducted so that the result is declared not earlier than the 1st May and not later than the 30th June in each election year.
- 5. The voting system to be employed is a direct voting system, and CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 57C provides that the election shall be by secret ballot and shall be conducted by the proportional preferential voting system as set out in the Schedule to the Group rules.
