

DECISION

Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union - SPSF Group, Western Australian Prison Officers' Union Branch

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 18 May 2020 the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union - SPSF Group, Western Australian Prison Officers' Union Branch (**Branch**) lodged with the Registered Organisations Commission prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices:

Branch Councillor (Delegate to Branch Council) for the following electorates:

Bandyup Women's Prison	(2)
Broome Regional Prison	(1)
Eastern Goldfields Regional Prison	(2)
Greenough Regional Prison	(2)
Hakea Prison	(5)
Roebourne Regional Prison	(1)
West Kimberley Regional Prison	(2)

- [2] The Branch did not lodge the prescribed information before the prescribed day as required by regulation 138(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009*. I note that Chapter C of the CPSU rule book does not specify a prescribed day, however Rule 19.1(a)(iii) provides that the election 'should be conducted so that a result is declared not earlier than 1 May and not later than 30 June in the election year'. Consequently, the lodgement of the prescribed information with the Registered Organisations Commission on 18 May 2020 would not allow for the results to be declared in the timeframe contemplated by the rules.
- [3] By letter dated 24 March 2020, the Assistant Commissioner and National Program Manager, Industrial Elections and Ballots within the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) wrote to registered organisations to advise that, due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the AEC had determined that the conduct of all industrial elections not already commenced would cease for a period of three months from that date.
- [4] The Secretary of the Branch, Andrew James Smith, provided a statement addressing the late lodgement of the prescribed information. Mr Smith explained that he had become aware that 'other Branches' in the SPSF Group had received correspondence from the AEC stating that

elections being conducted by the AEC had been put on hold until after 30 June. In that context Mr Smith mistakenly believed this meant the Branch had more time to file its prescribed information. It is not apparent whether the Branch did not receive a copy of the correspondence dated 24 March 2020 referred to above directly from the AEC, or whether in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic any such letter simply did not come to Mr Smith's attention. However, I accept that Mr Smith genuinely misunderstood the Branch's obligations, and that the Branch moved swiftly to lodge prescribed information on 18 May 2020 once that misunderstanding was corrected.

- [5] I also accept and take into account the particular circumstances described by Mr Smith of the significant impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Branch's operations, which has understandably affected its priorities and disrupted its normal administrative arrangements during this period. I further note that the determination by the AEC to defer the conduct of industrial elections would necessarily in any event have delayed the conduct of this election until after 30 June, meaning that the election could not have been completed within the timeframe set out in Chapter C of the CPSU's rules.
- [6] The Branch has requested that the Commissioner (or his Delegate) exercise his power under s 189(2) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* to allow a later date for lodgement of the prescribed information be exercised, namely 18 May 2020.
- [7] I am satisfied that the reasons outlined in the statement and letter accompanying the lodgement provide sufficient grounds to justify approval for allowing a later date for the lodgement. The normal and reasonable expectation is that registered organisations will take steps to ensure they comply with the time-frame requirements set out not only in the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* but also in instruments or references pertaining to their own governance, such as their own rules. My decision is influenced by the unprecedented impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the fact that the AEC suspended the conduct of industrial elections during the relevant period.
- [8] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.

- I, Andrew James Smith being the Branch Secretary of the CPSU/SPSF Group WAPOU Branch make the following statement:
- 1. I am authorised to sign this statement containing prescribed information for CPSU/SPSF Group WAPOU Branch.
- 2. The following information is lodged under subsection 189(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act).
- 3. The elections that are required are set out in the table in Annexure A (attached).
- 4. No rule alterations are pending that will impact the election.
- 5. Election to the office of delegate to Branch Council are held every four years in accordance with Rule 23 Schedule B of Chapter C of the CPSU Rules (which is the Branch rules for the WAPOU Branch) and Rule 19.1(iii) of Chapter C of the CPSU Rules.
- 6. Under Rule 8.3 of Schedule B of Chapter C, Branch Council delegates elected by each Sub-Branch shall be elected every four years with Northern Region Sub-Branches elections and elections for Sub-Branches other than Northern Region Sub-Branches being held separately in alternative even years.
- 7. 2020 is a year in which Northern Region Sub-Branches elect Branch Council delegates in accordance with Rule 8.3
- 8. For the Delegate to Branch Council positions the electorate is all financial members of each Subbranch (rules 6.2(b), 8.1 and 8.3) below is a list of the Northern Sub Branches. This list identifies the total number of financial members as at the end of the quarter of the year preceding the calling of elections and therefore the number of delegates for each subbranch.

- a. Delegates to Branch Council elected by each Sub-Branch on the basis of one delegate for each hundred financial members or part thereof [Chapter C, Schedule B, Rule 6.2(b)]
- b. The information for calculating the formula is provided for in Chapter C, Schedule B, Rule 8.1 which provides that "for the purpose of determining the number of delegates to be elected in accordance with sub-rule 6.2(b)..., the number shall be determined in accordance with the number of financial members in each sub-Branch at the end of the quarter for the year preceding calling for nominations for election to the Branch Council."
- 9. Chapter C of the CPSU rules prescribes that nominations for these offices are required to be open for 14 days [Rule 19.1(a)] and "the elections should be conducted so that the result is declared not earlier than 1 May and not later than 30 June in an election year". [see Rule 19.1(a)(iii)]
- 10. This statement IS NOT lodged at least 2 months before nominations open for the election(s) in Annexure A. The reason it is lodged after the prescribed time is:
 - a. The Branch Secretary was mistaken in his belief that the COVID 19 lock down protocols of the AEC regarding the delay in the conduct of elections impacted on his obligation to lodge the Notice.
